



Construction of the 5,140 square feet facility began in April 1994 and was completed in November 1994 at a cost of \$256,250.00. It was constructed by Temple Construction Co. of Greenville, SC. The building consist of a 255 seating capacity sanctuary, three classrooms, a nursery, secretary's office, pastors study and two rest rooms.

The sanctuary has a cathedral type ceiling with a blown white finish and graced with large brass chandeliers. The church furniture is made of oak wood. The pews and pulpit benches are upholstered with a mauve-green fabric that blends with the teal green carpet. The floor throughout the building is covered with carpet except the rest rooms. They are covered with tile

The interior walls have a white paint finish. The exterior walls are brick veneer.

A baby grand piano was donated to the church

and it was completely refurbished by Carol Hanna Music Co. The ladies auxiliary raised funds and purchased the organ.

The parking lot has an asphalt surface with a 50 car parking capacity and a concrete walk way was constructed, joining the previous building. This building is now being used for classrooms, fellowship hall and rest rooms.



Fellowship Completes \$12,000 Renovations To Facility

The congregation of Fellowship FWB Church, Florence, SC is enjoying the beauty and comfort of their renovated sanctuary and education facilities.

The sanctuary ceiling was refinished, and eight light brass chandeliers replaced the old florescent lighting. Spot lights were installed over the choir loft and the pulpit area, and a modesty rail was placed to separate the choir and pulpit. The pulpit area was enlarged, the paneling that once covered the walls was cut into leaving the bottom portion paneled with a

chair rail. The upper walls were finished in sheet rock and painted. h e T vestibule was finished likewise. A plush royale blue carpet replaced the old carpet the sanctuary floor. New upholstery replaced the original

A large Tennessee newspaper reported goddess worship at an international ecumenical meeting of church women are being met with shock and disbelief by local women church leaders of two mainline large denominations.


However, the meeting in November in a large mid western city, where the worship included prayers to the goddess Sophia as "our maker" and "creator", drew nearly half of its participants (2,200 including 83 men) from twell known, mainline denominations. The twell known, mainline denominations. The twell known denominations contributed over \$66,000 from its Bicentennial Fund to help finance it. Other funding agencies listed in the official conference program included agencies of six well known denominations and church groups.

Some who attended the meeting said it focused on growing interest in the goddess Sophia as a manifestation of divinity that is underway among feminist theologians and some female churchgoers. In addition to what they regarded as "goddess worship" and "heresy," they also objected to: a spontaneous "celebration" led by a lesbian and bisexual women; self avowed lesbian as speakers; liturgies using sexual images to express the divine; the remarks of a female minister who rejected the atonement doctrine, the belief that God and humanity are reconciled through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross; a speaker who said Jesus was guilty of violence against women and that what "we really need is a promised land where women will be free to love other women".

A large southern news paper stated, "A new church has been formed in this state, the First Non-Judgmental Church. The Pastor says, "his church is a new thing that God is doing through his Spirit...based upon the law of Chritather than the law of Moses....This church born out of a heart for God. We are evangelical, full gospel and transdenominational."
