Missionary nurse, Glennda Leatherbury, died of cardiac arrest on Saturday night, October 15 at the Free Will Baptist hospital in Doropo, Ivory Coast, West Africa. She had returned to her field of service in June after her furlough in America. Reports indicate Glennda had complained of dizziness the night before and again Saturday afternoon. Dr. Paul Gentuso examined her and encouraged her to stay at his house, but she chose Continued To Page 2

#### South Carolina Home Mission News

AIKEN WORK. Two outstanding things have happened to the mission work in Aiken. Previously they had been meeting in a local public school facility, which is not the best facility to begin a church. A new meeting facility has been secured, which is more suitable for church services and it cost considerably less to rent. The other outstanding event is that a five acre tract of land is in the purchasing stage. When you read this article the purchase will be completed.

It is the understanding of this writer that the land is located near the current meeting place and in an area that has great development possibilities.

This is a joint mission work of the SC Free Will Baptist State Home Mission Board and the National Home Mission Board.

Mark Barber is the missionary pastor and he is very excited about the recent developments. This young church needs your prayers.

ANDERSON WORK. The Anderson mission work is a joint project of the Beaver Creek Association and the National Home Mission Department.

Danny Keen is the new missionary pastor and he reports that the work is progressing well. He and his folks have done a tremendous amount of work on the grounds and the buildings, even the removal of many trees that obscured the vision of the building from the highway.

The mission work was under the name of First FWB Church from its beginning, but it has been changed to Landmark Free Will Baptist Church. In a recent report from Brother Keen he stated that twelve people have been saved, and twelve have rededicated their lives. They have thirty members with new people coming in for the services. The Sunday morning attendance is between 40-50. Pray for Brother Danny and his people.

CHESNEE WORK. The Chesnee FWB Church, Chesnee, SC is a joint project of the Beaver Creek Home Mission Board and the National Home Mission Board. James Childers is the missionary pastor. Based on the latest report from this work it is still growing. Both spiritually and numerically. They have a problem that most pastors like to have and that is the need for more room. The mission church is in the process of raising funds to build. PRAY FOR THEM.

MANNING WORK. I. Bennie Turner is the missionary pastor of Fellowship FWB Mission Church, Manning, SC. It is a mission work of Brother Turner and his people. to return to her own home. Later that evening she sent a girl to call the doctor. When Dr. Gentuso arrived shortly thereafter, she had suffered cardiac arrest and was not breathir He revived her through performing CPR.

Miss Leatherbury suffered a total of six episodes of cardiac arrest and was brought back five times. The sixth proved fatal.

The body was taken to Bondoukou for embalming and to be placed in cold storage until the funeral. Glennda had requested to be buried on the field. The funeral was scheduled for October 28 in Doropo.

Glennda's co-laborer and room mate, Jalayn Martens, was in the states due to her fathers death. Jalayn, Mrs. Mildred Leatherbury (Glennda's mother), and foreign missions director, Eugene Waddell were scheduled to attend the funeral.

Brother Waddell stated, "Glennda has given her life to serve others and especially those in the Doropo area where the next closest medical facilities are over 50 miles away. She has been a faithful servant of her Lord. Her

friends and coworkers will miss her greatly".

#### The Call Of Russia

In the past few

years we have heard and seen on television the conditions in Russia. We have witnessed the political unrest and the fall of Communism. Russia is in the process of changing from a socialistic to a capitalistic society.

Inflation has increased dramatically in the past two months since I have returned from Russia. The monetary exchange rate two months ago was two thousand rubals, equal to one U.S. dollar; now the same dollar is worth five thousand rubals.

Due to this inflation, the construction of churches has practically come to a stand still. As we traveled through some areas in Russia we saw a lot of churches that were started, but have not been completed. It was very disheartening and a great concern to those who are Christians trying to-preach, teach and spread the gospel there. It should also concern us as Christians here in America. We should uplift them in prayer and ask ourselves what we can do to help them.

drugs and suicide. These problems seem to stem from not being able to cope with the onditions they are faced with. These problems seem to affect young people eighteen years old or younger according to a recent news report on television. These young people see no hope or solution to their problem. A nurse being interviewed said, "at least four to five young people admitted into the hospital had tried to take their lives. They simply cannot cope with the dramatic changes in their lives and become depressed which eventually leads to suicide.

During my time in Russia as a short term missionary, I noticed that liquor was readily available to anyone who wanted to buy it. It is cheaper than a 12 ounce can of Pepsi so it is not uncommon to see old and young under the influence of alcohol. These same people live from day to day with the uncertainty of their country and their future. They live very simple lives. A life of style reflects one of simplicity and slow pace.

Because of their many changes people are looking for something that they can grasp, hold on to and give them hope. Something that can bring them out of the situation they are in. That hope, of course, is Jesus Christ. They are in ixious and eager to hear about Jesus. A lot of Talse doctrines are coming into Russia and these people must be alerted to this fact. Some of these doctrines are Mormonism, Jehovah Witness, Orthodox, Charismatic and New Age. We must present the risen Savior to them. We must present the Christ that forgives sin, gives hope and everlasting life. We must tell them about the birth, death and resurrection of Christ. That is the gospel of Jesus Christ. Christians should be faithful to their responsibility to go and tell them of the love of Jesus Christ for them and the hope of eternal life in Him.

I found that the Russian Christians have a desire to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. They can now openly proclaim the gospel without the fear of being prosecuted for their faith.

We might ask ourselves how can we help? Pray for them and especially for the national pastors as they go out into the remote areas to preach. They are in great need of teaching materials; Bibles, gospel literature, and song books. They would love to have people come to preach, teach and help with the young cople. Listen real attentively as you read this article - God might speak to you about going to Russia to share Jesus Christ, and the hope of eternal life we have in Him.

#### Bible College Makes Land Purchase For Future Location

Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, TN has purchased 122.8 acres of land at a cost of 265,000.00. It is located in the northwest part of Davidson County on the out skirt of Nashville, between interstate 24 and US 41-A (Clarksville, Tennessee Highway). The land is in the Joelton area of Nashville, about 16 miles from downtown. Residents of the Joelton area held a town meeting on August 30 to express their feelings about FWBBC locating in their area. The response was overwhelmingly favorable. "They understand the kind of college we are," says Dr. Malone.

The land was purchased for a future site for the Bible College. According to Dr. Tom Malone, president of the Bible College, the new site is ideal for a college complex.

The property will be either partially or totally paid for when four recent bequests to the college are settled. The college will not begin a fund-raising campaign to move or make a final decision concerning relocation without denominational approval. After the service the congregation enjoyed 'ellowship together and a good ole country dinnner.







## Gilead Dedicates New Sanctuary

The ceiling is flat with a white blown finish and garnished with 26 light chandeliers. The upper wall area is finished with white paint. Wainscote paneling covers the lower section of the walls. All of the wood trim, including the dental crown molding, has a mahogany finish. A rose mauve carpet covers the floor area.

The church furniture, including the pews, are white and trimmed with a mahogany finished wood. The pews and chairs are upholstered in a fabric that blends with the carpet. The six stained glass windows with figures depicting the life of Christ caps the beauty of the sanctuary and gives it a good atmosphere that is conducive for worship.

A covered breezeway connects the old and new building. The old sanctuary will be used for children's church and classrooms.

The spacious parking lot is paved with concrete.

The exterior front of the building has a new look also. The roof was extended so that a porch could be added. The white columns supporting the roof and the block tile on the porch floor has added to the attractiveness of the building.

He was saved at his home church Tabernacle Free Will Baptist, Kinston, N He served his church as a youth worker and worked in the bus ministry.



#### In Memory Of Mrs. Alma Weatherford

Most people in South Carolina knew her as "Miss Alma"; Catherine and I knew her as Mother and Mom. She died July 10 of this year and was buried next to her husband in Mt. Elon FWB Church cemetery.

Alma Weatherford was born September 21, 1907, to Robert and Dillie Harrell. Until her marriage she lived in the Mars Bluff community near old Bethel Free Will Baptist Church. She was converted and joined Bethel as a child, becoming a Sunday school teacher as a teenager. After she married Oliver Weatherford, she and her husband located on a

farm near Mt. Elon, which remained her home, off and on, for the rest of her life.

Miss Alma was a teacher by nature and by profession. One wonders just how many students she influenced for mastery of the three R's, and for Christ. The first place I know she taught was in the two-room schoolhouse at Gibbs, which was where the Mt. Elon parsonage now sits. (I had her there in sixth and seventh grades, and she was rougher on me than on anyone else!) Later she taught at Friendfield, Oak Grove, Tans Bay, and Greenwood. She was stern and strict, but she would do anything to encourage a student who tried: ask missionary Sherwood Lee who had her in grade school at Oak Grove. She always kept Hurlburt's Story of the Bible on her desk, and she read the Bible stories regularly to her classes.

More than anything else, however, Mom was a teacher and tireless worker at church, wherever she lived. During the late 40's she devoted great energy to the cause of the Free Will Baptist League, as it was known at the time, going about from one church to another to encourage starting a league, and then working to get a district league convention organized. She was instrumental in helping Paul Ketteman, Luther Sanders, and others get the youth camp work started at Camp Forest, usually taking charge of the cooking. She was one of the founding members of the Pamplico FWB Church, where she spent many years teaching the young people, visiting and witnessing to the lost, and otherwise ministering to those in need. She conducted classes at several nursing homes, black and white. When she was 73 she spent a year in the Virgin Islands helping in our missionary church school there.

Not many people knew of her generous giving. Many years ago she started giving 20% instead of 10; at her death she was giving 30%. True to her life, in death she left everything to Christian causes-especially to Free Will Baptist Bible College, which she dearly loved.

For the last 16 years, after the house near Mt. Elon burned she lived with us, and for most of that time ministered to my family as cook and housekeeper while Clara and I worked. During the last months she failed rapidly. Near the end, she didn't want to go to a nursing home or back to the hospital. We were able to keep her home, from where she went to be with the Lord whom she served faithfully all her life. Participating in her funeral were James Earl Raper, Bill Poteat, Sherwood Lee, and Robert Rose. I think Sherwood touched us all when he observed that she had graded her last papers and rung the school bell for the last recess. Her works of giving and teaching and witnessing remain as her testimony, and her children rise up and call her blessed.

But we would err to imply that she went to heaven because of her works. The truth is, like all the rest of us, she had her shortcomings. She was saved by the grace of God and her good works were nothing more than the fruit of His work
