## APPENDIX VII THE FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME FOR CHILDREN

In 1991 we experienced many blessings from the Lord. While most non-profit organizations were experiencing a decline in donations, we had an increase of \$5,531.23 over 1990. We also had an increase of expenses of \$2,269.12. Due to ease of income we had a larger balance at end of 1991, than at end of 1990. A special thank you to every church, friends of the Home and firms in the area who helped make this possible. Everyone one of you are an important part of this ministry and we need your support and prayers during the coming year.

We had from 14 to 24 children, with average of 19 children in the home during the year, down from 22 in 1990, and operated with three fourths of a staff, out of four full time workers and one part time, plus a grass cutting man.

We received many good compliments concerning the beauty of the grounds and upkeep

of the property. During the year, we installed three new heating units, one air conditioning unit, three new outside doors in the boys recreation building and dormitory as well as windows. We painted the ceiling of the dining hall and the walls of the nursery. All the buildings are in good condition. The Home owns a 69 Chevy bus, 80 Ford Van, 83 Dodge Pickup and two tractors.

The goals for the coming year are, 1)find more time to deal with children about spiritual matters 2)employ 1 or 2 workers, 3)recruit more children for the Home and 4)increase our exposure in the area.

We pray that we can continue to have good relations with several firms and businesses in the area. They have helped us very much this past year. We want to express our thanks to the many churches who allowed us to be in your services on Homing Days and Children's Days. One teenage boy committed his life to preach the gospel.

APPENDIX XIV  
Resolution Committee

**RESOLUTION 1:**

Be it resolved, that this State Association go on record as encouraging our churches to purchase Sunday School and CTS Literature from Randall House Publications until the State Promotional Office establishes literature sales, in an effort to help eliminate the current deficit at Randall House.

**RESOLUTION 2: "Human Life Protection Act"**

Whereas, there are 13,000 pre-born babies killed in their mother's womb by abortion each year in South Carolina; and

Whereas, 97% of these are for the reason of convenience and birth control; and

Whereas, this practice constitutes a holocaust against South Carolina's most innocent people; and

Whereas, this practice is a moral outrage against all South Carolina citizens; therefore, Be it resolved that the SC State Association of Free Will Baptists go on public record on February 7, 1992 to strongly support the Human Life Protection Act, H-3652, which would return legal protection to unborn children in South Carolina.

Be it further resolved that we strongly urge every member of the South Carolina General Assembly to support this bill.

Be it further resolved that we will work tirelessly and prayerfully to urge our sister churches and all other South Carolinians to also support such an amendment.

**RESOLUTION 3:**

Whereas, Americans enjoy the precious privilege of participation in the political process through the casting of ballots; and

Whereas, the future direction of our country may be determined by the elections this year;therefore

Be it resolved that we encourage our people to register to vote and through diligent prayer and study of candidates running for office, to support those candidates that they feel best stand for Christianity, Christian ideals and freedom.

**RESOLUTION 4:**

Whereas, the 1991 Digest of Reports of the ministries of the National Association of Free Will Baptists consisted of 104 pages of financial reports; and

Whereas, most departmental reports ranged from seven to twenty one pages of financial information; and

Whereas, many of the financial reports could not be interpreted by the greater number of our Free Will Baptist people, and in some cases it was apparent that the person giving the report could not give a satisfactory explanation to questions raised by delegates; and

Whereas, some National Departments were experiencing large deficits; Therefore, let it be resolved that each National Ministry print a simple financial statement that lay people can interpret. A simplified 1992 financial statement giving the information requested in this resolution could be given through Contact Magazine or by a mail our to the churches. The 1993 simplified financial statements should be a part of the regular national Digest of Reports;

Be it further resolved, that the financial statements contain the following information: 1) The source from which all monies are received and the total amount from each,

2) Itemization of all disbursements, 3) All account balances, giving surplus or deficits, 4) All savings accounts and all assets held in trust, listing the principal amount of each, and the amount of interest earned from these assets; also the disposition of the interest, 5) All loan funds giving the principal amount and the

interest earned; also the disposition of the interest, 6) All indebtedness; the purpose of the debt, rate of interest paid and the balance due;

Be it further resolved, that if a CPA financial statement must be produced for official audit purposes let it be a separate report;

Be it further resolved, that the National Ministry budget include the following information where it applies: 1) The annual salaries, benefits received (including the amount of each) and any other monetary compensation received by the President, Department Heads and/or Directors, 2) The number of full time employees, the number of part time employees (other than staff members), the total amount of wages for each category and the average hourly wage for each category.
