

BOOK STORE CHANGES

Another Victim of the September 11th attacks has turned out to be the Free Will Baptist Christian Book and Supply Store. Walk-in business following the attack has been almost non-existent. Since we were already operating on a day to day basis reality finally had to be faced and changes had to be made.

Those things that take us by surprise did not, of course, surprise God. He had a plan and it was already at work when these circumstances occurred. Here are the main changes:

Mrs Ada Miles departs: Mrs. Ada has been a valuable asset to the FWB Christian Book and Supply Store. Her pleasing personality and adaptable work schedule has helped more than words can say. It would have been extremely hard to release her had it not been for the fact that she had just secured another part time job at the Family Christian Bookstore here in town before these events occurred. Releasing her will save approximately \$10,000 per year.

BOOK STORE HOURS CHANGE: Beginning the first of January, 2002 the FWB Christian Book and Supply Store will open from Noon until Five, Monday - Thursday. Several months ago, Book Store Manager, Eddie Hobbs began working nights at McLeods Hospital. He would work from 8:30am until 5pm at the Book Store and then work at McLeods until 11pm at Night- a very grueling schedule. The new schedule will allow him to get some much needed rest and spend some time with his family, as well as make some needed changes in his salary; from \$24,000 per year to \$18,000.

In Addition to the \$16,000 in savings from these two changes we have instituted other changes that will save us between \$2000 and \$5000 per year. This will allow us to operate in the black and also to make a real dent in the \$15,000 store remodeling loan that still hangs over our head.

Phone orders and Internet orders will be promoted and Church Supplies will be given much greater priority but the good news is that Sunday School Literature and VBS Literature sales normally make enough so that we can pay Brother Eddie's salary and the Book Store utilities even if we do not sell a single book!



2002 FOREIGN Mission Plan of Support. Several years ago South Carolina Free Will Baptists instituted the Plan of Support for Foreign Missions. One of the objectives was to promote consistent giving to ALL of the Foreign Missionaries associated with South Carolina. Below is a table showing how NON DESIGNATED MONEY will be divided among the Missionaries in 2002.

The Plan is fairly simple to understand. Take the annual budget of the missionary, divide by the percentage of support pledged by South Carolina. Add all these Goal Amounts together and you get our Target Budget. Divide the Goal Amount for each missionary into the Target Amount and you get the percentage that each missionary will receive of each NON DESIGNATED dollar that is received for the Plan. (Example: The Aycock budget is \$103,415.74. The Plan is for SCFWB to pay 25% of that budget or \$25,853.94. Divide \$25,853.94 into the Total Target Budget of \$358,382.11 and you get 7.2% which means the Aycocks will receive 7.2 cents of each non designated dollar given to the plan).


Sanctuary to be built in front of this Building.

HISTORY OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS IN SOUTH CAROLINA

The Augustine Wilson Saga: (Continued from last Edition) Augustin Wilson lived in Sumter District until 1815, when he signed a release for 250 acres of land on Douglas Swamp to William Wilson. For some reason, the release was not recorded until 1819. He then moved to Georgia. In the state of Georgia, six lotteries were held

granting land to residents. These were in addition to "headright" and "bounty land" grants. Records show him being listed on two Lottery land grants. In 1827, he is shown as living in Washington County, and was granted Lot 220 in the 22nd District of Lee County on October 11, 1827. In the 1832 Land Lottery, he was granted Lot 277 in the 12th District of Cherokee County. While living in Georgia, he made an application for a pension.

By 1839, he had moved back to Darlington County, South Carolina. In the pension application he stated the reason for his move was because all his children lived in Darlington County. Augustin lived on a plantation there, near what was then the village of Rollinsville. He died about December 29, 1847, and was buried in the Lake Swamp Baptist Church cemetery near Timmonsville. A Revolutionary War cannon was inserted in the ground at the head of the grave, and remains there today.

While there is no record of Augustin Wilson being a minister, there is a family tradition that his honorable war record afforded him many opportunities to speak in area churches. While there is no conclusive proof that he was a Free Will Baptist, it seems very likely when fully considering the facts. The land where Augustin originally settled, in 1805, was close to both the Piney Grove Church and the Old Mother Church. His son John, who would become a Free Will Baptist minister, was deeply involved with the Piney Grove Church, and would later organize and pastor the Crossroads Church in Darlington County.

Church Vans and South Carolina's Law

There has been some confusion and misinformation that has circulate concerning the use of vans for the transportation of children by churches. The law in question is A301, R338, H3300, which was ratified and approved in May 2000 and became effective July 1, 2000. Please understand that what I am about to share with you is not a **legal** opinion because I am not a lawyer. It is, however, an informed opinion based on research and direct communication with the South Carolina Attorney General's office. First, let me simply quote the law.

Section 56-5-195. (A) Effective July 1, 2000, any entity transporting preprimary primary or secondary school students to or from school, school-related activities, or child care. . . must transport these students in a vehicle meeting federal school bus safety standards, as contained in 49 U£C. Section 30101... (B) Notwithstanding subsection (A) of this section, any vehicle that is purchased before July 1, 2000, and is utilized to transport preprimary, primary or secondary school students to or from school, school-related activities, or child care is not subject to the requirements contained in subsection (A) of this section until July 1, 2006."

In discussion of this law with a representative of the Attorney General's office, the following opinion was formulated:

- 1. The law applies to the transportation of students in schools and childcare facilities, public or private, and, thereby, applies to churches only if they operate such facilities.
- 2. There is a "grandfather clause" that exempts any non-conforming vehicle (i.e., a van) purchased before July 1, 2000. Those vehicles may remain in service until July 1, 2006. This provision gives churches that operate Christian Schools and childcare facilities a six-year window to gradually retrofit or replace nonconforming vehicles.
- 3. Churches that use their vehicles to transport children to and from church sponsored activities (Sunday School and teen outings, for example) are not in any way encumbered by this law.

In short, unless your church operates a day care and/or a school, the law should not in any way affect your activities. If you have further questions, I recommend you do what I did and call the Attorney General's office.


appreciation for the work this couple has done to help the church progress for the Lord.
