Blessings at Calvary

Two years ago when God led Reverend Teddy Rabon to accept the pastorate at Calvary FWB Church in Georgetown, there was an average of 16 in attendance. After accepting the pastorate there, the local newspaper ran an article entitled "Minister Accepts Challenge at Calvary." The first year was difficult, but God was still at work. Two years later, the church now averages 63 in attendance on Sunday morning and 40 on Sunday and Wednesday nights. Since January 2009, they have seen 18 souls saved, and several have been baptized and joined the church. They recently had "Family Day" which turned into "Pastor Appreciation Day" with 110 in attendance. Easter Sunday they had 47 for sunrise service and 93 for worship service. Their "Homecoming" service was held in June with 99 in attendance. For their Vacation Bible School in June, they had 40 children and 20 adults in attendance each night. When Pastor Teddy first came to Calvary Church, there were no young people in the church, but now they have toddler, primary/junior, and teen Sunday school classes. Youth service was held on August 19, 2009, with 19 young people participating in the service, and 12 year old Cody Bailey preached the morning message. There were 111 in attendance for their "Youth Service." Calvary Church is currently running a campaign entitled "Harvest is Plentiful...It's Harvest Time." They will be having their "Big Harvest Day" on Sunday, November 29, 2009, with the "Phillips Family" providing special music. Pastor Teddy Rabon said, "Let's remember, it's not about man, nor is it about numbers, but it is about God and souls being saved. We just want to lift our Lord up and praise him. Please keep us in your prayers that we will ever be used of God and that we will continue to see God working at Calvary Church in Georgetown!"



FWBBC Moves Forward by Jack Williams



Free Will Baptist Bible College enrolled 302 students from 23 states and five foreign countries as it began its 67th year of service, including eight students from South Carolina. Since 1942, more than 6,000 FWBBC alumni have entered the denominational workforce as pastors, missionaries, local church leaders, school teachers, military chaplains, and more. One of the college's fall highlights

was the October 4-6 World Missions Conference that resulted in dozens of FWBBC students responding positively to messages calling for them to shake off spiritual apathy and commit their lives to Christian service. FWBBC is a regionally accredited four-year college offering more than 40 majors ranging from traditional pastoral ministry, missions, Christian education, and music to business, teacher education, psychology, history, exercise science, and more.

The college offers nine degrees: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music Education, Associate of Arts, Associate of Christian Ministries, Associate of Science in Biology, Associate of Science in Business, Associate of Science in Early Childhood, and Associate of Science in Ministry, as well as online learning, international studies, and adult education.

Relocation

FWBBC has purchased 66 acres in nearby Gallatin (Sumner County), just 25 minutes from the current campus, on which to build a new campus. The college's fundraising team has raised nearly \$2 million in cash and commitments and over \$1 million in commitments of gifts-in-kind this year, which represents half of the campaign goal of \$6 million to pay off the Gallatin property.

Looking ahead in the school year, our students will be able to enjoy this spring's "Take Back America Conference." This meeting will emphasize church planting here and internationally, and it promises to be one of the biggest conferences we've had. Everyone is invited to attend; the dates are March 14-17. FWB IM Restructured Giving

The NAFWB voted to restructure the giving received through Free Will Baptist International Missions (FWB IM). Beginning January 1, 2010, each FWB IM missionary will have a "Strategic Ministry Partner Account" (SMP) which will help meet the needs of their ministry expenses. Designated gifts for individual missionaries will be applied to their SMP account. The Global Evangelism Fund (GEF) will meet the needs of support services and the personal salary needs and expenses for all FWB IM missionaries and staff. At the end of the year, each missionary's SMP account will be evaluated, and the SMP budget overages will be applied to the GEF; however, if a missionary falls short of the SMP budget, funds will come from the Global Evangelism Fund to fill the gap. The SC FWB State Association voted at the 2009 state meeting that beginning January 1, 2010, all funds designated to the "SC Foreign Missions Plan of Support" will be directed to the Global Evangelism Fund. The Vision Fund which is for buying land and building churches will remain unchanged other than the name. For missionaries that have a Vision Fund, it will be called the "Impact Fund." 


