# MINUTES OF THE THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL SESSION OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Meeting with the South Carolina Conference at the Bethany Free Will Baptist Church, Timmonsville, S. C. November 14-15, 1975

The meeting was opened with the singing of "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart", led by Rev. Earl Sutton of Georgetown, with Jean Hyman at the piano.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. Paul Reid of the Beaver Creek

Conference.

The Association was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Ansel Smith.

#### APPENDIX I

#### STATE PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY'S REPORT November 1973 - October, 1974

This past year has seen some steps of progress in our State. We have at least eight Missions and some Churches Organized.

Many glowing reports of Souls being saved and Churches growing because of their evangelistic thrust.

There are several things that the Promotional Secretary's Office needs to make this office be more effective to our State:

- 1) If you want a State Paper there must be greater participation in getting news. Without news it is difficult to print a paper...Also, the news received must be written so the Editor will not have to spend time writing information given to him verbally. There has been little news from local churches.
- 2) The support of "The Informer" comes from a very small amount of the churches in the State. This Office is not asking for thousands of dollars from each church, but is asking each church to support it with a minimum of \$5.00 a month. If your church is supporting the Promotional Secretary's Office, we would like to say "THANK YOU".

Dear South Carolina Friends:

"While other liberal arts institutions cut the ties of moral restraint, encouraging students to develop their own concepts of right and wrong behavior, Bible colleges reinforce the Biblical fact of man's accountability to God to live according to the moral code given in the Scriptures and natural conscience...It boils down to a question of which philosophy you want to learn."

This statement from the 1974-75 catalog of your Free Will Baptist Bible College indicates that it still stands firmly for the teaching of God's Word and the principles upon which it was founded. It offers the kind of training that is needed more now than at any other time in America's history. This kind of training is a necessity for your denomination's future growth.

TO REPORT to the people of South Carolina is always looked upon as a privilege. Some of your churches have given consistently month after month. A number of individuals have sacrificially given to keep their college going. With God's blessings upon this and that which was given by other states, there has been enough to meet the Bible College's needs for the year.

There were 25 faculty members, 33 staff members and more than 150 students who worked at your Bible College during the 1973-74 year. Among these were the first full-time physical education instructors in your Bible College's history. This physical education program proved to be a real blessing to the students.

GENERAL FUND gifts during this year reached some \$9,000.00 beyond last year's gifts. Total gifts for the year were \$257,167.22. In spite of the fact that the Bible College received \$21,431.00 per month, we Free Will Baptists still lacked approximately \$17,800.00 reaching the \$275,000.00 quota that had been adopted for the year.

South Carolina's gifts increased during this year. Your previous year's gifts were \$16,875.84, while gifts June 1973 through May 1974 amounted to \$18,514.60. Your new quota is based upon your past giving records and your numerical strength. Your Bible College is counting on 18,500.00 from South Carolina during the 1974-75 year. It is our hope that you will adopt this figure as your goal for gifts to the General Fund.

LIBRARY VOLUMES have increased in number during the year. Some churches have sent cash gifts in honor of deceased members instead of sending flowers to the funeral. With these gifts needed books are purchased and are placed in the library with an appropriate memorial message. Our library now includes 22,775 volumes.

We join in prayer with you for God's hand to control Free Will Baptist Bible College. Thank you so much as a people for your faithful concern through this past year.
