2015 Mileage Rate

The Internal Revenue Service recently issued the revised standard mileage rate which is used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business purposes during 2015. Beginning January 1, 2015 the standard mileage rate for the use of a car for business purposes will be 57.5 cents per mile for business miles driven; an increase of 1.5 cents per mile over the 2014 rate.

2014 Leadership Conference Affirms Biblical Marriage



Nashville, TN—One hundred twenty-five pastors and church leaders from 19 states and Canada gathered December 8-9, at Nashville Airport Marriott Hotel, for the 2014 Free Will Baptist Leadership Conference. The conference explored and affirmed biblical marriage; from the scriptural basis and historic Free Will Baptist beliefs and practices. Leaders discussed strategies to strengthen and defend marriage in today's increasingly hostile culture.

Dr. Russell Moore, president of the Southern Baptist Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission, provided the keynote address. He was joined by speakers Matt Pinson, President of Welch College; Eddie Moody, Pastor of Tippett's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, member of the Welch College Board of Trustees, and Chair of the Department of Counselor Education at North Carolina Central University; and Phillip Whiteaker, a judge serving on the Arkansas Board of Appeals and Chairman of the Free Will Baptist Foundation Board.

The meeting featured more than keynote sessions, with plenty of time for conversation and networking during banquet-styled meals. Each service featured music provided by Welch College, including Rejoice ensemble and the 42-voice College Choir directed by Dr. James Stevens. A number of national boards met in conjunction with the conference, including the Executive Committee, Board of Retirement, Free Will Baptist Foundation, Home Missions, International Missions, Randall House, and Welch College.

"In an age where marriage is being attacked from every side," noted Ryan Lewis, conference director, "this conference equipped pastors and churches to stand for biblical marriage while attempting to bridge the gap between churches and the culture in a redemptive way."

Dr. Moore is a widely sought cultural commentator who speaks frequently to issues of theology, culture, and public policy. He has been quoted and published by many of the nation's leading news agencies and periodicals including the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post, Chicago Tribune, USA Today, and the Associated Press.

He blogs frequently at "Moore to the Point," and has authored or edited five books, including Tempted and Tried: Temptation and the Triumph of Christ and Adopted for Life: The Priority of Adoption for Christian Families and Churches. In addition, Moore has authored dozens of academic articles and essays on systematic theology and Christian ethics. He is senior editor of Touchstone: A Journal of Mere Christianity. Dr. Moore earned a B.S. in history and political science from University of Southern Mississippi, a M.Div. in biblical studies from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, and a Ph.D. in systematic theology from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.

An ordained Southern Baptist minister, Moore has pastored a number of churches, most recently serving High-view Baptist Church from 2008-2012. He is a four-time member of the SBC Resolutions Committee and a regular columnist for Baptist Press.

"Dr. Moore has made a profound impact on today's church," said Executive Secretary Keith Burden. "He understands the challenges churches face in trying to reach a suspicious and sometimes hostile culture, and he shared practical advice to help Free Will Baptists ministers with compassion while remaining true to the Bible. We were honored to have him at this year's conference."

The 2015 Leadership Conference will return to Nashville Marriott Airport Hotel December 7-8.

Caanan FWB Church (Lancaster) Elects Rev. Jeremy Overstreet as Pastor





Tax Reporting and the Housing Allowance

Although the IRS instructions for Form W-2 do not require that the "fair rental value" of the parsonage be reported on the W-2, the Board joins the IRS (Instructions for Form W-2) in recommending that Box 14 be used to record this amount. Putting the "parsonage fair rental value" or "parsonage allowance" on the W-2 is a great way of maintaining a record of the amount designated as such.

If the pastor is living in a parsonage, the amount that is reported is the fair rental value of the house, plus any utilities and furnishings that are provided by the church. To get the fair rental value, it is suggested that you ask a local realtor to provide the church with a written estimate of how much a house similar to the parsonage in size and location would rent for on the open market. The church treasurer should then take that amount and add to it a "fair rental amount" for any furnishings that the church provides plus utility costs if the church also provides utilities. This total amount would be reported on the W-2 in Box 14 as, for example, "12000.00 - Ministerial Parsonage Allowance." If the minister received a housing allowance, Box 14 would report, for example, "12000.00 - Minister's Housing Allowance."

It should always be remembered that while the pastor does not have to pay federal income tax on this amount, he is required to pay SECA taxes (Medicare and Social Security taxes) on the housing amount. Further, it should be noted that only licensed or credentialed ministers are entitled to a parsonage allowance or a housing allowance. If a non-minister is given either a housing allowance or allowed to live in the parsonage, the entire value becomes taxable to the non-minister for both federal income tax purposes, as well as Medicare/Social Security tax purposes.

THE MINSTRY OF FRIENDS OF INDIA



For over 60 years Missionary Carlisle Hanna and his family have labored in the north eastern part of India to bring help and hope to the people of India. (Brother Carlisle is also in charge of the original Free Will Baptist work in South India begun by Laura Belle Barnard and Viola Wilson. Located 1500 miles from our work in North India in the state of Tamil Nadu this work is home to around 20 FWB churches and a Bible Institute).

God has blessed the work in North India with over 300 churches and an ever growing harvest (We average 2 people coming to Christ each day). Because of our close

proximity, we are also able to build churches in Nepal and increasingly reach the people of Buddhist dominated Bhutan.

God has blessed Missionary Carlisle Hanna with tremendous insight and leadership to continue

to oversee the work in India even though he is over 80 years old. Yet, everyone knows that the day will come when God will allow him the rest and reward he so richly desires. The question then becomes, "What will happen to the work in India at that time?"

After prayerful consideration several people who had visited India and had first-hand knowledge of the situation in India felt impressed of the Lord to begin a ministry that would raise funds to expand the present ministry in India and also provide a means of perpetually supporting the work that is already in place.



A Friends of India TRUST FUND was established with the FWB Foundation. This is a perpetual method of support since only the Interest from this account is used to support the ministry. The initial goal for this Trust Fund is three million dollars (which would generate one hundred and fifty thousand dollars interest annually and perpetually).

A GENERAL FUND was also established to be used for presently ongoing projects which include building churches, purchasing motorbikes for Pastors, supporting Evangelist / Church-Planters, and helping with other projects that expand or continue the present ministry in India.

Gifts to either fund are Tax deductible (FOI is incorporated as a non-profit organization in SC) and can be given directly to Friends of India (%Mike Jones, 2434 Allen Road, Effingham, SC 29541) or directed through the SCFWB State Office.

"Friends of India" is a supported partner of the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists and a recognized Partner for the support of the ministry in India by NAFWB International Missions.

The Board of Friends of India is elected annually on a six year rotation and is made up of people with a consistent record for support of missions (Dr. (Rev.) Don Hanna, Chairman of the Board-2020 {Raised in India and speaks Hindi}, Rev. Mike Jones, Secretary / Treasurer of the Board-2019 {former SCFWB Executive Secretary}, Rev. Sherwood Lee-2018 (SCFWB State Moderator and former Missionary}, Rev. Chris Todd-2021 {SCFWB Executive Secretary}, Rev. Buddy Seay, Jr-2016 {Former SCFWB Assistant Moderator, Pastor}, Rev. Jacob Creech-2017 {Former Pastor who consistently led his church to be the state leader in giving to missions}. Additional information can be seen at www.scfriendsofindia. com / www.scfoi.com .
