GOVERNOR PRESENTS MISSIONARY CARLISLE HANNA WITH ORDER OF THE PALMETTO

Governor Jim Hodges bestowed South Carolina's highest civilian honor, the Order of the Palmetto, upon veteran Missionary Carlisle Hanna on Thursday, November 16, 2000. At



a service attended by Brother Carlisle's family and over 60 pastors and friends from across the state, Brother Carlisle was honored for years of service and dedication to the work of God in India.

Brother Carlisle was nominated for this award by Pastor Buddy Seay

(White Savannah FWB Church), Brother Robert Rabon (The Prayer Center, Conway), Senator John Land of Manning, Representative Liston Barfield of Conway, our state Moderator, Rev Sherwood Lee, and many denominational leaders. The Order of the Palmetto was initiated by Governor John West in 1971and



quickly became recognized as the highest honor award given by the state.

In presenting this award Governor Hodges said, "Rev. Hanna has been an humble servant of his faith, his God, and his fellow man, and, as such, has been a great ambassador for South Carolina. He is truly deserving of our state's highest honor".

REACHING YOUR COMMUNITY FOR CHRIST.

One of the most important missions of Free Will Baptist Churches is reaching the Lost for Christ. Pastors and churches are always looking for help in this area so I thought I would highlight several successful plans that several of our churches are using to reach their community for Christ:



*** PIE (People Involved In Evangelism)- Pastor Leroy Lowery and Southside FWB Church in Darlington use this plan. Once per month people meet at the church for a time of food and fellowship (Some volunteer to cook and clean). Following the time of food and a time of prayer teams are given a Pie (some volunteer to cook these each month) and go to their assigned home (The pastor has already called and made an appointment with the people). Other volunteers remain at the church as baby sitters so every family has the opportunity to take part in this ministry.

This plan is well received by the church and by the people who get the pies! It has brought new families into the Church, uses a wide variety of volunteers, and has prompted this church into recently building a brand new sanctuary!

* **GROW (God Rewards Our Work)- GROW is based on dividing your church into 4 different teams- the "G" Team, the "R" Team, the "O" Team, and the "W" Team. The "G" team visits on the first Tuesday of each month. The "R" team always has the second Tuesday in each month— and so forth. If a month has 5 Tuesdays then everyone meets together on that Tuesday to make a big push to "catch up" on any missed contacts and to make a big push to reach the community.

Peace FWB Church, Florence (Pastor Donnie Miles) has used this program very successfully. **Assistant pastor Ron Moore** coordinates the ministry but assignment are given by a Team Captain for each group. When "Grow" members arrive on their night they are directed to either visit, write letters, or make phone contacts according to the information provided to the captains by Brother Ron. The program is flexible and adaptable to a church's situation.



Begun on the first Tuesday in January of this year, this program has enabled Peace FWB Church to make thousands of contacts and has had a positive impact on the growth of the church (As evidenced by their new 1.6 million dollar sanctuary). Many comments from visitors have been received about how much they appreciate the friendliness, excitement, and concern of the people because of these contacts.

Carlisle Hanna- Order of the Palmetto (continued)

(Much of the following information was used in nominating Brother Carlisle Hanna for the Order of the Palmetto).

Rev Carlisle Hanna is 71 years old. He was appointed as a missionary to India in October of 1951. His wife, Marie, served faithfully by his side until her home going in April of 1998. His children, Brenda Kay, Donald, and Mark were also very active in his ministry as they grew up on the Mission field.

Brother Carlisle began his missionary work in Sonapurhat, North India, going from village to village holding Bible studies and worship services. He also conducted Bible Training schools and special retreats. A special emphasis of Brother Carlisle has always been the hostel (children's home) ministry. From this ministry has come pastors, teachers, and civil servants in India.

Since 1972 the Hannas have been the only Free Will Baptist missionaries remaining in India. That meant they had to oversee all of the work in North and South India.

In 1977 Brother Carlisle was given the responsibility of overseeing a World Relief Commission project to put down 20 tube wells, construct 4000 feet of irrigations channels and purchase 10 mobile pump sets for irrigation in West Bengal. This project was designed to irrigate approximately 100 acres of land so the people could cultivate two or three crops instead of one uncertain crop.

Brother Carlisle also introduced the growing of wheat and cattle breeding to provide milk for nourishment and meet the hunger needs of the people of India.

During his terms of service in India, Brother Carlisle has endured natural disasters, physical sickness, Satanic attacks, and numerous threats to his life and work. Through them all he has remained true to God, his work, and Free Will Baptist.

Because of that, even as high an honor as the "Order of the Palmetto" will fade into insignificance one day when finally he faces the Lord and hears, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant. Enter into the joys of your Lord." But, until that day, we are thankful for the recognition given to this man of God for his faithful service.



HISTORICAL GLIMPSES

By Historical Commission Chairman, Rev Joe McKnight

(The Continuing story of South Carolina Free Will Baptist pioneer, Redding Moore as he helped establish the first Free Will Baptist Churches in South Carolina)

Our knowledge about the family life of Redding Moore provides both answers and questions. The records indicate that he had seven children, born between the years of 1803 and 1842. Given that Redding was born in 1780, he would have been in his early 60's when the youngest child was born. Documented knowledge about the children varies from fairly extensive to very little. We will focus on the Moore children in another article. First, the questions surrounding Redding's wife or wives should be addressed. The only documented facts come from three records.

A deed transacted in Darlington County on February 18, 1828 recorded the transfer of 330 acres of land and a "plantation" from Redding Moore to Stephen Reavell. This deed is a very important record because the land in question closely aligns to the location of Bethany Free Will Baptist Church, near Timmonsville. This gives a strong indication that Redding was involved in the founding of Bethany, which was known as Pine Log Church until 1884. We'll save that for a later article.

At the end of that deed, however, there was a "renunciation of dower interest" signed by one Ann Moore.

This Ann Moore would then be the mother of the first-born, Samuel Moore. Redding and Ann would have been married prior to 1803, the birth year of Samuel. Samuel's census records indicate his birth was in North Carolina, presumably Green County. Thus, it is safe to say that Redding and Ann met and married in North Carolina around the turn of the 19th century. It can further be stated that Ann was living in 1828, since two witnesses verified that she signed the deed to Stephen Reavell. During the period from 1803 to 1825 four children were born. They were Samuel, Calvin, William James and Elizabeth.

However, the 1830 Census raises a question about how long Ann lived after signing the deed. That Census record indicates that one adult female, between the ages of 20 and 30, lived in the Moore household. This clearly could not be Ann, since she could not have been that young. The 1840 Census again indicates one adult female, between the ages of 30 and 40. This would have been the same person, but could not have been Ann. So, the evidence seems to indicate that Redding Moore's first wife was Ann, who would have been born sometime during the 1780's in North Carolina, and who apparently died between 1828 and 1830 in Marion County, South Carolina. The meaning of the Free Will Baptist Emblem

(As explained on the National Association of Free Will Baptist web site- www.nafwb.org)

The SHIP symbolizes the Church and represents all the members pulling in one direction, guided and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Seeking to fulfill Christ's last command to the Church, Free Will Baptists unite in one purpose with one priority to proclaim the good news of the gospel throughout the world.

The FISH, represented in the symbol by the space between the bottom of the sail and the top of the ship's body, is one of the most popular symbols for Jesus Christ. Many believe that it was a secret symbol which identified Christians during periods of persecution. The word "fish" in the first century Greek (ichthus) is an acrostic for Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior.

The ANCHOR on the bow of the ship symbolizes the Christian hope of salvation, "the sure, strong and steadfast anchor of the soul."

The CROSS The mast of the ship in the emblem forms the most familiar symbol in the history of the world, the CROSS - an instrument of execution and death turned into a worldwide emblem of hope and love by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The BIBLE has always been at the heart of our life as Free Will Baptists, the centrality of the scriptures. Free Will Baptists adopt the Word of God as our only rule of faith and practice. We believe the scriptures to be inspired, inerrant, infallible and immutable.

The LOAF and CUP represent the Lord's supper, one of the gospel ordinances. This ordinance commemorates the death of Christ for our sins in the use of the bread which He made the emblem of His broken body and the cup the emblem of His shed blood. Participation in this ordinance expresses love for Christ, faith and hope in Him, and serves as a pledge of perpetual fidelity and faithfulness to Him.

The BASIN and TOWEL historically symbolize the service and outreach of the church, but for us it has an added significance of representing our practice of washing the saints' feet.

The CLASPED HANDS symbolize many things to us: fellowship, brotherhood and the warmth of our faith. Perhaps the most important thing symbolized by the clasped hands is our commitment to reach out to people around the world with the good news.
