2010 SC FWB State Meeting

The 68th annual session of the South Carolina Free Will Baptist State Association meeting took place on February 25-26, 2010, at Evergreen Free Will Baptist Church in Conway. The theme of "Conforming to His Likeness" prevailed throughout the meeting. With a brief snow fall taking place outside and great fellowship on the inside, the meeting convened at 9 AM on Thursday with the congregational hymn "Lily of the Valley" led by Reverend Bruce Kimbrel and ended on Friday with the noon meal provided by the Evergreen Church and the Central Association. Reverend Sherwood Lee, pastor at Sand Hill Free Will Baptist Church, began his 15th year serving as state moderator. Reverend Buddy Seay was presented a plaque of appreciation for serving 14 years as assistant moderator. The state body accepted all reports that were given in the meeting including the ones shared at the General Board meeting on February 24, 2010. It was approved to appoint the Nominating Committee a year in advance to serve for the following year to give the Nominating Committee time to evaluate the upcoming slate and recommendations. FWB Children's Home Director Todd Parrish and the Children's Home board presented Missionary Jim Fairchild a check of \$1,000.00 to be applied to the Aiken Loan Fund. The state association also approved the sale of a small plot of the Children's Home property located on the other side of Atkinson Street in Turbeville. It was recommended and approved that the buyer pay \$5,000 plus closing cost for the plot that has remained unused by the Children's Home for many years. Director Todd Parrish noted that the funds from the sale of the property would be applied to the special projects account which will help provide a new roof for the boy's dormitory.

The Feasibility Committee voted on by the state body in the 2009 meeting recommended that both the Youth Ministries and CTS Youth Competition boards be combined into one Youth Ministries Board. The Thursday morning devotion was brought by Reverend Stephen Hyman. Reverend Jeff Cockrell, pastor at Black River FWB Church in Andrews, brought the Thursday morning message from 1 Peter 2. Evergreen FWB Church served a lunch of ribeye steaks and baked potatoes. After lunch, Reverend Kenneth Cash, the pastor at First FWB Church in Una, shared a stirring devotion from the book of Jonah. After an afternoon of various reports, the state meeting was dismissed until the Thursday evening service. During the Thursday evening service, Executive Secretary Todd Smith presented Reverend Mike Edwards a plaque for Horse Branch FWB Church being the highest giving church in 2009. Special music was presented by the Evergreen Trio (Pam Tyler, Cynthia Jones, Billy Jones). Dr. Garnett Reid, Old Testament professor at the Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, brought the message from the book of Exodus for the evening service. The business continued on Friday morning with Reverend Mark Leonard, the pastor at Mt. Elon FWB Church, leading everyone in a congregational hymn. Reverend Danny Stone, the pastor at Tabernacle FWB Church in Coward, preached the morning devotion. Reverend Thad Jacobs, the pastor at Happy Home FWB Church in Andrews, concluded the state meeting with a message from 1 Samuel 30. Before going to lunch, Moderator Sherwood Lee shared remarks from Psalm 17. The meeting concluded with an authentic Hispanic lunch being served by Evergreen FWB Church and their Hispanic Mission. 


