at First Free Will Baptist Church
Inman, S. C.
February 16 - 17, 1989

The service opened by singing, "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms". The song leader was Wray Newton, and pianist was Gwen Hendrix. These served during the entire session, unless stated otherwise. Dr. Melvin Worthington led in prayer.

The moderator brought his message. (Appendix I). The clerk called the meeting to order. Bro. Charles Tapp gave a very warm welcome, and the clerk gave the response. The delegates then were seated, except for the True Life Conference, which at this time had not reported, but did report and was seated later. The program then was approved. The Committee On Committees were appointed. They were: Billy Vanderford to be chairman, Carroll Alexander, Tommy Snowden, John Suttle, Billy T. Baker, and Everette Tyner. Visitors were also recognized, as well as National Representatives. We had recess.

THURSDAY MORNING WORSHIP

The service opened by singing, "Standing On The Promises". Rev. Ronald Creech led in prayer. The Host Church presented special music. Rev. Tommy Bryson from the Palmetto Conference brought the message. He read from Rev. 2:1-5, and spoke about Getting Back To The Basics. Rev. Ansel Smith led in prayer, and we had dinner.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The service opened by singing, "I Am Resolved". Rev. James Childers led in prayer. Rev. Rick Jagers from the South Carolina Conference brought the devotion. He read from Psalms 100, and talked about our Attitude Being That Of Praise. The Credentials Committee gave a partial report. (Appendix II). MSC to accept. The Committee On Committees gave their report. (Appendix III). MSC to accept. The Executive Committee gave their report. (Appendix IV). MSC to table until Friday, items 2 and 5 of the recommendations. MSC to accept the rest.

The Promotional Office Report was given. (Appendix V). MSC to accept. MSC to let 1990 Pop Willey Offering be the same breakdown as it was for 1989. MSC to let Bro. Carlisle Hanna designate his share to be used to repair the building that was damaged, as well as help the National Pastors of India. MSC to give \$462.50 to Bro. Norwood Gibson because he didn't get last year's retirement. We sang "At Calvary".

The Home Missions Report was given. (Appendix VI). MSC to accept. MSC for the Home Missions Board along with Bro. Earl Hanna to buy the needed land for their church. ~~The 14 acres would be bought for around \$21,000.00. MSC to designate for Orangeburg Mission Land Fund the portion of Pop Willey Offering that was entitled to go to them.~~ The Home Missions Board presented a plan that would help prevent a Free Will Baptist Church from pulling out and becoming a non-Free Will Baptist Church. This included the church or churches that started under the Home Missions Board of our state.

Rev. Carroll Alexander was acting as moderator for a few minutes, so the present moderator could speak on the subject should he desire to. After some discussion the vote was taken. MSC to accept the plan, and for it to be in the contract between the Home Missions Board and the missionary. MSC to amend by placing the word Incorporate after the words Free Will Baptist.

We recessed until supper. Supper was served in the dining hall. Home Missionaries in our local conference/associations were recognized and given certificates. Rev. Norwood Gibson presented a slide presentation showing the churches/missions that were involved. Rev. and Mrs. Sherwood Lee received a plaque for their years of service in Africa.

THURSDAY NIGHT WORSHIP

The service opened with the Host Church Choir singing "Give Him My Heart". Mrs. Sue Berry served as the organist. We sang "Love Lifted Me". Rev. Guy Owens led in prayer. The Host Church presented the special singing. Rev. Talmadge Brown led in the time of testimonies. We took an offering for the Nations couple from Inman, that were going to the country of Africa for several months. Rev. James Raper led in prayer.

The Inman Christian Academy presented a check to Rev. and Mrs. Sherwood Lee to help them buy a new refrigerator. The Host Church presented another song. Rev. Sherwood Lee brought the message. He read from Mark 8:34, and spoke about Discipleship. At the end of the service, ladies from the church presented a basket full of gifts to the missionaries. Rev. Robert Rose dismissed in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The service opened by singing "Jesus Saves". Bro. Ben Stone led in prayer. Rev. James Wilhide from the Beaver Creek Association brought the devotion. He read from Rom. 13:8-10, and talked about Loving As Christ Did. The Minister's Retirement Report was given. (Appendix VII). MSC to accept. MSC for the clerk to send a letter of appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. Robert Edwards, letting them know that we do appreciate them for the years of service they gave to our State Association. The Credentials Committee gave their final report. (Appendix VIII). MSC to accept. The CTS Report was given. (Appendix IX). MSC to accept. The Youth Camp Report was given. (Appendix X). MSC to accept. Words of appreciation were given to Bro. Eddie Riddick for the fine job he has done with Youth Camp. The Children's Home Report was given. (Appendix XI). MSC to accept.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP

The service opened by singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart". Bro. Jack Ward led in prayer. The Host Church presented special music. Rev. Rick Jagers also sang. Rev. John Cody from the True Life Conference brought the message. He read from 2 Timothy 3:1-5, and spoke about Churches That Are Dying. Bro. Ken Brooks led in prayer, and we had dinner.

APPENDIX IV

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

The State Executive Committee met June 20, 1988. At that meeting the following items were taken care of.

1. We chose speakers for the 1989 State Association.
2. We agreed for Bro. Norwood Gibson to be the administrator of the Retirement Village since Bro. Talmadge Brown left the state.
3. We agreed for Bro. Joe McKnight to replace Bro. Brown on the Retirement Village Board.
4. We agreed for Bro. Norwood Gibson to draw up the plans for the State Association General Board.
5. ~~We agreed to give special recognition to the missionaries who were attending the State Association. We would have a meal on Thursday night for those who wanted to attend.~~
We also met December 12, 1988. From the two meetings, we recommend the following.
 1. We recommend that Brother Earl Hendrix be the General Board member to the National. He would replace Bro. Brown.
 2. We recommend that the State Association accept the proposed plan for the General Board.

We also met yesterday, the day before the State Association. From that meeting, we recommend the following.

3. We recommend that we send Bro. Norwood Gibson to Washington next week to represent our State at the American Association of Christian Schools.
4. We recommend that we pay Bro. Norwood Gibson \$462.50 for last year's retirement, due to the fact that some of the conferences not paying their fees retroactive.
5. We recommend that the State use the proposed procedure for the State Treasurer to pay bills, be followed and that it be placed in the Constitution and By-Laws.

GENERAL BOARD PROPOSAL

- I. The Executive Committee of the S. C. State Association of FWB recommends to this body that a General Board be added to its organizational structure and system of government to serve in conjunction with the executive committee.
- II. The General Board will consist of one member from each conference/association in the state association; preferably the member would be the current moderator or assistant moderator of the local conference/association, but not limited to him. Each conference/association will select its general board member and forward his name to the state nominating committee for presentation to the state body for election. Board members are to serve two-year terms. The election will be so arranged to coincide with the election of board directors.

III. Duties of the General Board

1. The general board will convene annually at an appointed time and place the day prior to the beginning of the state association convention.
The state moderator will preside over the sessions.
2. The board will be responsible to hear reports to be given to the state body, which concern the state association's ministry.
The board will approve all reports, recommendations and budgets and recommend them to the state body for its consideration.
3. The board will have opportunity to make inquires and to offer suggestive helps to any standing committee function or board supervised ministry.
4. The general board member will be the representative of his people to the state association. He can convey the feelings and wishes of his people to the executive committee and the general board about matters relating to the state association and its ministries. When needed they can make motions relative to their concerns and if passed by a majority vote of the general board and executive committee the matter will be given to the body for its consideration.
5. In the event an issue arises, calling for action by the state association while out of session, the executive committee can convene the general board for their consultation, input and recommendation for the decision making of the executive committee

APPENDIX V

PROMOTIONAL OFFICE REPORT

IV. Purpose of The General Board

1. To offer a more adequate system of government for future growth.
2. To provide maximum conference/association representation and input to the maintenance and growth of state association affairs and ministries.
3. To provide a safeguard against minority power influence over any segment of the ministry of the state association.

V. IMPLEMENTATION

If this proposal is adopted by the state association, it will be implemented at the 1990 state convention, local conference/association will present the names of their selected board members to the state nominating committee at this time. The first board members will be elected to serve a one-year term, initially. In 1991, they will be elected to a two-year term. This will coincide with the election of board members.

The missionary shall teach the people in the mission church the doctrines of the Free Will Baptist denomination according to the Treatise, will affiliate the church with a local association in South Carolina affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, will lead the mission church to support the programs of the South Carolina State Association, the National Home Missions Department and the National Association of Free Will Baptists, and will name the church a "Free Will Baptist Church." The missionary shall be free to name his church whatever he desires, but the name must include the words "Free Will Baptist". This name must be used on the church signs, all legal documents, and on all church publications and advertisements.

The missionary shall place in the church articles of incorporation, and in the church constitution and by-laws the following dissolution clause:

"Should a condition arise at any time in the future when, for any reason, the church work cannot continue, making it necessary for the church to disband, the church shall either (1) transfer ownership of the church property, buildings, equipment, funds and assets to the Mission Board of the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists, affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, or (2) shall repay the South Carolina State Mission Board and the National Home Missions Board all funds which have been paid in salaries, expenses, property, buildings, and equipment by the South Carolina State Mission Board and the National Home Missions Board for the establishment of the Free Will Baptist Church under this contract."

"Should the church ever choose to sever its affiliation with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, the church shall pay back to the South Carolina State Mission Board and the National Home Missions Board all funds paid by the South Carolina State Mission Board and the National Home Missions Board in salaries, expenses, property, buildings, and equipment as repayment for the funds expended in the establishment of the Free Will Baptist Church under this contract."

The missionary shall provide the South Carolina State Mission Board and the National Home Missions Board with (1) proof of hospital insurance for the missionary family, (2) copies of articles of incorporation of the new church, (3) constitution and by-laws for the new church, (4) and copies of deeds, liens, notes of indebtedness, and other legal documents pertaining to the church property.

APPENDIX XI

CHILDREN'S HOME REPORT

We had a good year in 1988, although we did not serve as many children per day average as the year before, serving an average of 21 children a month, with high of 28 for first 3 months of the year, and a low of 14 in August.

We want to thank each church, person and firm in and out of S. C. who financially helped us take care of these children during the year. We will continue to need your prayers and support in the coming year as we have prospects of receiving several children in January. We pray that every church in the S. C. State Association will help support their home in the coming year.

We experienced growth in contributions during the year, but our expenses increased more than our income did. Total income was \$131,616.91; however \$20,000 of this was from savings and loans, which means income from donations and other sources was \$111,616.91, an increase of 4,969.44 over the previous year; however expenses increased from \$101,820.46 to \$125,959.96, an increase of \$24,139.50. This increase in expenses was caused by having a full staff on payroll about 9 out of the 12 months, plus increases in insurance, and remodeling of buildings and paving roads. Due to space, we are not listing all the improvements that were made, but will give this in a side report. We hope you will visit us soon and see what has been done to the property, which is in number one shape.

The home is presently operated by James B. Rice, Mrs. Jo Anne Rice, Mrs. Linda Presson (girls' dorm), and Pete and Annette Bove (boys' dorm).

Several children were saved during the year, with several of the girls singing in duets and trios. We had nine children to attend youth camp.

The home is located on 83 acres, and used is a main building, two dorms, nursery, recreation building, and two barns. Other property is 1969 bus, 1980 van, 1983 pickup, and two tractors. Property valued at \$625,000.00.

Goals are to complete some further improvements, and to find time to spend more time with the children in recreation and counseling, as well as spending more time on spiritual matters, as well as other goals we are not mentioning in this report.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

1. The person incurring a debt for the state must first check with the treasurer to confirm that funds are available before incurring the bill. This rule is in the State Constitution and By-laws.
2. The person incurring the indebtedness must have the creditor mail to him the invoice and statement. In some cases, an invoice is secured at the time of purchase or the pick-up of the merchandise. In either case, the person incurring the bill must sign the invoice for approval for payment and mail it to the state treasurer. The state treasurer will not pay any bill that is not approved for payment.
3. Persons seeking reimbursements for travel and other approved expenses must submit to the treasurer a written bill detailing the expense items. The form to be submitted can be obtained from the treasurer.
4. The funds received through the state representation fees for printing **The Informer** be given in total sum to the Promotional Office. Let the promotional director be responsible for paying the printing bills as they become due.
