MEETING WITH THE PALMETTO CONFERENCE At Peace Free Will Baptist Church February 19-20, 1987

APPENDIX V

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We met March 4, 1986, at the Promotional Office. We discussed the following items.

A. We appointed the following men to serve on the Study Committee, Rev. Talmadge Brown-Chairman, Bro. A. C. Allen, Rev. Bobby Bowers, Rev. Joe McKnight, and Bro. Robert Rabon. Rev. Norwood Gibson also was to serve as Ex-Officio of that committee. (1986 is when this body decided for Executive Committee to do so.)

We decided to give the Study Committee a plan to follow, showing the order of importance, etc.

We decided to let our State Moderator meet with the Study Committee the first time they meet, for the purpose of presenting these plans to them.

The Study Committee is to study the following.

determine the needs of our senior people have an adequate retirement plan

how we can best meet these needs

ways to best improve our current ministries

- B. We decided for the clerk to write the local conference moderators asking them to find out what churches are large enough and willing to host future state meetings. This would enable us to plan several years ahead.
- C. We decided for the State Moderator to write local conference moderators asking their conference about giving 300.00 to the Promotional Office to help in getting a computer.
- We met April 7, 1986, at Horsebranch Church. We discussed the following items.
 - A. We met to plan the 1987 State Program.
 - B. We discussed having state stationary printed for the state to use, with the Promotional Office address on it.
 - C. We discussed ways in which the state could pay for the printing of the Informer.

We met the day before the State Association. From that meeting we recommend the following.

- 1. We recommend that each local conference or association represent to this association with an annual fee of \$75.00 per church in its membership. The new funds will be designated for the printing of the Informer.
- 2. We recommend that we send our Promotional Director to Washington, D.C. the week after the State, to represent our State Association at the American Association of Christian Schools.
- 3. We recommend that the \$700.00 the Promotional Office borrowed from the State to be considered a gift to the office that doesn't have to be repaid.
- 4. We recommend that the Promotional Director be given his \$300.00 Christmas gift for 1986.

SUBJECT: Recommended changes in the current State Ministers

Retirement Program.

1. To phase out the current ministers retirement program. While doing so begin the implementation of the proposed new retirement plan as outlined in this report.

Let it be understood clearly that if this recommendation is approved, under no conditions will an eligible applicant be denied enrollment in the current program, nor will a recipient in this program be dropped as long as the recipient survives.

- Recommended procedure to phase out the current retirement plan.
 - A. Ministers who will become sixty (60) years of age after February 28, 1987 will not be eligible to apply for benefits in the current program.
 - B. Ministers under sixty (60) years of age prior to March 1, 1987 will be encouraged to participate in the new proposed retirement plan.
 - C. Special consideration will be given by the retirement board to a case in the event a minister is declared to be disabled, by acceptable authority. during a five year period beginning, March 1, 1987. Consideration will also be given to a ministers widow whose husband is deceased during the period set forth above.

In either case a need for assistance must be established by the board. If a need is determined, the board will be responsible to set the amount of the benefit and administer it.

(Note of explanation) — If a minister enrolls in the new proposed program as presented, and will deposit at least _____ monthly (this can be a combination of the individuals deposit, local church deposit, and or the matching gift deposit) for a period of five (5) years, his benefit at age sixty-five (65) would be _____ monthly. This is _____ more per

month than the monthly benefit in the current program,

3. Proposed new Retirement Plan.

A. We recommend that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptist adopt the Retirement Plan offered by the National Association. and instruct the S. C. Free Will Baptist Retirement Board to offer this plan to our state churches, ministers and Christian workers, to encourage and promote participation in it.

- The National Retirement Plan is available to all ministers, church employees and Christian school employees who are employed for at least 30 hours per week. This would include ministers of music, education, etc.
- 2. It is recommended that The S. C. Ministers Retirement Board offer, as an incentive, a matching gift deposit of \$15.00 per month to each pastor who will deposit \$15.00 or more monthly to his retirement account. To qualify for this benefit the minister must be the pastor of a participating church. (See method of financing to determine which is a participating church.)
- 4. Proposed method of financing the phasing out of the current retirement program, and supplementing the proposed new plan.
 - A. It is recommended that each church in the S. C. State Association give to the S. C. Ministers Retirement Board annually an amount equal to \$2.00 per church member. If every church participated this would generate in excess of \$20,000.00 each year.
 - The cost for retiree benefits in the current program is presently \$7,560.00 annually. This reflects \$45.00 monthly to fourteen recipients. This amount could increase if new recipients are added; however, it will decrease over the coming years as recipients become deceased.
 - 2. The cost for the proposed \$15.00 per month matching gift would depend on the number enrolled in the program. If there is a 60% participation it would amount to \$11,600.00 annually.

There was barely enough to meet the obligations for November. However, the Beaver Creek, Eastern, and Central Associations, along with some S. C. We had a profitable year from the standpoint of being able to obtain almost as much income as we had expenses, which is the first time this had happened in the last four years. Was due to less children, averaging 25 per day, down from 31 of the year before, however this number is more in line with our income and personnel.

We appreciate and thank each church in the state, as well as friends outside of the church, also out of state churches.

The children we have received into the home during the past year, have been a little different than in the past, whereas in the past they were in the home due to a financial condition in the family, but we are receiving more and more children that are a behavior problem at home, due to this we more and more need your prayers and support so we will have the wisdom from God to know how to handle the decisions that needs to be made and thus help these children in a greater way, making our ministry a more needful ministry than ever before.

At the present time we have 4 full time employees, myself, my wife, and Miss Meeks and a cook, Mrs. Hampton. We plan to hire a part time lady to help do some cleaning and domestic work.

We had five children saved during year, with one child on the CTS Tic Tac Toe Team and others participating in the Sword Drill at the Horse Branch Church. We visited about (the kids and staff) 21 Free Will Baptist Churches in S. C. and N. C. during the year, having services with each in the morning. At most of the churches the children sung 2-3 songs and the last 7-8 times the Girl trio sung some also. All children of age except one, attended the S. C. Youth Camp during the summer.

Our goals for the coming year are to help these children have some goals in life, have ambition, have thought for others, to reach them and teach spiritual things and by the grace of God, change these young lives. Please continue to stand with us and support us. We thank God for your valuable part in caring for HIS little ones.

PART TWO: The home owns 83 acres of land, which consists of woods, row crop land, and 11 acres occupied by the home itself for buildings and playground. Value of property is as follows. Main building and contents — \$275,000, Two dormitories and contents — \$140,000. Two recreational buildings and contents — \$80,000. Storage building and outdoor sign — \$16,000, land — \$50,000 for total value of \$555,000.

OTHER ASSETS: 1980 Ford Van, 1969 Chev Bus, 1982 Dodge Pickup, 71 Farmall garden tractor, 69 Ford tractor and Bush Hog.

Most of the vehicles had some repair work done on them during the year, as well as both tractors. Some painting was done, with some of the paint being given to us. In process of painting both dormitories and one recreational building, also plan to put up new curtains in all rooms during the coming year, along with some repair work on inside of some showers and bath rooms. Some new furniture was given by individuals and Uniway of Florence for the dorms. No new air conditioners were installed, but some work was done on all but unit during the year. Three new metal doors were installed in the boys Dormitory and boys Recreational building.
