

GREER CHURCH

Pictured above is the First Free Will Baptist Church, Greer. The Building is the first phase of their Building Ediffices. Thus Building is 120'x36' with a seating capacity of 200. This Building has eight class rooms, an Office, two dressing rooms a choir room combination, a baptistry, and a large room that can be used as a Children's Church or Fellowship Hall.

This Church Building was erected by mostly volunteer help from within and without the Mission. Most of the work have come from men in the Beaver Creek Association. Churches that have helped are Lockhart FWB Church, Lockhart; South Avenue FWB Church; Lancaster; First FWB Church, Greenville; First FWB Church, Inman, Many man hours have been contributed by these men and the men of the local Mission. "A" ROLL

South Carolina was responsible for gifts totaling \$29,581.49 to Free Will Baptist Bible College during the school's fiscal year, June 1, 1974 to May 31, 1975.

Building fund gifts amounted to \$4,448.93. General Fund giving totaled \$25,132.56. This was 136% of the \$18,500.00 quota requested for the State. The General Fund gift quota for South Carolina this year is \$27,500.00.

Total giving to the Bible College was over \$450,000,00 for the 1974-1975 focal year. These gifts made possible the continuing ministry of training Free Will Baptist young people for the work of the Lord. The Tible College is deeply grateful to Free Will Baptists across the denomination for their faithful support.

Dates for the Bible College's 1975 Pastors' Conference have been changed to November 3-5, the school's administration recenlly announced. The dates had been previously announced as August 18-22, 1975. The time of the conference was adjusted when college officials noted that it would conflict with at least one state's annual meeting. The new time will fill the space in the school's calendar usually reserved for Missionary Conference.

Speakers for the Pastors' Conference and other data on the meeting will be released soon.

The Corinth Free Will Baptist Church was organized during the Civil War in the mid-1800's, In 1923 the name of the Church was changed to Poplar Hill Free Will Baptist Church. The Church was used for Schpoling in the year 1932-39.

The small Church that was built in the 1800's had been renovated and enlarged by the addition of Sunday School rooms. A Fellowship hall was built in the mid-1960's, During the year 1968 Rev. Monroe Harrell was pastoring and plans were started for a new and larger Church. On June with the Lord's wonderful blessings, the ground breaking was held for the new Church and Rev. Michael Jones was pastoring at this time. With the Lord still blessing, on March 8, 1975 the Dedicat-ion of the new Tabernacle wus held. The Auditorium seats 300, there are six class rooms, a Nursery, three rest rooms, two water coolers, central heat & air, a piano, and organ. To really show how the Lord has blessed, it is all paid for except the organ. Only blessings from God could have made this possible.

At the Dedication, a short memorial service was held in memory of those that had passed on. A report was given by the Building Committee and the little bell that was used in the school in the 1930's and was still being used for Sunday School was presented to Mrs. Eva Grimhal who taught school there. Also, there were four former pastors present and each one presented a short message. The morning message was given by Rev. G.C. Jones. He spoke from II Chromoles 6:13, and the text was "Solomon's Temple".

After the Dedication Service, dinner was served in the Fellowship ball and there were approximately 400 present. That afteruoon a singing convention was held and there was really some wonderful singing. It was a long day, but fully enjoyed by all. Thanks to God, for we give Him praise and glory for 11 all,
