APPENDIX V

THE FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME MISSION REPORT OF SOUTH CAROLINA

God is blessing the state of South Carolina. We are seeing the moving of the blessed Holy Spirit at work. Praise the Lord. Nearly every week there is a new mission being organized somewhere in the U. S. Yes, to Jesus be all praise.

The Beaver Creek Association Report:

This association received a record financial blessing from its churches. They gave a total of \$12,036.07 to home missions. Praise the Dear Lord. This was received from 21 churches and individuals. One church gave over three thousand dollars and two others gave over one thousand dollars.

Rev. J. B. Rice is a full time missions Pastor at Greer, S. C. There are three other self supported works at Mauldin, S. C. Rev. Danny Gray is Pastor; Rev. John Suttles at Fountain Inn, S. C.; Rev. Junior Sullivan, Indian Land, S. C. Praise the Lord for these good men.

This gives Beaver Creek 27 churches and 4 missions.

The South Carolina Conference Report.

The Jefferson Road Free Will Baptist Mission at Sumter, S. C. is now in their new parsonage; which is valued at \$40,000. The new church is now being occupied with a seating capacity of three hundred. There are 12 class rooms, church office, choir, baptistry, nursery and plenty of parking area. The total value is \$121,000. \$7,857.47 was given to the missions by 25 churches. The cities of South Carolina are calling us to take the gospel to every city, town, and Hamletin, S. C.

The Eastern Conference Report:

There is a new mission begun close to Mars Bluff, S. C. It is located one mile north of the Francis Marion College between Florence and Dillion on Highway 301.

Rev. T. C. Farmer is the mission pastor. They have a 64 foot trailer, pulpit, chairs, altar and are running 35-40 in Sunday school.

Rev. Joe Cagle, Wayne Poston, and Rev. Hoyt Powell are the board members.

We do not know of any other new work in S. C. at this present time. Brethren, the time is short and Jesus is coming and we need to get busy for our Lord.

We have not yet tapped our resources among the Free Will Baptists of S. C. We need a way to challenge our people to the great need of fully evangelizing every town in S. C.

CONTACT Magazine now has the largest number of subscribers in its 20-year history. Regrettably, the mounting interest in our national publication is not reflected by the number of subscriptions here in South Carolina. Only 224 families in South Carolina subscribe to CONTACT. We need your help in promoting this inspirational and informative Christian publication.

How would you like to order CONTACT for every family in your church? The Church Family Plan, which only two churches in South Carolina are now using, offers a substantial savings over the regular single subscription rate of \$3.00 a year. Any church may start the Family Plan by sending the name and address of every church family to:

CONTACT P.O. Box 1088 Nashville, Tennessee 37202

In turn, the magazine will be mailed directly to each family every month. The church treasurer will be sent a statement once a quarter for 63¢ per subscription until the church gives a 30-day cancellation notice. Since the cost is less than 5¢ per week for each family, it is a wise investment for churches to supplement their Christian literature program by sending CONTACT to the entire membership. Sample copies, subscription forms and further information may be secured by writing to CONTACT at the address given above.

We believe the Cooperative Plan of Giving is a systematic means of stewardship for supporting the work of Christ beyond the local church. It is a practical system of giving whereby a percentage of local church offerings is sent to help finance state and national ministries.

This plan has proven to be an effective means of promoting support for the total denominational program. The Cooperative Plan of Giving has been adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists as a means of financing both state and national ministries.

We hope you will consider adopting the Cooperative Plan of Giving as a means of undergirding support for the state and national ministries.

The interest and involvement of our lay people are essential to the building of a strong denomination. We are pleased with the growing number of laymen

who now share in the rising attendance of our National Convention. Each church is asked to send a lay delegate to the 1974 National Convention in Wichita, Kansas, July 14-18.

Plans are underway to erase the present indebtedness on the National Office property. Relieving the denomination of this remaining 12-year obligation will reduce the monthly rental rate charged to each department. This alone will enable the missions departments to give \$60,000 directly to missions work rather than to the mortgage holder. This amount would be in addition to the savings on the interest which is due on the remaining principle of \$130,000. We thank you for what you have given. We also appreciate the work of Joint Project worker, Rev. James B. Rice in Greer, South Carolina. We praise God for what you have done for National Home Missions.

Our most pressing need at this time is our General Fund. Deficit missionary accounts, prayer cards and newsletters, evangelism conferences expenses, national association expenses, rent on office space, literature and printing, travel and promotion, and dozens of other things are all paid out of the General Fund. No designated money for missionaries can be used by the General Fund.

General Fund Report TO THE BRETHREN OF SOUTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION From Free Will Baptist Bible College

Dear South Carolina Friends:

The things which will be accomplished, the plans that will be laid, and the work that will be begun at this year's State Association shall bring glory to our God. This should be the prayer of each one of us. Your administration and staff at Free Will Baptist Bible College are praying to this end.

To bring you this year's report is a privilege. Through people like you, God has given a wonderful year to our college. A total of 173 ministerial students are enrolled. You and I recognize that the denomination's future rests largely upon the productivity of your Bible College.

The fine staff or workers and teachers have given much of themselves through the years. They are to be commended for the good job they have done. They need your prayers for the responsibility of training these young minds.

Construction of the new physical education building was completed early this spring. It has proved to be a real blessing to the student body. We enjoyed its use during the Bible Conference and graduation exercises.

The Bible College's General Fund gifts reached another all-time high during 1972-73. Last year's suggested quota of \$250,000 was nearly reached. This was an average of \$20,833.33 per month, or an increase of slightly less than \$2,000 per month over the previous year's giving.

South Carolina's gifts increased last year. The previous year's gifts were \$12,126.82 while gifts for June '72 through May '73 amounted to \$16.875.84.

This year's enrollment is the largest in the history of the Bible College. Five hundred dollars in subsidization gifts is still needed for each student. This amount, along with that which the student pays in tuition and fees, enables the College to operate smoothly and conservatively. 1973-74 gift quota has been set at \$275,000. Of this amount Bible College friends and churches throughout the state of South Carolina are being asked to share together in raising \$17,000 for the General Fund during the 1973-74 year.

It is with praise to His grace and power that I point you to the rest of this report. The names of South Carolina's students are listed along with other vital statistics of interest to you.

The Bible College's future rests upon the prayerful concern of you and other people like you. Without proper guidance from the Lord and shelter from His protecting hand, your Bible College cannot remain true to his cause. South Carolina has done a good job through the years in helping to undergird this important work in every way. With your help, I believe that we can see an even better report next year.

We thank God for what has been accomplished through our department this past year. We moved from a part-time to a full time ministry. There are now 259 participants in the retirement plan with 5 from South Carolina. Assets of the plan now exceed \$260,000.

Our College Savings Plan is a means whereby a little money can be set

aside every month to assure adequate funds when children reach college age. This plan is available to laymen as well as ministers.

We are offering three kinds of insurance:

- 1. Life Insurance to our pastors, missionaries and employees of denominational agencies.
 - 2. Cancer Care Insurance to all Free Will Baptist families.
- 3. Property insurance-fire and liability at group savings and annual dividends to churches and denominational agencies.

At the present time several churches and denominational agencies have money in a trust fund with our department. In addition, various trust funds are available to any Free Will Baptist who wishes his money to be used in the Lord's work.

Our newest ministry is to senior adults. A retreat for senior adults, pastors and those interested in working with them has been planned for November 26 to 29 at Hillmont Camp in Tennessee. The cost is \$30.00 which includes room and board, registration fee and insurance.

We appreciate your support to our operating fund. During 1972 we received \$267.53 from your state. Thank you for sharing with us.
