State Woman's Auxiliary Raises Over \$6,000 For Ron and Linda Moore

Gwen Hendrix, President of the South Carolina State Auxiliary Convention, learned in early 1993 that Missionaries Ron and Linda Moore needed a good amount of cash in their account before they could return to Ivory Coast, West Africa. At the time she received this information it was too late to launch a fund raising through the district and state auxiliary channels. Sister Gwen, her state officers and district officers developed a fund raising project which would culminate with the September 17-18 semi-annual "State Woman's Auxiliary Retreat". The retreat is held at Look-Up Lodge, located north of Greenville, SC, in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains.



The building consist of a kitchen; equipped with stove, ice maker, food warmer refrigerator, cabinets, a large serving bar, a large pantry, a storage room for tables, chairs and other items; a 2,800 square foot dining area with a seating capacity of about 220 people; a foyer with two handicap equipped rest rooms.

The building is equipped with central heating and air conditioning, a commercial fire alarm system and a battery powered back-up light system. The most attractive thing about this beautiful building is the three sky lights in the center of the dining area.

The \$259,000.00 project included the renovation and enlarging the parking lot. The asphalt on the old parking area was taken up, a new drainage system installed and excavating work done to enlarge the parking lot. They now have 100 parking spaces.

Space will not permit to completely describe the beauty of the interior and exterior of the church facility. May the pictures give some insight to this end.

Brother Lemmons and the church are members of the True Life Association.


