# GREAT STATE MEETING VOTES TO RELOCATE STATE OFFICE

Over and over people expressed how much they enjoyed the 65th annual session of the State Association of Original Free Will Baptist, Inc. There was more preaching (an extra devotion was added on Thursday Morning) and all of the preaching was good and to the point of this year's theme- "Arise and Build God's Work". Temple FWB Church (and the South Carolina Conference) did an excellent job of hosting this year's meeting and the business session went so smoothly again this year until we were able to conclude at noon on Friday. #### Highlights from the 2007 SCFWB State Meeting:

- Delegates voted to sell the present property at 1705 South Irby Street in Florence and use the money from that sale to construct a new State Office and Book Store facility on the property owned by the State Association in Turbeville where the Home for Children is presently located.
- The State Association voted to partner with "Friends of India" as a means of preparing for future funding of the missionary ministry of Rev. Carlisle Hanna in India. This partnership does not obligate the State Association financially. It will simply allow those who promote the ministry of "Friends of India" to approach donors with the knowledge that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptist supports their efforts to raise at least \$3 million dollars for a trust fund whose interest would continue to support the work of God in India perpetually.
- Rev. Todd Smith was enthusiastically welcomed as the new SCFWB Executive Secretary.

**Funeral services for Rev. Herman Hyman** were held at Immanuel FWB Church of Santee and Mt. Elon FWB Church of Pamplico on Tuesday, January 16, 2007. Brother Herman was the founding pastor of Immanuel FWB Church of Santee where he ministered for nearly 20 years. He also served as Pastor of First FWB Church of Auburndale, Florida for nearly a year before his health declined and he returned to South Carolina. He was 68 years old.

Pastor Walter (Pete) Minor and brother in law, Rev. Earl Hanna (Bethany) officiated at the Immanuel Service. Rev. Mike Jones (SCFWB State Office) and Dr. Richard Adams (National Home Missions) officiated at the Mt. Elon Service. Honorary pallbearers at both services were Free Will Baptist Ministers and Chaplains from the Orangeburg County Sheriffs Department.

Brother Herman was the son of the late David P. Hyman and Mrs. Mae W. H. Brown. He was born in Pamplico, S C and was educated in the Florence County Schools. He enlisted and served in the United States Navy from 1958 to 1960. After being honorably discharged he returned to Florence where he met and married Patsy Galliher, daughter of the late James Allen and Pearlie Johnson Galliher, on March 28, 1962. To this union three sons were born. He was employed with several Florence businesses as a manger and serviceman. He later attended the Florence-Darlington Technical College and the Bethel Bible Institutes to prepare for the ministry.

Brother Herman was very active in his home church of Mt. Elon and served as an ordained deacon, Sunday School teacher, Sunday School Superintendent and Treasurer of the South Carolina District CTS before being called full time into the ministry. In addition to his duties as Pastor he also served as a Chaplain with the Orangeburg County Sheriffs Department from 1995-2006. This Chaplain Program was one of the first of its kind and featured on CBS national news. He was very active with training and serving the church and community wherever he was needed.

Brother Herman is survived by his wife, Patsy G. Hyman; three sons, Alvin Hyman (Patara) of Kingstree, SC, Greg Hyman (Kim) of Timmonsville, SC, Patrick Hyman (Nicole) of St. George, SC; his mother, Mae W.H. Brown, of Florence, SC; three brothers, Melvin Albert Hyman (Jeri) of Middlebury, IN, David P. Hyman, Jr. (Nellie) of Johnsonville, SC, and Gene Brown of Florence SC; two sisters, Shirley (Tommy) Kennedy of Florence, SC, and Donna (Clarmon) Cook of Pamplico, SC; seven grandchildren, Benji, Rhett, Crystal, Vinson "Daniel", Jessica, Jason and Emily Hyman.


