
Guffey Accepts Pastorate at Hope

Williams Hill 100 Year Celebration

On Sunday, September 26, 2010, Williams Hill Free Will Baptist Church celebrated its 100 Year Anniversary of existence. In 1910, there was a need for a Free Will Baptist Church in the Williams Hill community in upper Georgetown County, and Mr. Jordan Gaillard Williams went around to different homes having Wednesday night prayer meetings. The need for a local church soon became a reality when several families decided to build a church. J.J. Bagget and W.E. Gibbons organized Williams Hill FWB Church on July 20, 1910. The church joined the South Carolina Conference but later combined with other Free Will Baptist churches to form the Eastern Conference. The first church building was completed in November 1920, and the church voted to pay the pastor \$225.00 per year. On May 6, 1922, the first record of women having anything to do with church business was recorded. Sisters Mattie Williams, Lue Williams, and Daisy Williams were appointed by the brothers of the church to look after a matter of disorderly conduct by three of the church ladies. Mrs. Effie Miller was the church's first ladies auxiliary President. The ladies auxiliary purchased the first wood heater for the church. The first record of purchasing basins and towels was recorded in October of 1933. The church's first guest missionary was Ms. Laura Bell Barnard, missionary to India. The church had hard wood floors, and the knot fell out of one of the holes in the pulpit. Ms. Barnard was speaking, and a green snake decided to poke his head through the hole. She never saw the snake, but the whole congregation did. Electricity came to the church in December 1943, and a committee was appointed to look into purchasing lights for the church.

In 1948, Reverend J.L. Smith was unamimously called as the pastor. Brother Jesse William's heart desire was to see a children's home built. He organized singing conventions at Williams Hill Church and other churches to raise money for this purpose. Eventually, a FWB Children's Home was built in 1949 in Turbeville, SC.

In 1957, a motion was made and carried to give the building committee the go ahead and make plans for the new church building to be built. The new building was completed in June 1959. The old church building was sold for \$400, and the buyer had 30 days to remove the building. In 1963, Mrs. Gladys Williams gave property to the church in memory of her husband for a parsonage; however, due to the church being unable to get a right away from the church directly to the property, the church had to give the land back to Mrs. Gladys. In 1965 plans were once again made to build a church parsonage. Later, the church built a fellowship hall and started a church cemetery. In 1982, a porch was built on the fellowship hall matching the porch on the front of the church. On March 17, 1996, the Lord sent Reverend Doug Mathis to serve as the pastor of Williams Hill Church, and he has been their pastor ever since.

The "100 Year Celebration Service" on September 26, 2010, turned out to be a great day of testimonies, singing, fellowship and food with 267 people in attendance.

This time five years ago, there was no church in the pueblo of Alpedrete. There was no visible evangelical witness of God's love in a town of over 15,000 people. There was no place where the few believers who lived here could gather for worship, prayer, and encouragement. But all of

that changed when we opened the Alpedrete Outreach Center in December of 2005. At first, our plans were to establish a place to give a positive testimony and serve as Jesus' hands and feet. Many had asked us about learning English. So we began to offer activities in English like English Story Hour, Conversations in English, and children's singing sessions in English. We provided the activities...and they came. In fact, they even told their neighbors and friends about the Alpedrete Outreach Center. And before long, we realized that God was blessing our efforts. After just a month of Outreach Center activities, we met with believers in our town who were ready to form a church. This small storefront building which had been a children's shoe store just a few months earlier had been transformed into not only a place to have activities, but now it was a church....a place where God's name could be preached. This ministry may have officially opened in December of 2005, but it was conceived years before. In fact, over twenty years before the doors were opened, Kristi was taught and trained in a Sunday School class in South Carolina. She participated in CTS competition and attended youth camp there as a teenager. We were commissioned as missionaries in 1998 and sent off to "the regions beyond" to share Christ's love. As a result of the International Missions Board's December meeting and the adoption of a drastically reduced budget, the stateside staff will operate in 2011 with three fewer full-time employees. Barry Simpson, director of development, resigned from his position. Because of the budget reduction, he will not be replaced. Two additional stateside IM employees have been released from their jobs. "We regret that Charolette Tallent, field operations stateside manager, and Lori McCraney, accounting clerk, will leave the Mission," said James Forlines, general director. "This has been one of the most difficult things our leadership team has ever had to do." Charolette Tallent served as a missionary to France for 20 years. After her return to the States, Charolette joined the IM administrative team in October 2008. Charolette served alongside Jeff Turnbough, deputy director of field operations and the IM field leadership team (regional directors). "Charolette has provided invaluable service to International Missions," says Turnbough. Lori McCraney, lifelong Free Will Baptist, came to the Mission in October 2009. "Lori has been a great asset to financial operations," says Rob Conley, the Mission's chief financial officer. "As we have downsized due to the ongoing financial crisis, Lori has enthusiastically taken on more and more responsibility; we deeply regret losing her from our team." Compensation for both ladies will continue through January. Neither position has been eliminated due to poor performance or reduction in workload. "We ask the denomination to stand with us through this difficult time," pleads Forlines. "We believe strongly in the cause of world evangelization and in working in the hard places. I know our denomination does, too, and I appreciate each person's prayer and financial support."
