The homes new superintendent and house mother, Rev. and Mrs James (Carolyn) Wilhide moved into the home and took charge of their new ministry on Labor Day, September 7. Brother James had lots of help from some of his former congregation at High Point FWB Church, Lancaster, SC in loading their belongings on a U-Haul truck. Moore Thoughts On Missions

As we have seen in our brief Biblical survey, God's purpose and plan for man throughout the ages has been to fill the earth with a people who reflect His glorious image. Creation, the flood, the confusion of languages at Babel, the call of Abraham and Moses, God's work through the prophets, the Incarnation, the Great Commission, and the Spirit's empowering of the Early Church all illustrates His firm resolve to bring it to pass.

Although it has not been accomplished, the Lord gives us a glimpse of His completed plan in Revelation 11:15--"The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ; and He shall reign for ever and ever." What a glorious thought! The purpose of God in creation will be realized at Christ coming! There will be a new heaven and a new earth filled with a people who reflect the praise, honor, and glory of their Creator.

Satan's attempt to frustrate God's plan through the entrance of sin into the world will not succeed. Man's rebellion against God will not thwart His purpose. He might rebuke many with words, "I have commanded you to lay up treasures in heaven and to send the gospel to the ends of the earth, but you have spent your treasures

to live in comfort and ease. "In that day he might well ask each of us, "why did you do so little to fill the earth with a people who reflect the glorious image of God?"

First McColl Winner In Fall SS Campaign





White Savannah Remodels Education Facility

On October 27, 1985 White Savannah FWB Church, Conway, SC dedicated their new 7,060 square foot Sanctuary. They have recently completed a remodeling project of the previous sanctuary and educational facilities which cost in excess of \$20,000,00.

The previous auditorium now contains two 12'X 16' classrooms and a sanctuary for "Children's Church".

lew carpet, a mixture of blue, gray and mauve colors, was installed in the hallway and the six classrooms of the education facility. Paneling with chair rail now cover the lower section of all the interior walls. New suspended ceilings of celotex panels were put in four of the classrooms, all of the old doors were replaced with new ones, and the hall and rest room ceilings and the upper section of the walls in the entire building received a new coat of white paint. Carpet was installed on the porch floor of the new and previous sanctuary.

Three things are yet to be done to complete the remodeling project: new tile on the rest room floors, mini blinds installed to the windows and name plates put on the classroom doors.

An item of new equipment has been added to the church which the pastor, Brother Ray Cribb, is finding to be very helpful in sermon preparation, in printing materials and record keeping. It is a 386 computer with a 110 MB hard disk drive and printer.

White Savannah is to be commended for their continuous improvements and growth.

Southside Darlington Dedicated Renovated Facility Southside FWB Church, Darlington, SC held a dedication service for their renovated educational facilities on Sunday, November 22. Norwood Gibson, State Promotional Director, was guest speaker for the occasion. Considering the rainy day the attendance was exceptionally good.

After the morning message the pastor, Brother Leroy Lowery, recognized those who had contributed to the remodeling project, led the congregation in a responsive PAGE-5

reading of dedication and prayer.

The ladies of the church had prepared a delicious dinner and served it to the congregation after the morning service.

An afternoon service was held consisting of congregational singing and special singing by three soloist of the church, Cameron Lloyd, John Pickett and Ricky Lowery.

The renovation project began the first of September and was recently completed. A new central heating and cooling system was installed replacing the old oil furnace and window air conditioning units. Carpet was installed on the floors throughout the two story building, including the stairways. A new coat of white paint was applied to all the ceilings and walls, even the wood paneled walls. A solution was put on them

so that paint could be applied. The rest rooms were refurbished with new paint, floor tile, cabinets and lavatories. A hall wall was removed to enlarge the fellowship room. All of the windows were dressed up with wood trim, facing and mini blinds. In addition to the special renovations to the nursery a lavatory was added for hand washing, etc. New and more light fixtures were installed for better lighting, especially in the classrooms. The classrooms were equipped with chalk boards, other equipment and teaching aids to make them more conducive to a learning center.

The project cost about \$19,000.00 and it is all paid for except the heating and air conditioning units, which is about 40% of the total bill. The people of the church gave their labor to make this project complete with so little money.


Southside now has a very attractive educational facility and these fine folks are to be commended for this outstanding accomplishment.
