

ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

THURSDAY MORNING, NOVEMBER 18, 1954

The Association was opened by the host pastor, Rev. Fred S. Powers, with devotions.

The congregation stood and sang "Stand Up, Stand Up For Jesus" and "To The Work." Rev. Powers then read Psalms 1 and gave the welcome. Rev. A. F. Lawter of Lockhart gave the response.

Rev. L. A. Holliday, President, then called the Association to order.

Visiting Ministers who were seated at this time and other times included: Rev. and Mrs. Burkette Raper, Rev. Damon Dodd, and Rev. E. S. Mooneyhan.

Committees (listed above) were then appointed by the President.

Motion by Rev. M. H. Mellette that the officers elected by the Executive Board since the last Session be elected for the remainder of the term. Passed.

We then recessed for ten minutes.

After re-assembling, we sang "Send The Light," and Rev. Rufus Coffey read Matthew 5:13-16, and lead in prayer. The Rev. L. A. Holliday, President, brought the introductory message, using as a subject "Ye are the Light of the World." Bro. Holliday carried out some good points as he reminded us that if we are to become the light of the world that we must let our light shine way out into the darkness of the world.

We then recessed for the noon hour to re-assemble at 1:15.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION, NOVEMBER 18, 1954

Rev. Paul J. Ketterman led the devotions for the afternoon session. We sang "Sunlight" and Rev. Ketterman read from Romans 13:10-14.

Rev. Damon Dodd, of the National Headquarters in Nashville then gave a report on Home Missions. Rev. Dodd told of the great work which is being done by the Home Mission teams, sponsored and supported by the National Association of Original Free Will Baptists, in Nebraska and in Tampa, Florida. He urged young people to consider, as God directed, to consider the Home Mission work. Then Rev. Dodd introduced The Home Mission Bank Plan, which places a small bank in each church and Sunday School room for weekly contributions to Home Missions.

Church, Conference, and Associational letters were then called for and turned in to the clerk.

The President called for the Christian Education Report, and Rev. M. H. Mellette, Chm. introduced Rev. Burkette Raper, who gave an enlightening and interesting talk on the Mount Allen Junior College of Mount Olive, N. C. Rev. Raper told of the origin, progress, and courses offered by the school there. His remarks made all of us feel that surely God is blessing the work at Mt. Allen. Rev. Mellette then suggested that we take an offering for the school, which was done, and the amount raised was \$55.00.

Rev. L. A. Holliday then gave the following report on Foreign Missions.

Annual Report of State Director of Foreign Missions

June 30, 1954 to November 1, 1954

As your Director of Foreign Missions, I submit the following report:

I find among our people throughout the state a growing interest in the cause of foreign missions, for which we're profoundly grateful. With the opening of new fields there must be an increase in finances; this being true, the National Board of Foreign Missions has found it necessary to increase the state's Quota. As the baby grows his shoes cost more. I believe that we should put forth a special effort to meet our Quota by June 30, 1953. To do this it will be necessary to do a little more field work than has been done in the past year.

I also recommend that all itineraries made in the interest of Foreign Missions be arranged by the State Director and that all funds raised for this cause be sent direct to him. I further recommend that each district comprising this body be asked to appoint a director and that there be and arrangement made between the several district directors and the state director for a state wide missionary conference to be held at a time and place to be designated by them. Special efforts would be put forth to have our National Director speak at this conference also one of our Missionaries if available.

These recommendations come out of the experience which I have gathered over these several years which I have served as your director and are being prayerfully submitted.

Yours for the Gospel to all people, Louis A. Holliday, S. C. State Association, Director Foreign Missions.

Bro. W. S. Mooneyham, of the National Headquarters talked to the Association, and introduced the Co-Operative Plan which is being used in the Headquarters. He recommended that we adopt this plan, which allows the National Headquarters to distribute the money as the calls come from the various phases of the work. Then Bro. Mooneyham introduced and sold several copies of CONTACT, newspaper of the National Headquarters.

At this time the Treasurer gave a partial report, which is printed with the rest of his report elsewhere.

A committee representing the South Carolina Conference introduced a report on revisions which they found needed in the Treatise of Original Free Will Baptists.

Motion: That a committee be appointed from this body to make a further study of these and any other changes necessary and make a formal report to the resolutions committee of the National Association to convene in July, 1955 at Tulsa, Oklahoma. Passed.

That an office of State Promotional Secretary be created.

Motion: By W. A. Hales: That we amend Article 5, Section 1, of the Constitution of The South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptist to read as follows: "The officer of this Association shall be a president, first, second, and third vice-president, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, a promotional secretary, and a reading clerk. Said reading clerk to take the place of the recording secretary in his absence."

We then adjourned until 9 o'clock, with the regular evangelistic service to be conducted at 7:30 by Rev. T. A. Williams.

Friday Morning Session, November 19, 1954

Rev. J. H. Hucks opened the Friday morning session with devotions. We sang "Heavenly Sunshine" and Rev. J. B. Oliver led in prayer. Rev. Hucks then read Psalms 100.

The President then seated the delegates and ministers for the day's business. He then called for churches having not reported.

Home Mission Report

Rev. Fred S. Powers, Director

In response to the motion passed in the 1953 session of the State Association, empowering the Home Mission Board with the authority to set up and promote a church finance system that will assist in the building and providing suitable places of worship for new churches that might be organized, we submit the following recommendations:

- 1. That we adopt the same system that has been used successfully in the State Association of North Carolina for the past number of years. That we have Rev. Burkette Raper, who is present with us to explain this system to this body. Adopted.
- 2. We further recommend that the State Association empower the Home Mission Board with the authority to set up and promote a program to raise funds to purchase a tent and equipment to be used on the Home Mission Field of our state in revivals and the Organization of new churches. Adopted.
- 3. That we make every effort possible to meet the quota set by the National Home Mission Board for this state; the set quota is \$1200.00. Adopted.

Sunday School and Literature

We, your committee on Sunday School and Literature make the following report:

'Realizing the urgent need for better Sunday Schools in all our churches and, the need for better trained workers. We recommend that each pastor in the state lead his Sunday School in a training program, holding at least one week of an Officer-Teacher Course each year.

We recommend that all Sunday Schools, as much as possible, use our own Free Will Baptist literature. And we further recommend that each School use the "Six Point Record System."

We urge all our Sunday Schools to give full Support to the work of the National Sunday School Convention and its Promotional Secretary, and that each Sunday School in the State send delegates to the National Convention. We also recommend that our Sunday School workers in the local churches take more interest in the District and State Conventions.

Recognizing the importance of rightfully dividing the Word of Truth, we strongly urge our Sunday School Officials and Pastors to prayerfully select from their constituency the most spiritual and best qualified persons for teachers.

Temperance Committee Report

We, your committee on temperance, submit the following report:

- 1. Be it resolved that the use of alcoholic beverages in any form be discouraged and condemned by our people everywhere and in and every form. Adopted.
- 2. That this Association protest the public advertisement of intoxicating liquors on the pages of newspapers, billboards, placards, radio, television, and newspapers. Adopted.

Motion: Clerk be instructed to notify the following organizations of our action: WCTU. THE STATE NEWSPAPER, THE NEWS AND COURIER, THE GREENVILLE NEWS, THE FLORENCE MORNING NEWS, THE CHARLOTTE OBSERVER, THE ASSOCIATED PRESS. Passed.

- 3. That we co-operate with all other bodies working for ultimate national prohibition.
- 4. That we encourage and insist that our Church people everywhere, regardless of political party affiliation, refuse to support any candidate for any office known to favor the liquor traffic. Adopted.
- 5. That our Ministers preach uncompromisingly against the use of intoxicating beverages as well as other forms of sin. Adopted.
- 6. That we ask our people to refrain from patronizing any business establishment that sells beer, wine, or any intoxicating drink. Adopted.

Realizing the great need of a better informed ministry in our church: Be It Resolved:

That all applicants for Ordination to the Gospel Ministry in our churches be required to take the Correspondence Course offered by the Free Will Baptist Bible College, 3609 Richland Avenue, Nashville, Tenn., or some other approved Christian school and show a certificate for work done before Ordination. Adopted.

CHURCH COVENANT

THE SECTION OF STREET

4.

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this SolemnCovenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord, and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises, supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of the Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Preamble: We, the officials, ministers and delegates of this the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists, while in session at Una Church, Spartanburg, South Carolina, November 13-14, 1946, do accept and adopt the foregoing constitution and by-laws.

Article One. This body shall be known Henceforth as the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists.

Article Two. It shall be the purpose of this organization to co-operate with the National Association in its efforts to elicit combine, and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist Church, for the promotion of Home and Foreign Missions, Christian Education, Sunday School, Free Will Baptist leagues and Woman's Auxiliary work and for the extension of the kingdom of God in general.

Lockhart, S. C.

Article Three.

Section One. This Association shall consist of delegates duly appointed or elected by the church or organizations to represent, and ordain and licensed Free Will Baptist Ministers, who are of good repute in the Original Free Will Baptist Church, and who reside in South Carolina, or hold membership in, or pastor a church in South Carolina.

Section Two. Each Association or Conference, may represent in this Association on the basis of two delegates for each Association and conference of one thousand members or less, and one delegate for each additional thousand members or fractions thereof.

Section Three. Any local church that desires may send an additional delegate, provided said church sends a contribution of not less than \$10.00.

Article Four. This Association shall have an Executive Committee of five, composed of ordained ministers and lay members in good standing in the Association, one to be appointed by the Moderator each year for a five year term, to act officially in the event any case may arise in this Association, when, and only when it is deemed necessary or expedient for the best interest of the cause of the church in general.

Article Five. The officers of this Association shall be a President, First, Second, and Third Vice-President, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, a promotional secretary, and a reading clerk. Said reading Clerk to take the place of the recording secretary in his absence.

These officers shall be elected by the Association to serve a term of two years.

Article Six. All officers of this Association, all members of its committees and boards, all its secretaries, missionaries, and agents appointed by the Association or by any of its boards, shall be members of regular Free Will Baptist Organizations in South Carolina cooperating with this Association.

Article Seven. All missionaries, teachers and Christian workers approved, appointed, or supported by this Association must be fundamental in their views of the Bible and its teachings, and in harmony with the doctrines of the Original Free Will Baptist Church. They must also give evidence of genuine Christian piety, for fervent zeal in the service of Christ, and of ability to do the work for which they are considered.

Article Eight. This Association shall hold its meeting annually on Thursday and Friday of the week between the second and the third Sundays in November, beginning at 10:00 a. m., unless, or until, some change of the time of the year shall be thought best.

Article Nine. Articles may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present providing the change is recommended at least one day before the vote is taken.

1. A portion of the Scripture shall be read and prayer offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session of the Association, and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.

This is to be done by the president or someone appointed by him.

2. The President or Vice-President shall call the Association to order at the hour designated by the program Committee.

When neither the President nor the Vice-President is present, the recording secretary shall call the Association to order and a President Pro-Tem shall be elected by the body, who shall provide for that session of the Association.

- 3. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to enroll the delegates of the Association who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their right to seats therein, and those enrolled by the Secretary shall compose the Association.
- 4. Each organization represented in the Association shall send into the Association as large a contribution as they can from time to time. This money to be used to meet the expenses of the Association and to promote the work it undertakes.
- 5. On the first day of the Association meeting the President shall appoint a Resolution Committee to consist of three members, all resolutions not connected with the reports of boards and committee shall be referred to this committee, which shall report on all resolutions referred to it, with or without recommendation.
- 6. The officers of the Association, the departmental Secretaries, the Executive Committee, and all boards shall be elected by the Association. All other committees may be either appointed by the President or elected by the body.
- 7. In the event of a standing Executive Committee, the Members shall be elected for a term of five years except the first four elected, who shall serve a period of one, two, three, and four years respectively.
- 8. The duties of the Executive Committee shall be as follows: 1. To act for the Association on matters that demand its consideration between the regular annual sessions of the Association. 2. To have oversight of arrangements for meetings of the Association with authority to change, if necessary, the time and place of meeting. 3. To fill vacancies in the Association that may be caused by death, resignation, etc., between the regular sessions of the Association.
- 9. It shall be required of all members of the Association to remain throughout the entire session, unless they are excused by a majority vote of the body.
- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President, and shall wait until he is recognized before speaking further.
- 11. The President shall not allow discussions that are unchristian in spirit and that tend to create envy and strife among the brethren, and anyone resenting the ruling of the President in such matters shall be liable to censure of the body.

- 12. No one shall be allowed to speak more than 15 minutes or more than twice on the same subject without permission of the body.
- 13. It shall be the duty of the President to have his annual message so prepared and arranged that it can be handed to the Secretary for publication in the minutes of each session of the Association.
- 14. The officers of this Association, except that of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee, shall be for a term of two years.
- 15. These By-Laws may be altered at any regular session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, providing the change is recommended at least one day before the vote is taken.
