THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The session opened by singing "Jesus Saves" with Rev. Lloyd Gore, as song leader and Mrs. Doris Bullman as pianist. These served during the entire session unless stated otherwise.

Rev. Norwood Gibson led in prayer. The morning devotion was brought by Rev. Willie Justice, of the South Carolina Conference. His text was from 2 John 1:8. He pointed out five Crowns that are mentioned in the New Testament, and that we as Christians should strive for the reward God has for us.

Rev. Johnny Bullman, the host pastor gave a warm welcome, then Rev. Harry L. Cooper, the Clerk, gave the response.

MSC to seat the delegates.

MSC to adopt the program.

The Committee on Committees were appointed. These were Rev. Earl Hendrix, as Chairman, Rev. Billy Baker, Rev. Joe Cagle, Rev. James Wilhide, and Rev. Ronnie Floyd.

The visitors were then recognized. The following were from our National Offices. Dr. Melvin Worthington, our Executive Secretary, Rev. Eugene Waddell, from Foreign Mission Department, ~~Bro. Lloyd Olson, from Master's Men, Dr. and Mrs. Robert Picirilli, from Free Will Baptist Bible College.~~ Rev. Frank McQuage was a visiting Minister from North Carolina, Rev. Herman Hersey, from Retirement and Insurance, and Rev. Malcolm Fry, from the Sunday School Department.

The Assistant Moderator, Rev. Robert Hagler, brought the Message for the Moderator, Rev. William Jacobs. (Appendix 1). We then had a recess.

THURSDAY MORNING WORSHIP

The service opened by singing "There's Power in the Blood" led by Rev. James Wilhide. Rev. Fred Kirby led in prayer. Special music was brought by Rev. Lloyd Gore, singing "If I could Help Somebody Today."

Rev. Ronnie Floyd, from the South Carolina Conference, brought the morning message. His text was taken from 1 Kings 18:36, and he spoke on "Power of Revival." He used Elijah as an example, showing his stand for God and exposing signs of Baal and Idol Worship.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

We sang "Amazing Grace" with Rev. Dave Nobles as pianist. Bro. Buddy Hill led in prayer. Rev. Jimmy Shipman, from the Palmetto Conference, brought the devotion, from Rev. 21:4. He pointed out that Heaven would not have any sorrows, and the problems of this present life will be over.

The Committee on Committee's report was given. MSC to accept (App. II) Rev. Norwood Gibson was elected as the delegate to the National Association. He is from the South Carolina Conference. MSC to have one delegate from each local Conference, and let the conference pay the delegates way to the National.

The Credentials Committee gave a partial report. MSC to accept. (App. III.) MSC to let Rev. Willie Justice succeed himself as General Board Member.

The Bible College report was given and accepted as information.

We sang "Love Lifted Me" with Rev. James Wilhide leading, and Rev. Dave Nobles as pianist. Dr. Robert Picirilli, from FWBBC brought a Seminar "Practical Helps for Family Devotions."

Rev. Eugene Waddell from our Foreign Mission Department gave a report, and this was accepted as information. The Executive Committee's report was given. MSC to accept item 1 and 2. MSC to lay item 3 and 4 on the table until Friday: (App. IV.)

1. Item 3 was a Constitutional change of the Conference representation fee being changed from \$3.00 to \$13.00 per church.

2. Item 4 was also a Constitutional change, of reducing the Children's Home Board from a 11 man board to a 7 man board.

MSC to adjourn. Rev. Willie Justice dismissed in prayer.

THURSDAY NIGHT WORSHIP

The service opened by singing "When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder." Rev. Robert Hagler, led the singing with Mrs. Brenda Bullman and organist, and Mrs. Doris Bullman as pianist. Rev. Joe Cagle led in prayer. We then sang "Showers of Blessings." The Bullman trio from the Host Church sang "Gone," "If You Need Somebody To Go I'll Go," and "Take Me To Jesus." We had a time of Testimonies. Rev. Robert Hagler and Bro. Scott Bullman sang "Caanan's Land Is Just In Sight," and Rev. Robert Hagler sang "John 3:16." We then sang "How Great Thou Art."

Dr. Robert Picirilli from FWBBC brought the evening message taken from Eph. 6:10-18. He spoke on "The Christian's Welfare" and pointed out that we are in a spiritual battle against the forces of evil. He pointed out that we need God's Armour, in order to withstand against, and overcome this battle.

An offering was taken and given to Rev. Norwood Gibson, who is our State Promotional Man. Rev. Herman Hersey played "When They Ring Those Golden Bells." We then adjourned, until the Friday Morning Session.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

We sang "Victory In Jesus" led by Rev. Jimmy Shipman and Rev. D. J. Boyd as pianist. Rev. Paul Clayton, from the Beaver Creek Conference brought the devotion, taken from Col. 3 1-4.

Dr. Melvin Worthington, our Executive Secretary, gave a report, and it was accepted as information. Bro. Lloyd Olson, from our Master's Men Department, gave a report, and it was accepted as information.

MSC to let the offering that was taken on Thursday night, be a personal gift to Rev. Norwood Gibson. Rev. Malcolm Fry from our Sunday School Department, then gave a report, and it was accepted as information.

Bro. Lloyd Olson from Master's Men Department, gave a Seminar on "Practical Helps For Master's Men taken from John 13:13. He pointed out the starting of the program, projects and the ways that men can serve the Master in their local church. We then had a recess.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP

We sang "Christ Receiveth Sinful Men" with Rev. Johnny Bullman leading and Mrs. Doris Bullman as pianist, and Mrs. Brenda Bullman as organist. The Master's Trio from Coastal F.W.B. Church, sang "One Day At A Time" and "It Is Finished."

Rev. Joe Cagle from the Eastern Conference brought the message taken from Isaiah 53. His text was "The Satisfaction of Jesus." He pointed out that Jesus was satisfied only, when He gave His all on Calvary, for the sins of mankind. He stressed that we should likewise give our all for Him. Rev. Ansel Smith led in prayer.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

We sang "He Lives" led by Rev. Dave Nobles. Rev. Jerry Huff led in prayer. Rev. Mike Haynes from the Central Conference brought the devotion taken from Psalms 126:5-6. He spoke on "The Precious Seed." He pointed out that we all need a fresh look and burden for the Word and work of God.

Poston-Baggett Loan Fund report was given. MSC to accept. (App. V). The Promotional Secretary report was given. MSC to accept (App. VI). MSC to set aside May 30 of this year as Bobby Pool Call-A-Thon Day in order to raise the needed amount of money for him and his family to return back to the field. The Credentials Committee report was given. MSC to accept. (App. VII). The Treasurer's Report was then given. MSC to accept. (App. VIII). MSC to let the State Association Clerk send a nice letter to the local conference clerks, asking them to send a letter to the churches in their conference, who didn't send their representation fee to the State Meeting. The local clerks would ask them to please send their \$30.00 representation fee in to the State Association.

The Superannuation report was given. MSC to report. (App. IX). We then sang "Because He Lives" with Rev. Lloyd Gore leading and Rev. Dave Nobles as pianist. The Resolutions Committee report was then given. MSC to accept it item by item. (App. X). An amendment was then given to item 2. MSC to accept the amendment, and it was that the State Clerk send a letter of Thanks to The Cannon's Methodist Church.

The Children's Home Report was then given. MSC to accept (App. XI). The C.T.S. report was given. MSC to accept. (App. XII). The Youth Camp report was then given. MSC to accept. (App. XIII). MSC to remove item 3 and 4 of the Executive Committee off the table. Item 3 was a Constitutional change of local con-

ference representation fee being changed from \$3.00 to \$13.00 per church. After some discussion, the previous question was called for. MSC to accept item 3. Then item 4 was a Constitutional change of reducing the Children's Home Board from an 11 man to a 7 man board. Some discussion took place. MSC to call for previous question and vote on the item. MSC to accept item 4. MSC to elect a Committee for the purpose of doing a study of the Constitution and By-Laws, and the minutes, and to bring back a report at the 1983 meeting.

Motion -- Due to the many apparent discrepancies and needed updates in our State Constitution and By-Laws, I request that the State Association appoint a committee consisting of the Executive Committee, Treasure, State Promotional Secretary, and the Moderator's of each of the local conferences, with the conferences bearing the expense of their Moderator. That they do a careful study of the State Constitution and By-Laws for the following purposes and present to the body recommended changes and corrections at the 1983 State Convention.

1. Check wording for error and clarification.
2. Check to see if the procedure of obtaining members for all boards and committees are in keeping with our present organizational status and for adequate numbers.
3. Check job description of each director, board and committee for update accuracy and clarification.
4. Check committees, boards or positions that are not functioning for needed change or other disposition.
5. Check for a better organization of the sections dealing with boards, committees and directors for a more readily and convenient access to the information.
6. Make some provisions in the State Constitution or By-Laws to set forth guidelines for content in the state minutes to assure a minimum cost for printing the annual minutes.
7. To give every member of the state body an opportunity to offer his or her input and suggestions to this study by passing their information to a committee member.

MSC to let the State Clerk get the Minutes printed at the best lowest price. The Nominating Committee report was then given. MSC to accept it item by item. (App. XIV). Willie Justice dismissed in prayer.

APPENDIX IV

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

ITEM I

A. The Executive Committee met in July 1981 for the purpose of drawing up the program for the 1982 session.

B. The Executive Committee approved the giving of \$150.00 to Bro. Norwood Gibson for him to go to the Leadership Conference in Nashville, Tennessee.

C. The Executive Committee met again on January 26, 1982, to review the program for 1982, and to discuss some changes in our State Constitution, that will be brought before the body at the State Meeting.

D. The Executive Committee recommends that we drop item 3 of the Executive Committee report of 1981. This has to do with the establishing of a committee concerning Political trends etc. Bro. Fred Hall has moved away and he was the one going to work with Bro. Norwood Gibson on this. This is on page 16 of the 1981 Minutes.

The Executive Committees report to the State Association. (If it is approved Brother Harry will include this with the other portion of the report.)

ITEM II. At the 1981 state meeting, the Bible Belt Conference was received into our State Association under the watch care of the association for a period of one year. The Executive Committee recommends that they be received into a full membership.

A. The Bible Belt Conference officers are: Moderator - Everette Tyner
Asst. Moderator - Millard Hardman
Clerk - Freddie Tarlton
Treasurer - William Laney

B. The Bible Belt churches are: Palmetto FWB Church - Wallace
First FWB Church - Kershaw
First FWB Mission - Ruby
Faith FWB Church - Cheraw
Harmony FWB Church - Monroe, N. C.
Mt. Calvary FWB Church - McBee

ITEM III. The Executive Committee recommends two changes in the State Constitution.

A. Article III Section Four: Financial Representation.

The recommended change is to increase the local conference representation fee to the State Association to \$13.00 per church.

(a) The present reading of Article III section four is as follows: Each member association or quarterly conference shall be requested to send a representation fee of three dollars per church. Each local church shall be requested to send a contribution of \$30.00. This money shall be used to meet the expenses of the Association and to promote its work.

(b) If the recommendation is adopted, section four will read as follows: Each member association or conference shall be requested to send a representation fee of thirteen dollars per church. Each local church shall be requested to send a contribution of thirty dollars. This money shall be used to meet the expenses of the association and to promote its work.

(c) This change is recommended due to the increase in the State representation fee to the National Association annually. At the 1981 National Convention, the body approved an increase in the State fee to \$10.00 per church. The recommended increase to the local conference is to assure the state that there will be sufficient funds in the treasury to meet this need. Let it be known that these funds go solely to meet convention expenses.

B. Article VI Section Five: Children's Home Board.

The recommendation is that the number of board members be reduced from 11 to 7 members.

The change is to become effective at the 1983 State Association meeting. During the period of 1982 each conference can determine which member they will drop. Each conference will inform the nominating committee, while in session at the 83 meeting, their choice of remaining board member and he will serve out his regular term. The Bible Belt Conference and the Beaver Creek Association will inform the nominating committee of their recommended board member to be presented to the body for election.

(a) The present reading of Article III section five is as follows: The Children's Home Board shall supervise the ministry of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Turbeville. They shall be responsible for establishing the rules of the home, employing the employees and overseeing the ministry of the home. This Board shall consist of two men from each conference or association, except the South Carolina, which shall have three. They are elected to a five-year term, one conference or association rotating off each year.

(b) If the recommended change is adopted, section five will read as follows: The Children's Home Board shall supervise the ministry of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Turbeville. They shall be responsible for establishing the rules of the home, employing the employees and overseeing the ministry of the home. This board shall consist of one man from each conference or association, except the South Carolina Conference, which will have two. They are elected to a five-year term, after which the respective conference will recommend to

the State Association their choice of board member or members to be elected by the state body for a new team.

(c) This change is recommended due to the certainty of the Bible Belt Conference becoming a full member of the State Association. If the present policy of securing board members remains, this would mandate a thirteen member board. This number is unwise for a number of reasons, especially in the cost of having this large number attend board meetings.
