- Preach the Gospel clearly. Have altar workers standing by to pray with people who respond.





Go 2/10th of a mile and turn left onto Blue Brick Road. Go 1.3 miles to Hwy 301 and turn left. Church of God Camp is 3/10th of a mile on the right. Their goal of \$3,000 was surpassed by the third Sunday of the project. On April 10th they presented the SCFWB Executive Secretary a check for nearly \$3,700 for Brother Carlisle's account-Glory!


SCFWB CHILDREN'S HOME NEWS:

Did you know?

- That the Monthly budget need for the Children's Home is slightly over \$44,000 (As approved at the 2005 SCFWB State Meeting- \$529,000.00 divided by 12).
- That in 2004 slightly over \$109,000.00 was given to the Children's Home through the SCFWB State Office (around \$9,000.00 per month).
- That over \$69,000.00 has been received during the first 5 months of 2005 for the Children's Home through the State Office (\$13,800.00 per month- Glory!).
- That \$10,000 plus the interest has been paid on the bus loan debt so far this year.
- That Brother Roy Roach (the Children's Home Director) has been able to Renegotiate the Food Supplier's bill to make some serious cuts to this continual expense (think about feeding 17 kids plus 10 adults each day. Can you say 30 dozen eggs each month?).



- That Rev. Shiloh Hackett led the youth of Fairview FWB Church to raise over \$6,300 for the Children's Home (Instead of doing their normal Spring Activities these youth used all the money that would normally have gone to those activities to help the Children's Home-Glory!). They would like to issue a challenge to all youth groups in the state to consider this need for this year's project.
- That <u>Pastor Jason Miles</u> heard about a pressing need at the Children's Home so he asked Lynches River FWB Church to reach into their general





How can you make sure you get the correct amount of Sunday School Literature?:


- Brother Rickey Evans, Manager of the FWB Christian Book Store, sends a Confirmation Sheet to your church contact person the first week in the second month of each quarter (June-August quarter will go out the first week in July). This is simply a copy of your previous quarter's Sunday School order. If everything remains the same then you do nothing and the same quantities will be shipped again (Sometime around the first week in August).

If you wish to make changes then get them to Brother Rickey before the Confirmation date so we will order (and ship to you!) the correct amount of materials.

Antioch, Tenn.—The Board of International Missions of Free Will Baptists met April 11-12, 2005, in Antioch, Tenn.

Following interviews and recommendations by the candidate committee, the Board approved five for overseas service. Chuck Stewart (Madisonville, Tenn.) received a one-year appointment to Spain as an overseas assistant, beginning January 2006. Timothy (Nashville, Tenn.) and Katrina (Batesville, Ark.) Crowson were appointed to a two-year term as professional servants in Japan. He will work as a media specialist and she will teach school. Matthew and Brooke Turnbough, serving a two-year term in Spain, were given preliminary approval for career missionary service.

Four missionaries were reassigned. Clint and Lynette Morgan are transferring from Côte d'Ivoire to France. Clint will continue his role as Regional Director for Europe, Russia and Côte d'Ivoire. He also plans to participate in specific teaching and training ministries within his region and will serve as a mentor to missionaries reaching out to North Africans in France. Shane and Joy Davison were also reassigned from Côte d'Ivoire to France. The Davisons are currently in language school in Albertville, France. They will join the missionary team ministering specifically to North African immigrants.

The Board issued the following commendation to Don Robirds for his work on the commemorative issue of HeartBeat: We, the Board of International Missions of Free Will Baptists, give a special commendation to Don Robirds for his excellent work on the commemorative issue of HeartBeat. The issue is a worthy reflection of the significant impact the magazine has had over the years. We express our great appreciation for producing the issue that will be cherished for years to come.

Acknowledging his June 30, 2005, retirement, the Board commended Eddie Payne for the years he has served as director of mobilization and recruitment as well as his years of ministry in Ivory Coast.

NEW MEMBERS: If we are going to grow then we need new members. Here are several Keys to make new members feel welcome into the Church.



- 1) Pre-Interview the person. No one should be presented for membership until they have met with the Pastor.
- 2) Give each new member a FWB treatise, a church constitution, a packet of offering envelopes, and a church directory (Names, addresses, phone numbers of other church members).
- 3) Call the new member by Name when presenting them for membership. It sounds very good to the person joining and is very helpful to the people in the congregation.
- 4) Tell everyone how the person is joining: Profession of faith, pending baptism, by letter from.
- 5) If possible, let the person give a brief testimony. It may speak to an unsaved person's heart and it will help cement relationships with other members.
- 6) Read the FWB Church Covenant (this is a good place for a responsive reading. It is in the front of the FWB Hymn Book.)
- 7) Extend the Welcoming Hand of Fellowship by the congregation
- 8) Now that they are part of the Church put them to work in the Church!
