**TAX TIPS-** Here are some Tax Tips that may help the Church or minister right now (Taken from "The Income Tax Guide for Ministers"- - on sale now at the Free Will Baptist Book Store for \$14.40).

- Churches must issue W-2 forms for their Pastor. Failure to do so can result in a \$50 penalty for the Church- and, as reported in another publication, the Pastor's chances of being audited increase 500% if a 1099 is issued instead of a W-2.
- Pastors should designate their pay according to IRS guidelines at the first Church Conference of the year in order to obtain tax benefits for that year. Failure to do so results in having to pay taxes on your complete salary.

- An adequate system of accounting is required in order for designated money to be exempt from taxes. A finance committee should be appointed by the church and the minister should produce adequate records to justify the amount of reimbursable expenses he is claiming.



**Information Note-** When you give money thru the Promotional Office to Ministry or Missions your name or the name of your church is assigned to that money all the way to the final destination of that money. The reason you do not get an acknowledgment of your money from anyone other than the Promotional Office is because that would give you a double or triple tax receipt if everyone acknowledged it. Rest assured, however, that the Missionaries or the Ministry know every individual or church who has contributed to their account.

## HISTORICAL GLIMPSES

(The Continuing story of South Carolina Free Will Baptists pioneer, Redding Moore as he helped establish the first Free Will Baptists Churches in South Carolina)

Available records indicate that Ann Moore, first wife of Redding Moore, must have died sometime between 1828 - 1830. The 1830 Census reveals that the Moore household contained one female between twenty and thirty years of age. That could not have been Ann, since Samuel, her oldest child, had been born approximately 1803. The next documented reference to Redding Moore's wife by name is in his Last Will and Testament. This was dated on June 15, 1849. The executors were Nancy Moore, W. J. Moore and C. J. Crawford. However, she would not complete the duties of executrix of that will. An addendum to the document states *I, Nancy Moore, late widow of Redding Moore, now Nancy Johnson, having by my marriage with Harper Johnson forfeited my claim to the estate under the will of Redding Moore and whereas I was heretofore one of the exors of said will, and acted after qualifying as such; now therefore I hereby relinquish my action as executrix under same will this 11 Nov 1852."*

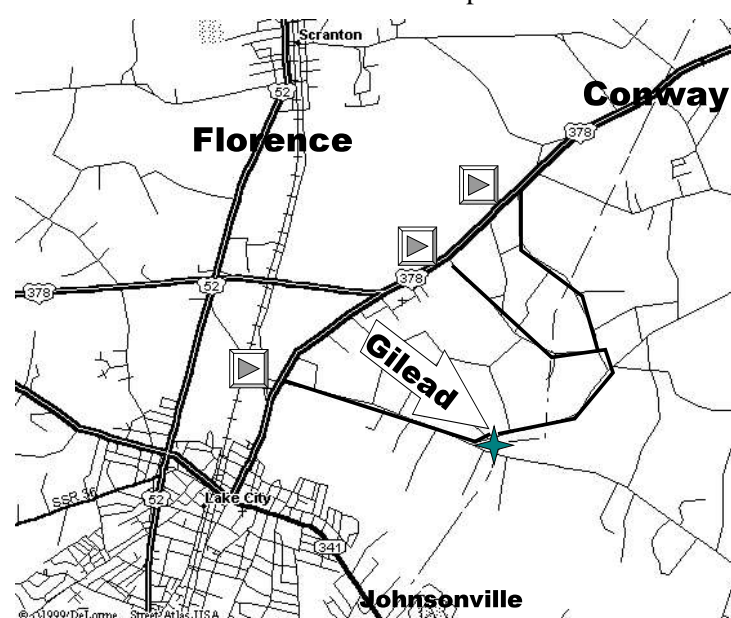
The mysteries surrounding the Moores grow deeper with the introduction of the Harper Johnson family. Harper Johnson was apparently an older man, probably close in age to Redding Moore. He lived in Clarendon County. Members of the Johnson family have a tradition that their ancestors arrived in South Carolina from Texas, not North Carolina. Yet, the fact that connections existed between the two families is certain. The land on which the Old Mother Church, considered to be the first Free Will Baptist Church founded in South Carolina, was built was land given by the Johnson family. Harper Johnson had a male relative, most likely a son, named Blany Johnson. Redding and Nancy would name their first son Blany Johnson Moore. There was also an older daughter named Nancy F., and a son named Joseph Jolly. These children would join four older brothers and sisters who were the children of Redding and Ann. The unresolved questions include how, when, and why the Johnsons and Moores became connected.

- 2) Coming from Florence on Hwy 52. Take the 378 Bypass East toward Myrtle Beach. When the Bypass joins back up with 378 (4 lanes will become 2 lanes) turn right on first paved road (First Oxtown Road). At Stop sign turn right onto Casselman Road, go 100 yards to stop sign, turn right. Church 2 miles on left.
- 3) Coming from Lake City on 378 East. Turn right on McCutcheon Road (Just past "Marshall's Marine"). When road forks at Methodist Church, take Left fork. Church 1 mile on Right.
