SOUTH CAROLINA EREARS ROLL CALL SUNDAY RECORD

South Carolina FWB Churches increased their attendance by an average of 11.1% on Roll Call Sunday, March 30, 1997. A total attendance of 14,643 in 1997 shattered the record set last year by 1,464. Eighty-four of our churches showed an increase over 1996. More importantly, 56 salvations were reported on that day. Praise the Lord! Below is a list of how the Lord blessed some of our churches.

The new South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support is now facing its biggest hurdle-implementation. Developing the plan was easy compared to the task that is before us. With your help, however, we are confident that its implementation will be speedy and our goal of underwriting the financial support of our South Carolina missionaries will be achieved.

Some exciting things are already happening. Quarterly conferences are electing members to serve on the Foreign Missions Task Force. This Task Force will be responsible for working with me to promote the plan in their conferences, to evaluate its effectiveness, and to make recommendations to the State Association for changes. I am looking forward to working with these men.

The State Auxiliary has endorsed the plan and their treasurer will channel all missions giving through our office. This will help us coordinate the state effort.

We have held a few services in churches to present the plan and challenge our people to become more involved. The plan is being enthusiastically received. At Peace FWB Church in Florence, for example, the members responded by adopting nearly 60 shares (\$11 per month per share) in faith-promises. This is in addition to what the church had already committed in its budget!

Indeed, it is exciting to see how God is working among our people and to see our people respond to His missionary challenge. Pastor, give us an opportunity to share this exciting plan with your congregation. I know that they will be challenged to greater involvement and that the Lord will bless their efforts.

New Life Breaks Ground For Family Life Center

New Life FWB Church, Lancaster, held groundbreaking ceremonies for the new 13,000 square feet Family Life Center on Sunday, February 23, 1997. Four Of Our Preachers Go Home To Be With The Lord




Rev. Wayne Price
