STATE ASSOCIATIONAL MEETING PRODUCES SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

Good Preaching, good singing, good fellowship, good food, and a good spirit of cooperation. All of these describe the 61st annual session of the State Association of Original Free Will Baptists, Inc.. In fact, everything went so well until all of the Constitutional changes were presented and passed, all of the state reports were given, and several of the National Reports were all given by dismissal time on Thursday- Glory! God is doing a great work among South Carolina Free Will Baptists and it is wonderful to be part of a denomination on the move for God.

A special word of THANKS to the South Carolina Conference; and especially to Peace FWB Church, for providing the Noon Meals each day as well as refreshments after the Thursday Night Service. Pastor Donnie Miles and his staff are to be commended for their work. Next year's meeting (Feb 26-27, 2004) is scheduled to be with the Beaver Creek Conference and we are already anticipating God's Blessings.

Here are some **HIGHLIGHTS** of this year's State Meeting:

>Members of the State seemed happy with the work of the present leadership as they reelected most officers to succeed themselves (They are listed on Page 2).

>Annual Church Dues to the State Association beginning in 2004 were increased to **\$165 per church** due to the \$50 per church increase mandated by the National Association. Local Conferences will need to address this at their next meeting so they will have the funds available by the next State Meeting.

>State Field Directors will now serve a Five Year term instead of Two year terms and will be allowed to serve successive terms. Partial terms will no longer count toward the term limit of a person serving on the various boards.

>An Extra Member at Large was added to the Executive Committee. Now the Executive Committee will have a Member at Large representative from the Upper Part of the State and one from the Lower part of the State.

>CTS is now called the State Youth Conference (to conform to the name used by the National Association). They will now elect and install their officers at their annual convention without having to wait for approval of their choices some 9 months later at the State Associational Meeting. The State Youth Conference Director will still give a report to the Annual State Meeting to keep everyone informed of the activities and successes of the State Youth Conference.

>The temporary Historical Commission was dissolved and replaced by a State Historian. Rev. Joe McKnight will serve the first five year term in this position.

>Each Conference is now asked to nominate a delegate to the annual National Associational Meeting to serve as the Delegates from the South Carolina State Association of Originak Free Will Baptists, Inc.. The name of this delegate needs to be sent to State Clerk, Rev. Todd Smith, no later than June 1st of each year.

>The General Board Member to the National Association will now be the State Executive Secretary.

>The Constitution and By-laws will now be printed annually as part of the printing of the state minutes.

>The Poston-Baggett Student Loan Fund board was dissolved and the fund was transfered to the Free Will Baptist Bible College. The FWBBC will administer the fund with the State Treasurer acting as Liaison between the State Association and the Bible College. The State Treasurer will report on this fund annually at the State Associational Meeting. Guidelines for the use of this fund will be published later and churches will be encouraged to actively participate in contributing to this fund in order to help students from South Carolina obtain a quality Christian Education.

>The Postition of Master's Men Field Director was eliminated.

>The Terms of all members of the State Home Mission Board were extended until 2004 when they will begin a rotation schedule alphabetically according to Conference.

>In order to maintain an odd number on the Children's Home Board a member at large was added. Rev Eddie Hinson was elected to serve in this position.

Missionary Mirial Gainer had eye surgery on March 4th. She is recovering well.

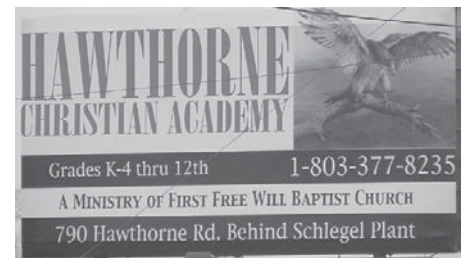

Bible College Offers Student Aid

If a young person you know is considering attending Free Will Baptist Bible College, here are two awards they should know about.

The Legacy Award

The Legacy Award at Free Will Baptist Bible College is available for children of Free Will Baptist pastors. This \$2,500-award is paid at \$1,250 per semester. Students who meet the following criteria may apply:

1. Child of primary pastor of a Free Will Baptist church in the U.S.
2. Lives at home and receives at least 50% of their support from parent(s).
3. Under 24 years of age
4. Will live in one of FWBBC's dormitories.
5. Will enroll for 12 hours or more per semester.

The deadline to receive applications is August 1 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester. To request an application, contact the Financial Aid Office at 1-615-844-5250 or jcaudill@fwbbc.edu.

The Crowell Missions Scholarship

The Crowell Foundation Missions Scholarship is now available for freshman missions students at Free Will Baptist Bible College. This is a \$5,200 scholarship payable at \$650 per semester.

Qualified students must meet the following criteria:

1. Have at least a 3.5 high school GPA.
2. Have a minimum 25 on the ACT.
3. Must be a declared missions major or minor and remain so throughout the duration of the scholarship.
4. Maintain a 3.0 GPA while enrolled at FWBBC.

To apply:

1. Apply for federal aid using the FAFSA.
2. Have your pastor send in a letter of recommendation based on character and leadership skills.
3. Submit a short essay of less than 50 words entitled, "Why I want to be a missionary."
