

Spearheaded on the national and state level by the respective Home Mission Boards, the overall project is an attempt by Free Will Baptist to reach a Million people with the Gospel of Christ during this Millennium year. What a gigantic goal, what a great vision!!



How do you eat an elephant? A bite at a time! How do you break up a Million person project into manageable portions? You start with the denomination attempting to reach a Million. Then you ask the states to accept a portion of this task- the South Carolina Home Mission Board decided that the churches of South Carolina could reach 100,001 (Alabama said it could reach 100,000 and we KNOW we can reach more than

they can!). Next you reach that 100,000 by asking 100 churches to reach 1000 people. Then you reach those 1000 by asking 20 people in that church to attempt to reach 50- - and, what do you know, you've eaten an elephant; and reached a tremendous amount of people with the gospel of Christ.

[This is part 2 of a series on the history of Free Will Baptist in South Carolina. They have been researched and written by Historical Commission Chairman, Joe McKnight]

Redding Moore (one of the most important figures in early FWB History) was born in 1780, in what is now Greene County, NC. He lived in an area that, at various time, moved between Greene, Pitt and Dobbs Counties. Thus it is very difficult to find records about his early days. There is a possibility that he was a descendant of William Moore, who at the age of sixteen, made the journey across the Atlantic Ocean aboard the "Primrose" in 1635. William traveled with a Rev. George White, who

was noted as "a man of God." This link between William and Redding has not been conclusively proven yet, but there is strong evidence to suggest it. If so, then it is quite possible that Rev. George White may have been a General Baptist minister, and that Redding Moore's Arminian persuasion came through that source. There is no record that identifies Redding's parents, or the identity of any siblings. Even the correct spelling of his name is questionable at times. Other versions of the name include Redden, Reden and Reading. Redding is the preferred spelling, however. This is used in his will, and in a written statement by a grandson.

While information about Redding prior to his arrival in South Carolina in 1816 is sketchy, it is apparent that he was trained to work in a surveying crew as a chain carrier. He was a member of the Grimsleys Free Will Baptist Church in Greene County. There is some evidence that he may have fought against Great Britain in the War of 1812. It is very likely that, at some point during his childhood or early adult years, he was acquainted with the family of Augustine Wilson, a hero of the Revolutionary War. A future article will detail the relationships between the Moores and Wilsons, especially Rev. John Wilson. [The next article will address the arrival of Redding Moore in South Carolina, and the beginning of his missionary efforts]
