SC FWB Teen Retreat

The South Carolina Youth Ministries Fall Youth Retreat was held October 26-27, 2012, at the Landmark Resort in Myrtle Beach. The retreat was a great success with a total of 211 in attendance (160 youth and 51 adults) with one salvation and five rededication decisions. The attendance increased this year compared to 135 in attendance last year. Reverend Kevin Smith, the pastor at Westgate Free Will Baptist Church in Spartanburg was the guest speaker. The theme for this year's retreat was "Stay Out of the Woods." The theme verse was 2 Samuel 18:8 which states, "For the battle was there scattered over the face of all the country: and the wood devoured more people that day than the sword devoured." The messages challenged the youth and many came to the altar throughout the retreat. Even with the rain from hurricane Sandy, which was off the Atlantic Coast, the weekend of the retreat, everyone had a great time and enjoyed the retreat. During the retreat, activities included bowling, arcade, Ripley's Aquarium, and the Wonderworks Museum. Fifteen churches participated in this year's retreat. SC FWB Youth Ministries Director Reverend Teddy Rabon extends his gratitude to all the parents, adult workers, pastors, youth leaders, and youth that made this year's retreat a great success. Sherwood served as a medical missionary, and Vada worked in the women's ministries. Due to health issues, they returned to the states where they diligently continued their ministry for the Lord. Sand Hill was blessed to have them come be a part of their church in 1992 when the current pastor had to retire. Sherwood not only was able to be the full time pastor at Sand Hill but was able to continue his medical ministry working as a nurse at McLeod's Regional Medical Center. During this twenty year period Sherwood continued to not only serve Free Will Baptists at the local level but also at the state and national level. Sherwood is serving in his 18th year as SC FWB State Moderator. During this time, he has led the state during growth of its mission work, the development of a Spanish ministry, and the transitional times at the Children's Home. Sherwood also made his impact at the national level by being a member of the National Foreign Mission Board for many years. He has also been an avid supporter of our Mission work in India by making numerous visits to help Missionary Carlisle Hanna and by being a board member of the Friends of India, which is responsible for helping to build churches in India. Lebanon in Effingham Celebrates 100 Years

Lebanon Free Will Baptist Church in Effingham celebrated their "100 Year Anniversary" service on Sunday, October 21, 2012. The celebration weekend began with renown speaker and author Reverend Voddie Baucham speaking on Saturday at workshop sessions on the topics of "Multi generational Vision" and "Family Worship." Reverend Bauchum also preached the message at Lebanon's "100 Year Anniversary" service on Sunday morning, in which there were 583 in attendance. Lebanon Free Will Baptist Church was organized and dedicated in September 1912. Elder (a title once used instead of "pastor") H. V. Oliver helped organize the Church. M. L. Stone is listed as church Clerk. The first official mention of Lebanon FWB Church was their acceptance into the South Carolina Conference meeting at Mt. Elon FWB Church on Thursday, October 23, 1913. The statistical report for that meeting listed M. Matthews and J.N. Haines as delegates, with the church having a membership of 33. From its beginning, Lebanon has emphasized evangelism and growth. The 1914 minutes listed an increase to 51 members with 9 baptisms, and the 1915 report listed 71 members with 17 baptisms. By the 1930 report the membership had increased to 105. As Lebanon celebrated their 100th anniversary in 2012, they now have over 400 members!

Little was written about the activities of the church during the first 50 years of its existence. However, below are some interesting highlights from available church minutes:

- Oct. 6, 1916 Called H.V. Oliver to return as pastor for the coming year with a salary of \$100 per year. Male members were to pay \$2.00 per year, and female members 5 cents on the pastor's salary.
- April 2, 1920 Motion that we have services the first Saturday of each month (before Church Conference) and that any member who failed to be present for this meeting three times in succession be "looked after."

 • July 22, 1933 - Mrs. W.J. Haynes and Mrs. H.D. Allen
- were elected as Deaconesses.
- June 22, 1935 M.L. Stone, H.D. Allen, and W.J. Haynes were elected to a Building Committee.
- Jan. 22, 1938- P.J. Kirby is elected Clerk and L.L. Powell is listed as Pastor

Lebanon has impacted the Free Will Baptist denomination as well as the local community. For many years Lebanon was considered a "must stop" for any denominational leaders who was visiting in the area and this continually exposed the congregation to a denominational view as well as a local view of God's work. This world view information led to many areas of denominational influence: The Prosser Trust Fund (consisting of 200 shares of DuPont Stock given by Lebanon members Gary and Lizzie Prosser) uses its earning to help Free Will Baptist missionary and educational efforts. The Free Will Baptist Bible College (now Welch College) was impacted by Lebanon member A. C. Allen, serving as board member for twelve years. Also, the "A. C. Allen Scholarship Fund" was started which assists members of Lebanon to attend Welch College. Lebanon Church has allowed National Hispanic Home Missionary Fernando Bustamante to use its facilities for church services for ten years and has given thousands of dollars in support to this ministry. Lebanon Church has greatly assisted the FWB Children's Home in Turbeville with consistent giving, and members of the church helped with the annual

golf tournaments which raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the Home. Lebanon was also the first Church to include the FWB Children's Home in India in their monthly budgeted giving.

Lebanon continues to impact youth throughout the denomination with the "One" program, designed by Youth Pastor Chris Edwards, which expands beyond Lebanon Church and is used by numerous other churches.

Spurts of growth and excitement were experienced numerous times in its history but the present miraculous growth began when Lebanon Church called Mac Atkinson Jr. as their pastor in January 2007. During Pastor Mac's ministry, the church has exploded in growth and has undergone the transformation from a small community church into a bustling high energy Kingdom Church where "God is at Work" has become the constant theme of people's conversations. To God be the glory

Retired Ministers Tour of SC FWB History

On Thursday, September 27, 2012, several retired ministers met at Grace FWB Church in Lake City for the purpose of going on a tour of the history of South Carolina Free Will Baptist. Grace Church graciously offered their church van for the tour. Pastor Carroll Bazen drove the bus while Reverend Elro Driggers served as the tour guide and shared about our rich Free Will Baptist heritage. The tour began at Salem Free Will Baptist Church in Coward, which was organized in 1876 as "Little Salem" Free Will Baptist Church. It was noted that the "Little Sister" Church is now known as the Camp Branch Free Will Baptist Church in Scranton. The "Little Sister" Church (Camp Branch) gave 50 of their members in order to organize the "Little Salem" Church. Reverend Miller Millette was the pastor for 40 years at the "Little Salem" Church from 1920-1960. Salem FWB Church was rebuilt in 1960 due to a fire. The site of the previous Ebeneazer FWB Church property in Greelyville (Williamsburg County) was not visited on the tour, but it was noted that the Ebeneazer FWB Church was the place of the first meeting of the South Carolina Conference in 1858 of which we have a record. South Carolina Free Will Baptist had met since 1818, but the 1858 South Carolina Conference gathering was the first recorded meeting. The tour continued through various cemeteries and property around the Florence County area, and more information from these tours will be shared in future issues of the Informer. Father and Grandfather of IM Missionaries Dies

Reverend John J. Postlewaite, 86 year old father of Reverend Joe Postlewaite (First FWB Church, Darlington, SC) and father of FWB IM Missionary Ruth McDonald (Japan) and grandfather of Reverend Joey Postlewaite (Westside FWB Church, Johnsonville, SC) and grandfather of FWB IM Missionary Jonathan Postlewaite (leaving in February with wife Amy to go to Bulgaria), passed away Sunday, October 21, 2012. Reverend John J. Postlewaite was one of our first National Association of Free Will Baptist Home Missionaries, planting 7 churches in Washington and Oregon. Throughout his 53 years of ministry, he also served pastorates in Oklahoma, Arkansas, Illinois, and Missouri. John, or Johnnie to many, was saved at the age of 12, called to preach at the age of 19, and was ordained in 1947 after having attended Free Will Baptist Bible College (now Welch College). He married Leah Mae Scott on September 21, 1948, and they had four children: Joseph ("Joe"), Mary Susan ("Sue"), Samuel ("Sam"), and Leah Ruth ("Ruth"). John, along with serving in the ministry, was a skilled carpenter, real estate agent, and entrepreneur. He loved restoring antique furniture, gardening, and taking his grandchildren fishing. John and his wife Leah lived with their son Sam in Virginia Beach, VA for the past two years and with their daughter Sue in Nashville for the previous five years. Ralph Hampton, FWB Educator and Leader Dies



Reverend Ralph Hampton, former chairman of the Biblical and Ministry Studies Department at Welch College and a member of the college faculty for 50 years, died September 7, 2012, after a twoyear battle with cancer. He was 77. The Oklahoma native was converted at age

12 during a youth camp and ordained to preach in 1960. Hampton's ministry to the broader denomination included six pastorates in Tennessee and Missouri, articles for Contact and ONE Magazine, and curriculum writing for Randall House Publications. His signature leadership role came during a 15-year span when the National Association of Free Will Baptists elected him moderator nine times (1987-1996) and assistant moderator six times (1981-1987). Ralph began his 50-year tenure at Welch College in 1958 at age 23. Like most young educators, he wore several hats, which meant that he taught 15 hours per semester, served as Christian Service director, and was the dormitory supervisor. The son of a Free Will Baptist preacher and oldest of four brothers, he spent half a century changing the landscape of denominational education, preparing students for ministry in a world-wide community, and raising a family of three children with his wife Margaret—all three children graduated from Welch College. He pushed himself hard as an educator, earning five degrees—A.A. degree from East Contra Costa Junior College (1955), B.A. degree from Welch College (1958), M.A. degree from Winona Lake School of Theology (1961), M.Div. from Covenant Theological Seminary (1970), and the D.Min. (ABD) from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. Dr. Robert Picirilli, Professor Emeritus and retired academic dean at Welch College, said, "Ralph graced the campus with a lifetime of quiet, dependable service. We could always count on him to be there, to do what was needed, and to do it without making a fuss. He was dedicated to keeping the school true to its founding mission, and he never swerved in his thinking from that ideal." Ralph Hampton is survived by his wife of 54 years, Mrs. Margaret Evans Hampton, who served 37 years at Welch College as manager of the Welch Library.

Friends of India News

- Funds were provided by Friends of India for 19 families to rebuild their homes, which were destroyed in a violent cyclone earlier this year.
- Fourteen people were baptized in September in the Mainaguri Church. Six were baptized at the Kasibari Church. Eight were baptized at another church and numerous others have almost finished pre-baptismal training.
- An Indian Christian recently donated land for a church building. It will cost about 1 lac Rupees (slightly less than \$2,000) for fill dirt in order to be able to build.
- We are still waiting on a resolution of the Panasi Church situation where our church was destroyed and the material taken away. Your prayers are needed in this situation and in numerous other areas of persecution.
- Numerous Churches report being filled to capacity for services with no more sitting room. Each month pastors list new areas where churches need to be built to accommodate new believers who have no church in which to worship.
- Missionary Carlisle Hanna plans to return to India in January of 2013, with Reverend Mike Jones accompanying him. Your prayers for strength for him and for needed resources to continue God's great work in India are appreciated.

Mirial Gainer Update (Japan)

Many of you may wonder what it means to minister in Japan. What exactly is it that I do every week? I would like to share with you some of what my ministry looks like here. I work in the Koinonia FWB Church in partnership with Pastor Hirabuki and his wife Mayumi. My main ministry is in the area of discipleship of Christians and modeling personal evangelism in the church. One outreach the Koinonia Church has begun under my leading is the Kayou (Tuesday) Friends Café. The outreach began last year in the discussion stage. Once the Cafe opened in May 2012, my ministry involved cooking cakes and cookies to serve, making tea and coffee, serving guests, and talking with them. The outreach is from 2:00 - 5:00 every Tuesday afternoon. What an incredible time to share with a variety of people, most of whom have never been inside a church before! One of our first guests, Mrs. M, sat on the bench outside, refusing to come in because she belongs to a militant Buddhist sect. One of our Christian workers sat on the bench with her each time she came, giving her a glass of water and some cookies. How exciting it was the day Mrs. M decided to come inside and sit with us! She has rarely missed a Tuesday since we began the outreach. She listens to everything that goes on, sings to us on occasion, and learns Scripture verses. Her favorite verse so far is "Come unto me all ye who are weary and heavy laden." She says this verse describes her. In June, part of my ministry involved meeting the high school Eteam group at the airport and being with them while they were here. Sometimes, I cooked for them, and at other times I drove them to events or interpreted for them. I even helped with their laundry. While they were here, they helped with a local carnival for one of our churches and distributed tracts and flyers for all of our churches in the greater Sapporo area. After they returned to the states, I continued to minister in the Café, and I met Mr. S. He received one of the flyers the Eteam handed out and decided to come to the Café. When he came, he stated that he knew nothing about Jesus or Christianity but wanted to learn. I and other Café workers answered his questions and shared our faith with him. On December 23 during our Christmas worship service, Mr. S. followed his profession of faith through public baptism. While I was hospitalized recently, the other workers ran the Café completely by themselves. They have been encouraged by the salvation of Mr. S. and by the folks who have come seeking something more than coffee or tea and sweets. Another part of my ministry is furnishing music for the Koinonia church and combined women's meetings, and I also lead an English Bible study. Much of my work is making and developing contacts. "Ministry" means different things to different people, but to me it means being available to the Holy Spirit to be used as He directs. Thank you for all you do to make it possible for me



to minister here in Japan. God is changing hearts here in Japan as well as around the world. Thank you again for your part in the building of God's Kingdom.

Morgan Update (Uruguay)



Several months back a tragic accident occurred only a few blocks from our home in Montevideo. A young mom was driving her car when a tree fell across the car crushing and tragically

killing her, while critically injuring her two small children. Approximately a week later, the same type of tree fell in a vacant parking lot. The city sprang into action and began cutting down many of these trees. The problem is that these trees are so large they can no longer be sustained by the sandy soil in which they are planted. In many ways, this is a perfect description of Montevideo, Uruguay. The people have grown in a country that doesn't recognize God. Those that believe God exists, only believe that. They do not believe a person could know or have a growing, loving relationship with Him. The massive revivals that have taken place throughout Latin American countries have not been seen or felt here. We have recently completed our first year in this beautiful country, and its darkness has become very much a reality to us. We have had people say that "God is only for the poor" or "There are lots of different gods." We have seen advertisements in the local paper for people willing to place voodoo type curses on their enemies. We have witnessed those who worship the goddess of the sea, sending off their small, hand-made boats with sacrifices to appease their god. The country and its youth are in desperate need of Jesus. We are currently working with Emanuel Church in order to reach the lost in the community known as North Malvin. The Sunday school program of the church is growing, and recently Neil and a Uruguayan named Alexander began teaching a new Sunday school class for adolescents. This is the age when many quit coming to church; yet, since the class has begun, the attendance has grown each Sunday. We are also leading youth nights in our home on Friday nights. One unsaved teenager has been coming regularly and is beginning to ask questions about God and His will. We desire for the entire nation of Uruguay to be firmly planted in the good soil of the Lord Jesus. We want them to not only see external dangers, but to also see the danger that their souls are in. Please pray with us for God to move in the hearts of the Uruguayans. - Neil and Mandi Morgan


Difficulties and Blessings - Pooles

Leadership Conference Reaffirms the Inspiration, Inerrancy, and Preservation of Scripture

Free Will Baptist leaders from 18 states and Canada gathered at Nashville Airport Marriott Hotel December 3-4, for the 2012 Free Will Baptist Leadership Conference. The annual event, which provides a meeting venue for denominational boards and agencies, is open to every Free Will Baptist minister and leader. The meeting features nightly worship services, practical instruction, and plenty of time for conversation and networking. The 2012 conference addressed the theme, "How Firm a Foundation." From the opening hymn (of the same name) to closing statements, every moment explored and reaffirmed the Free Will Baptist doctrines of the inspiration, authority, and preservation of the Scriptures. North Carolina pastor Dr. Danny Dwyer and Dr. Robert E. Picirilli, longtime professor at Welch College, delivered powerful messages each evening as they defined and defended the importance of these vital doctrines. "To use a football analogy," Dwyer said during his Monday evening sermon, "there are some 'Red Zone' issues worth defending at all costs, and inspiration, authority, and the sufficiency of the Scriptures are certainly included." On Tuesday morning, a six-member panel of Free Will Baptist Bible scholars continued the discussion, answering 17 common questions about the Word of God such as: "How did we get the Bible?" "How has God preserved His Word throughout Scripture?" and "How do we respond to the existence of so many different English versions? Does it make any difference which one we use?" The panel included Danny Dwyer, Leroy Forlines, Paul Harrison, Thomas Marberry, Stanley Outlaw, and Robert E. Picirilli. Their answers are available in both DVD and booklet format. Following their discussion, the panel answered questions from the audience during an hourlong dialogue. The Monday night service featured music provided by Rejoice Ministry Team of Welch College, under the direction of Susan Forlines. The Tuesday evening service featured the Cofer's Quartet from Cofer's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Nashville. The group includes Executive Secretary Keith Burden, Russell Cooper, Dan Erickson, and Jerrod Pilgrim. In addition to plenary sessions and worship services, denominational officers and board members handled a lengthy slate of business. The Nominating Committee of the National Association of Free Will Baptists met to make recommendations for board and commission vacancies to be filled at the 2013 convention in Tampa, Florida. Mike Wade (OK) chairs the sevenperson committee. Other national boards and committees met in conjunction with the conference, including the Executive Committee, Board of Retirement, Home Missions Board, International Missions Board, Welch College Board of Trustees, Board of the Free Will Baptist Foundation, Randall House Publications Board, and the Master's Men Board.
