Christian Education Deserves Our Support

To understand why it is necessary to have and support Free Will Baptist Christian Schools, it is important to understand the time we are living in today. I would be the first to agree that maybe 60 years ago the need would not have been so great for a christian school. I would even say that maybe 50 years ago the demand may not have been so high. But all of that began to change on June 17,1963 when the Supreme Court of the United States kicked reverential Bible reading and prayer recitation out of the nation's public schools. Since that horrific day the Lord, the Creator and Savior of Life, was made an outcast in public schools, it has been on a decline.

This fund raising effort was led by the Ladies Auxiliary of Southside FWB Church and included a Church wide yard sale, production of a Fund Raising Cook Book, and numerous other special projects.

Pastor Leroy Lowery said that it was astonishing to see how God had provided the money for this project and he was excited to see the vision that Southside has for a lost world. In addition to normal Church activities and their work for world evangelism, Southside is also home to a day care center and the Pee Dee Bible Institute.



Low Country FWB Church of North Charleston celebrated "Follow the Yellow Brick Road to India on Sunday, August 15th. This event, sponsored by the church Women Active for Christ, was used to raise money to help the account of Missionary Carlisle Hanna. A road was constructed on one wall of the sanctuary and all members brought yellow bricks for \$1.00 each, as well as brown curbs and gutters for \$5.00 each. Pictures of India Pastors and



Missionary Carlisle Hanna were placed at the end of the road. WAC members raised \$2,000 and the church matched that for a total of \$4,000 (Glory).

On Sunday, August 15th, Brother Carlisle brought a great message showing much eagerness and love for the people in India. The WAC members presented him a check for the \$2,000 they had raised and Pastor Phillip Jones presented him a plaque from the church for his 52 years of service in India. The entire church was decorated in yellow and everyone enjoyed a luncheon after the service.

Missionary to India, Rev. Carlisle Hanna, underwent a second surgery on his broken wrist in mid-October. He is recovering well and hopes to return to India as soon as possible.

As of October 1, 2005 Brother Carlisle's account was \$60,000 in the red, in spite of the fact that South Carolina Free Will Baptist have given nearly \$10,000 more this year than they did by this date last year. Numerous individuals and churches are helping to ease this deficit by giving an extra \$75.00 in honor of Brother Carlisle's recent 75th Birthday.

A program entitled **'Friends of India'** has been instituted to help erase this deficit and keep the work in India going strong. Individuals are asked to trust God for an extra \$50 per month (above their normal tithes) for 5 years. If only 1 person in each Free Will Baptist Church in South Carolina would take this step of Faith then more than enough to cover the deficit would come in each year (125 churches X \$50 per month = \$75,000 per year).

The SCFWB Executive Secretary and the Assistant Director have been members of this program since August and it has been marvelous to see how

God has provided the extra \$50.00 each month for this need. God is doing a great work in India through Free Will Baptist as souls are being saved, churches are being built, and lives are being changed. Won't you join with God to help reach souls in India for which Jesus died?



Several People have asked about the needs among Florida FWB since the horrible Hurricane season. Florida State Executive Secretary, Rev. Randy Bryant, sent the following information

The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists has established a **Disaster Relief Fund** to assist our churches and church families in their hurricane relief efforts. As you know 4 hurricanes hit the state of Florida in the space of about 6 weeks. Virtually every section of the state was hit by one or more of these storms. Some of our churches (especially in the Central part) were hit by 3 of the 4 and others were hit full force by 2 of the storms. Each storm produced more damage than the previous storm in some of those churches.

At the present time we can not provide information as to the amount of damage in dollars. (Imagine what most people in Florida are going through trying to get insurance adjusters, building supplies, and contractors after these 4 storms and you'll understand why dollar amounts are not available.) However, I can tell you that we have several churches that have received significant damage due to the winds and the rains. Several of these churches can no longer meet in their buildings due to water damage and the mold that developed afterwards. We also have quite a few families that have been displaced due to the storms.

Feet Washing Pamphlet Available- The Free Will Baptist Historical Commission introduced the first in a series of historical pamphlets this summer at the national convention in Kansas City. The 4,000-word document titled "The Washing of the Saints' Feet" was written by William F. Davidson and Robert Picirilli.

Historical Commission chairman Darrell Holley said the occasional pamphlet series is titled The Free Will Baptist Heritage Series: Foundations of Faith and Practice.

The feet washing pamphlet gives readers a deeper understanding of the historical practice, including the biblical basis, historical grounding, objections to feet washing and feet washing in the 21st century.

Dr. Holley said, "Every Christian denomination has distinctive beliefs and practices that give it identity and define its heritage. For Free Will Baptists, this heritage includes washing the saints' feet."

Copies of the feet washing pamphlet may be purchased from your South Carolina FWB Christ Book Store. The pamphlets sell for 25 cents each.

After the meeting we were able to visit several of the FWB Churches before our flight back to Tokyo (We have 6 FWB Churches on Hokkaido and one church and a mission meeting place in Tokyo).

The need is great- I stood on a tower in Tokyo and saw where 27 million people live! And the Gospel is for everyone.


