**MEETING WITH THE BEAVER CREEK ASSOCIATION**

At Valley Falls Free Will Baptist Church  
 Spartanburg, S. C.  
 February 16-17, 1984

The service opened by singing "Love Lifted Me" with Bro. Rick Jagers as song leader, and Mrs. Gwen Hendrix as Pianist. These served during the entire session, unless stated otherwise. Rev. Eugene Waddell led in prayer. Rev. Don Gray from the Palmetto Conference had the devotion taken from Phil. 2:1-11, pointing out the Mind Of Christ, that is so needed today.

The Moderator then called the Convention to order. The Host Pastor, Rev. David Carter, gave us all a warm welcome. The Assistant Moderator, Rev. Lloyd Gore, then gave the response.

Rev. Norwood Gibson pointed out that he would like to take pictures of Pastors, and Ministers during this session, so he would have a copy for the Promotional Office use.

The delegates were then seated. The Program was then adopted. The Moderator then appointed the Committee on Committees. They were Rev. Norris Hawkins, Rev. Tommy Bryson, Rev. Dale Yarborough, Rev. Everette Tyner, Rev. Ronnie Floyd, and Rev. Wayland Owens. Rev. Norris Hawkins served as chairman.

The visitors were then recognized, and welcomed. We then sang "When We All Get To Heaven." Rev. Willie Justice then told about the book he was giving to Pastors, and Churches, dealing with the IRS and Freedom of Religion. The Moderator then brought his message.

The Moderator then brought his message, taken from Psalms 11:3. (Appendix I.) We then had a recess.

**THURSDAY MORNING WORSHIP**

We opened the service by singing "Amazing Grace." Bro. Rick Jagers then presented the special music. Rev. Billy Vanderford, from the Beaver Creek Association brought the message. He read from Neh. 2:11-16, pointing out the need to do God's Work, in spite of opposition that may come. We then had dinner, with Rev. David Carter dismissing in prayer.

**THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION**

We opened the service by singing "Jesus Saves." Rev. Joe Haas then led in prayer. Rev. Micky Smith, from the Bible Belt Conference, brought the devotion taken from Eze. 3:10-21. He pointed out that we are watchman and are to warn folks to repent.

The Credentials Committee then gave their partial report. MSC to accept. (Appendix II.) MSC for Rev. Earl Hendrix to be the General Board member to the National. The Committee on Committees Report was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix III.) Dr. Melvin Worthington gave the report from the National Executive Office, and this was accepted as information.

We then sang "Keep On The Firing Line." The Executive Committee then gave their report. MSC to accept item by item. (Appendix IV.) Items I, II, III, were then accepted. Item IV was accepted as amended.

\*MSC to lay on the table until Friday, Item V, dealing with the Constitutional Change that was left out last year due to a printing error. These were dealing with the Youth Camp Board, Children's Home Board, and the Poston Baggett Loan Fund Board.

MSC to accept Item VI as amended. Items VII, and VIII were then accepted as information. We then sang "At Calvary." Rev. Norwood Gibson then presented a Seminar on the State Work of Free Will Baptist. He read from Luke 24:44-49.

\*MSC to lay on the table until Friday, a motion dealing with the number of men on the Children's Home Board. This motion was from the floor.

Rev. Willie Justice led in prayer.

### THURSDAY NIGHT WORSHIP

We opened the service by singing "Revive Us Again." Rev. Clyde Nations led in prayer. The Valley Falls F.W.B. Church Choir presented special music. Chris Parnell rendered a special song. Bro. Trymon Messer brought the message. He read from Matt. 5:14-15, Rev. 1:12-13, 20, and Acts 2:41-47. He pointed out the Kind of Church that existed in the book of Acts, and the kind of Church he would want.

### FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

We opened the service by singing "Praise Him." Rev. Phil Ange led in prayer. Rev. Terry Bailey, from the Central Association brought the devotion. He read from I Thess. 4:13-18, pointing out the fact of Christ return, and the need to get others saved.

Bro. Trymon Messer then presented a Seminar on Soul-Winning and Church Growth. He read from Philemon 1:6, pointing out some ways to present the Gospel to others. We then had a recess.

### FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP

We opened by singing "At Calvary." Chris Parnell presented the special music. Rev. Robbit Scott, from the Eastern Conference, brought the message. He read from Luke 15:11-32, pointing out the need to get God's Word out to the people of our day. Rev. David Carter led in prayer.

### FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

We opened the service by singing "Nothing But The Blood." Rev. James Childers led in prayer. Rev. Harry L. Cooper, from the South Carolina Conference brought the devotion. He read from Exodus 8:25,28, and Exodus 10:7,24 on the subject the "Substitutes of Satan."

The Children's Home Report then was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix V.) The Home Missions Report then was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix VI.) The Poston Baggett Loan Fund Report then was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix VII.) The Promotional Office Report then was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix VIII.)

We then sang "Amazing Grace." The Youth Camp Report then was given. MSC to accept. (Appendix IX.) The Resolutions Committee Report was then given. MSC to accept item by item. Items I, II, III, IV, and V were then adopted. (Appendix X.)

The Minister's Retirement Report then was given. MSC to adopt. (Appendix XI.) The Credentials Committee Report was then given in full. MSC to accept. (Appendix XII.)

\*\*MSC to take off the table Item V, of the State Executive Committee Report. MSC to adopt Item V.

\*\*MSC to take off the table, the motion from the floor, dealing with the number of men on the Children's Home Board. This motion was defeated.

\*\*\*MSC to lay on the table, until the 1985 State Association, the following motion. The Children's Home Board shall consist of six members, one from each Conference, or Association. Each board member shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee for election by the State Body, with one member rotating off each year. No board member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.

### APPENDIX IV

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

- I. We recommend that the 1984 "Pop" Willey Missions Offering be distributed as follows:
  1. 45% to South Carolina foreign missionaries, with the following stipulations.
    - a. Deficit missionary accounts will be given first consideration.
    - b. Insufficient or border-line accounts will be given second consideration.

- c. If none of the above account conditions exist, funds will be divided among all missionary accounts, with each getting a percentage based upon his account balance.
    - d. The Executive Committee will review all missionaries account balances and make the decision for fund distribution as outlined in a, b, and c above.
  2. 5% to the general fund of the Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions Department.
  3. 40% to South Carolina local Conference or Association Home Mission Boards. Contributions from each Conference or Association will be recorded and 40% of the total will be given to their Home Missions Board. In other words, each Conference or association will get back 40% of what they give.
  4. 10% to the National Home Missions Department, with the following stipulations.
    - a. Deficit accounts will receive first consideration.
    - b. Insufficient or border-line accounts will receive second consideration.
    - c. The Executive Committee will review all missionary accounts and make a decision for distribution as outlined in a and b above.
- II. We recommend that the State Association purchase from the Foreign Missions Department the excess "Pop" Willey Missions Offering promotional materials. The funds to be reimbursed to the State Treasury from funds raised through the 1984 "Pop" Willey project.
- III. We recommend that the State Association approve a committee, consisting of the State Executive Committee, the Moderator from each local conference or association and one elected at-large by the body, to give study to the following items. A report and or recommendations to be given to the body at the 1985 convention. The State Promotional Director to be used as a consultant.
  - a. Give study to a plan of financial giving, which would encourage South Carolina F. W. Baptist Churches to give consistent support to all Conference, State and National Ministries. Baptist option of giving and simplicity of participation is to be kept foremost in mind.
  - b. Consider the feasibility of establishing a State Home Missions Board. This would be in addition to the local conference or association boards. The chief considered purpose of this board would be to reach areas of our State where there are no churches or local associations.
- IV. We recommend that a special offering be taken at the Thursday night service to pay for a typewriter for the Promotional Office, and if the Thursday night offering isn't enough to pay for the typewriter, then let the balance be taken out of the State treasurer. A typewriter has already been purchased by the office due to a break down of the present old machine. The machine purchased is a ULTRASONIC I PLUS, by Smith Corona. The need is \$519.00. (Amendment is underscored.)

- V. We recommend that the following additions be made to the State Association Constitution. These additions were intended to be included in the 1983 revision, but due to printing error they were left out from the rough draft.
  1. ARTICLE IX — BOARDS AND DIRECTORS.  
 Section one: Boards with directors.

Item 2 — Poston Bagget Loan Fund Board

Sec. B paragraph a. Composition.

The paragraph now reads: This board shall consist of five members. They shall be elected to serve a five year term each.

With recommended change it will read: This board shall consist of five members. They shall be elected to serve a five year term each, with one position being open for election at each annual session.

(Change is in underscore.)

2. ARTICLE IX

Section One: Boards with Directors

Item 4, Section B, Paragraph b, part 1.

The paragraph now reads: It shall be the responsibility of this board to: 1) Draw up a Constitution and By-Laws stating the purpose of this ministry and the rules that will govern its functions.

With recommended change it will read: It shall be the responsibility of this board to: 1) Draw up a Constitution and By-Laws stating the purpose of the ministry and the rules that will govern its functions, for presentation to the State Association for approval: also to make needed changes in said constitution and By-Laws to keep in in conformity with the purpose and practices of the program. All changes must be approved by the State Body.

3. ARTICLE IX

Section Two

Item 1, Childrens Home Board.

Paragraph B, Part 1

This portion of the paragraph now reads: It shall be the responsibility of this board to: 1) Draw up a Constitution and By-Laws stating the purpose this ministry and the rules that will govern its functions.

With recommended change it will read: It shall be the responsibility of this board to: 1) Draw up a Constitution and By-Laws stating the purpose of the ministry and the rules that will govern its functions, for presentation to the State Association for approval: also to make needed changes in said Constitution and By-Laws to keep it in conformity with the purpose and practices of the ministry. All changes must be approved by the State Body.

(Change by addition is in underscore.)

VI. We recommend that the Promotional Secretary be allowed to take \$300.00 out of the Promotional Office income, and that be a Christmas gift to him, and that he be allowed to do so for the 1983 Christmas that has just passed. The amount was first \$200.00, MSC to change \$200.00 to read \$300.00.

VII. We met in Florence on June 30, 1983 to prepare the program for the 1984 State Meeting.

VIII. We also met in Columbia December 29, 1983 to make final plans for the 1984 State Meeting.
