#### Mortgage on State Property in Florence Paid Off

The five-year project of purchasing property to house the Promotional Office and bookstore ministries has been completed! The final payment of \$14,300 was made on January 13, 1997. Though we were just over \$2,000 short in funds necessary to make the payment, monies were borrowed from other accounts. We are confident that by the annual session of the State Association the remaining \$2,000 will have come in. South Carolina Free Will Baptists have worked hard to purchase this property and are to be commended for their commitment to provide the State with adequate facilities.



We are entering a very busy time of the year for our state ministries. Throughout February and the first part of March we will have the WNAC District and State meetings. The 1997 session of the South Carolina State Association is the last of February. The last Sunday in March is Roll Call Sunday and the last Sunday in April is Foreign Missions Sunday.

As I look toward to the future, I sense an excitement, enthusiasm, and expectation for our state ministries: the ladies have been and will continue to be active in supporting home and foreign missions; the Children's Home has received many blessings from the Lord; the Aiken mission project is progressing; and God has blessed the State Office and bookstore.

I believe that this year's annual session of the State Association will be tremendous. As well as having good speakers, we will hear exciting reports from our state ministries. #### Community Gets Face Lift

Community Free Will Baptist Church in Florence, South Carolina, has had major renovation projects completed during the past year. The congregation has added a new steeple (\$5,000) and a new 4'



by 10' lighted sign (\$1,500). They have also installed new flooring in the fellowship hall, restrooms, nursery and pastor's study (\$3,000). Just before Thanksgiving, the church added a 54 car paved parking lot (\$14,580).



Indeed, the Lord has blessed Community in these and other ways. Since February 1996, over 100 people have been saved. Most of them have remained with the church. Since Rev. William Justice became pastor of the church in June 1994, the congregation has grown from an average attendance in the low twenties to the upper eighties.

# Task Force Recommends Adoption of New South Carolina Foreign Mission Plan of Support

Is there anything that we can do to end the cycle of deficit missionary accounts? Isn't it time to change the emphasis of missionary furlough from crisis fund raising to ministry—giving field reports, sharing prayer requests, and ministering from God's Word? Isn't there a quicker and less expensive way of getting new missionaries to the field? Yes, there is!

After months of study, meetings with pastors and lay people across the State, and consultation with many of our state leaders, a special task force was formed to consider just such a plan. The task force was composed of moderators from the seven Free Will Baptist Associations (Conferences) of the State, the State's Moderator and Promotional Director, and the president of the State WNAC.

During a meeting at Peace FWB Church, Florence, January 9, the task force adopted the South Carolina Foreign Mission Plan of Support for recommendation to the fifty-fifth annual session of the State Association which will convene February 27, 1997.

The proposed plan will target missionaries appointed by the Foreign Missions Board of the National Association and who have residency ties to South Carolina. The plan is a cooperative effort that safeguards designated giving as we seek to underwrite an appropriate percentage of a missionary's support. At the heart of the plan will be an effort to raise financial "share" commitments among our churches and people. Though we do not have space to provide the details of the proposal here, we will provide them at the State Meeting.

We are excited about the potential of this plan. It will transfer the burden of raising support from missionaries to pastors and churches. It will result in better stewardship of resources, getting missionaries to the field more quickly. It will help make furlough more of what it was intended to be—allowing missionaries to focus on ministry rather than fund-raising. It will provide better access for more churches and believers to get involved. The potential of the plan is

so great the it has already been overwhelmingly endorsed by our missionaries, the Foreign Missions Board and administrative staff, and state leadership.

We encourage you to make plans to attend what will be, we believe, an exciting and historic session of the South Carolina State Association!

#### Bible College Receives SACS Accreditation

Free Will Baptist Bible College has been granted regional accreditation by the Southern Association Colleges and Schools (SACS). The announcement was made December 10 in Nashville by the SACS Commission on Colleges. This is the culmination of a process begun by FWBBC in 1991. In December 1994. SACS granted the college Candidate status. The college has continued since then to address criteria for accreditation through intensive self-analysis and implementation.

Accreditation not something new for the college. FWBBC has been accredited by the Accrediting Association of Bible Colleges since 1958. Further recognition was given in 1976, when the Tennessee State Department of Education licensed the college's teacher education program. SACS accreditation, therefore, is recognition by another agency of college's quality of education. As stated by Dr. Jim Cox, the college's Director of Institutional Research, "This is a quality institution now being even more broadly recognized."

The Parkway church was founded by Rev. Johnnie Bullman in 1964 and was known as Heron Circle FWB Church. It was located in the Old Nativity Lutheran Church where the Waffle House sits today. That same year the church moved to their own building on Lone Oak Street.

The church grew rapidly and in a short time was averaging well over a hundred in attendance. In 1965 the church voted to support its pastor full time. The following year the congregation purchased a parsonage.

Rev. Johnny Miller was elected pastor in 1986. Under his leadership the church voted to relocate at its present location on Parris Bridge Road. The church was renamed Parkway FWB Church and the first service in the new facility was held on Easter Sunday, 1989. In 1990 the church voted to build a Family Life Center and in 1992 the parking lot was paved.

Rev. Leon Simmons became pastor of Parkway in July 1995 and in less than 18 months the church was able to make the final payment on their \$250,000 note.


Isn't the Lord good! We rejoice with the members of the Beulah Church at how God has met their needs.
