For instance, a \$15,000 fund I oversee was getting 1% interest until I transferred it to the Foundation. It earned 4% last year and will earn 4.25% this year. And that helps this small ministry do more for the Lord.- Call toll free 1-877-336-7575 for more info.

#### LOOKING AHEAD as we LOOK BACK

History never looks like history when you are living through it. It always looks confusing and messy, and it always feels uncomfortable. ~John W. Gardner

Things would be so much simpler had the early Free Will Baptists in South Carolina realized how much the later generations would need to know. They could have left volumes of information and documentation that could be easily accessed. It certainly would have made the historian's job easier. But, as the quotation by John Gardner tells us, they didn't have the luxury of seeing the circumstances of their lives as historical



subject matter. They were too busy trying to provide the basic requirements for their families, and trying to build a church centered upon the truth of God, as they understood it. So, it becomes our duty to diligently examine the fragmentary evidence that is available if we are to truly understand our heritage.

During the year of 2003, we have learned much about the people, events, and forces that formed the Free Will Baptist faith in South Carolina. This knowledge is essential if we are to truly have a sense of identity. However, the greatest lesson we've learned is that there is so much more we don't know. So, we will use this upcoming year as a time to dig deeper into the historical record.

We will continue to focus on the pastors and ministers whose labors and sacrifices built the framework of our conferences/ associations and the current State Association. We'll also begin to examine the early churches, many of which are still in existence today. At some point in 2004, we'll focus on the theological and doctrinal issues that built, shaped, and threatened our denomination in those early years. But, in the midst of all that, we cannot overlook the humanity of our ancestors. So there will be time for the human-interest stories. One such story will focus on the Civil War-era account of the Free Will Baptist woman whose desperate search for her missing soldier-husband took her on a rugged thousand-mile journey.




