Two South Carolina Foreign Missionary Accounts In Deficit

I would like to share with you an article which I read recently that really speaks to a need in many churches today. God bless you as you think about what it says.

"A certain church, which was surrounded by many lost and unchurched people, began to drift away from the habit of visitation and prayer. Little by little, all concern for lost people and their needs was gone. Members began to fight among themselves, each seeking his-her own will.

Having been out for several weeks, an impetuous member made a quick survey. He was concerned about the attendance records. He knew that the way to add to the church is through prayer and visitation. Without discretely addressing the problem, a few members took up the cry and tried unwittingly to rid themselves of the source of the problem--the pastor. As a result, the attendance dropped lower and the offerings grew smaller. New members failed to come. Some members moved their letters to other churches in the city; many quit coming. The attendance continued to drop and the offerings grew even smaller. Finally, many people joined the cry, "What we need is a new preacher"!! One day the distracted preacher resigned. In six months, a new unsuspecting pastor came. The plight of the church was even worse than it had been. The church had suffered tremendous damage from within and without. Shortly, the new preacher realized that there were deep problems in the church. In a year, he too left, but the problem was still there.

Brown of Sumter, SC and Dianne K. Miles of Sardenia, SC. Two sons; Ronald Kirby of Cades, SC and Michael Kirby of Scranton, SC; Twenty Three Grandchildren, Six Greatgrandchildren and two sisters.

Brother Kirby was a retired building tractor, farmer and a Free Will Baptist ister. He was a former Williamsburg School Board Trustee and was serving as a Williamsburg County Constable.

Rev. Kirby was saved in March 1947 at Hebron Methodist Church in Williamsburg County, while the congregation was singing "Almost Persuaded". He surrendered to God's call upon him to preach the gospel in 1974. He was licensed by the South Carolina Conference and ordained by the Eastern Conference. His pastoral ministry was with two churches; Poplar Hill FWB Church, Hemingway, SC for three years and St Johns FWB Church, Lake City, SC. He retired from the pastorate after serving St Johns on two separate occasions for a total of about 14 years. 
He has organized two churches; First FWB Church, New Oxford PA and Victory FWB Church, which he now pastors.

GEMS

From The Greek **New Testament** By Dr. Robert Picirill

Second Peter 1:3 refers to the fact that the Lord "hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness". The verb translated "hath given" is particularly interesting to note.

This is not the ordinary Greek word for "giving". Instead, the word here is a form of doreo, which means "to present" or "bestow". This Greek Verb is used only a total of three times in the whole New Testament. It carries with the idea of a free gift, a present given out of the largeness of one's heart. It is not a gift made because of some obligation, but simply because the giver has the ability to give and wishes to do so. The word often carries with it the idea of a present given by someone of great prestige and authority to someone who has no real claim on the gift at all. In Mark 15:45, for example, we read that Pilate "gave" the body of Jesus to Joseph of Arimathea. There was no reason for him to grant Joseph's request other than his o' decision to do so.

So it is that Peter says the Lord has "royally granted" to us, has "made a present to us" of everything we need for new life and a Godly walk.

We Should also notice that this verb is in the Greek perfect tense, which indicates a finished work on whose results we may draw. The idea, then, is a blessed one: not because He owes us anything, but out of His grace, God has opened up His royal storehouse and made a present to us. He has already deposited for us everything we need to be saved and live Godly. Now all we have to do is draw upon His gracious provision day by day as we have need.

Read the whole first eleven verses of II Peter with this understanding, and it will prove a blessing! It is also helpful to note that the fourth verse of this same chapter is the only other time this wonderful verb is used in the New Testament. There we read that God has "freely granted" to us the exceedingly precious promises that bring salvation.




