A People Person who never met a stranger, a friend to preachers, a soul winning church builder, a devoted family man. All of these and more describe the life and ministry of **Rev. Bill Jacobs.** Thousands of well wishers came to the Church on the Monday night after his death to offer condolences to his wife and family (They began at 6:30pm and it was after 11:30pm before the final person came through the line- with many others leaving without

going through because of the length of the line).

The day of his funeral found the church, the

fellowship building, the choir, and all available spaces crammed with friends and family to take part in the service honoring the life and ministry of "Preacher Bill". This service turned into a celebration of God's goodness and grace as preacher after preacher described the character and Godly conduct of this soldier of the cross.

This church, the community, and our state have all lost a very valuable asset but we know that God always has a plan so we rest confident in God's care and provision in the future.

Dr. Roy L. Thomas, former General Director of the Home Missions Department of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, went home to be with the Lord Sunday night, March 23, 2003, at his home in Greeley, Colorado. His battle against pancreatic cancer was bravely fought, and victory was his when he left this life and stepped into a hero's welcome in Heaven - the place he had preached about for fifty years.

Dr. Thomas was born in Greeley, Colorado, and grew up on a farm near Buhl, Idaho. He accepted Christ as his Savior in 1951 at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Buhl, Idaho. He was ordained as a Free Will Baptist minister in 1954, the same year he was married to his wife, Pat. He organized the First Free Will Baptist Church of Artesia, New Mexico that same year.

After serving the Artesia congregation for two years, he moved to Nashville, Tennessee to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College. He graduated with honors from that institution in 1960 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. While a student he pastored two different churches in Tennessee---Shady Grove Free Will Baptist Church and First Free Will Baptist Church, Springfield, Tennessee.

Dr. Thomas was sent to Denver, Colorado as a home missionary by the National Home Missions Board in 1961 where he established the First Free Will Baptist Church of that city. The church became self supporting in two years, after which he served for two terms on the National Home Missions Board. He furthered his education by earning a Masters of Divinity Degree from Luther Rice Seminary in 1978, and was granted a Doctor of Divinity Degree from Bethany Seminary in 1989.

In December 1970 he was appointed as Associate Director of the National Home Missions Department, Nashville, Tennessee, and became General Director in 1978. He served in that position until his retirement in December 1995, making a total of 25 years on the National Home Missions staff, and a total of 35 years' affiliation with the Department.

While he served as General Director of the Home Missions Department, there were over 200 churches established throughout the North American continent and the U.S. owned islands of Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Under his leadership, the Home Missions Department sponsored thousands of Evangelism and Church Growth Conferences, and the Old Time Camp Meeting at the National Convention. He also started the Church Extension Loan Fund, the Helping Hands Church Building Team, the Associate Missionary Program, the Aquila and Priscilla Program, the Tentmaker Program, and developed many Evangelism and Church Growth publications. He also authored the books, Planting and Growing a Fundamental Church and published The Journal of Benjamin Randall, and many other historical Free Will Baptist and church growth books and materials.

Dr. Thomas is the father of two children---a son, Mark, a former home missionary who pastors Highland Hills Free Will Baptist Church, Greeley, Colorado and a daughter, Patsy who is the wife of Howard Gwartney, former home missionary who pastors East Valley Free Will Baptist Church, Mesa, Arizona.



April 13th was not only Home Coming at Walker's Chapel FWB Church, Sumter; it is also the day that the congregation honored the memory of **Rev. Mancy Noles** for his work of founding and pastoring this church by placing a plaque on the sanctuary in his memory.

A good day of fellowship, food, singing, and preaching all showed that brother Mancy's work continues to go forward even after his promotion to Glory.
