He is survived by his wife, the former Magdalene Tedder, a native of Timmonsville, SC; one daughter, Mrs. Debra K. Sims; one son, Gerald Kirby, both of Timmonsville, SC and 5 grandchildren. He is also survived by 5 brothers and two sisters. One brother, Randall Kirby, was his twin. They were very close, having homes near one another and farming together for the greater part of their life.

He was a graduate of Sardis High School and received the "Efficiency Pin Award". Before his marriage he was employed by the Merita Bakery of Florence. For the greater part of his life he was a farmer, from which he retired.

Brother Kirby was saved at age 17 in 1939. He was a Christian for 54 years and he served the Lord faithfully this period of time as a member of Bethany Free Will Baptist Church. He served about 42 years as Sunday School teacher for the College and Career Class, as an usher for a long period of time, as a member of the pulpit committee on a number of occasions, and for the last 10 years he served as a church trustee. Faithful is an excellent word to describe his relationship to the Lord and his church. In the early 1970's a storm blanketed this area with

snow, making it impossible to travel by car and in some cases by foot. He had a perfect Sunday School attendance record and did not want to break it. To prevent it he drove his tractor to the church on Sunday and had Sunday School alone. His perfect attendance was for 20 years, 1971-1991. He was supportive of Free Will Baptist ministries, but was especially fond of Free Will Baptist Bible College.

He was a dear friend of this editor and I enjoyed every minute of his fellowship. It is always a joy to be in the presence of someone as jolly and friendly as he was.

In the death of Christians we should consider three things. 1. God's view. 2. The deceased view. 3. The view of family and friends of the deceased. Psalms 116:15 says. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints". This verse reveals Gods view. It is a precious thing to Him in that He has called His purchased possession to Himself. Rev. 14:13 says, "Blessed (happy) are the dead that die in the Lord". This reveals the deceased view; he is happy in the presence of the Lord. Even though the family and friends of the deceased suffer grief, which is normal in the separation of a loved one, we find comfort in that the separation is for a short time. Christians have the promise of God that we shall be with our saved loved ones one day. It is "good night" to them now, but it will soon be "good morning".

In July of 1988 Peace Church constructed an addition to the existing facilities to meet the demands for more Sunday School classrooms and a fellowship hall. The new addition consisted of 1,600 square foot fellowship hall, five classrooms and a storage room. Renovations were also done to the existing building to provide 2 classrooms, a larger nursery, a larger pastors study and a study for the assistant pastor.

The 2,080 square foot facility consist of a fully equipped kitchen with very attractive walnut finished cabinets, a large dining area, 2 rest rooms and a storage room. The ceiling has a white blown finish, inset florescent lighting and ceiling fans. The kitchen floor is covered with tile and the dining area with carpet. The interior walls have a white paint finish. The exterior walls are brick veneer with a porch at the entrance.
