As you may recall we stepped out by faith believing that the Lord wanted us to pay as we built our building and God honored us by sending every dime that we needed to build and furnish our building. We are absolutely debt free. "To God be the glory, great things He has done". We are now about to take another step of faith.

I had a goal of 5 years to be self-supporting but didn't quite make it. But, Lord willing, March 7 will be out sixth anniversary and by God's grace we plan to have our organizational service and become a self-supporting Free Will Baptist Church. I need your prayers. Just like when a baby begins to walk he is shaky and sometimes falls and gets some bumps. I'm sure that it will take awhile for us getting used to being on our own and we may take some bumps. Please, don't let us down. Pray for us! I have confidence in you.

He may be torn between a mother and father who cannot live together and each may want him to live with

APPENDIX XIV

Resolutions Committee

Resolutions 1:

Whereas, the preface to the FWB Treatise states that "...It serves as a guideline for a denominational fellowship, which comprises more than 2,400 churches in 42 states and 14 foreign countries...," and

1. Whereas, there is an ongoing problem in our Foreign Missions Department concerning the teaching and implementation of the Free Will Baptist Church

Covenant,

Be it resolved that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists go on record requesting the Foreign Missions Board to require that every Free Will Baptist missionary teach, preach, practice, and implement the Free Will Baptist Treatise and Church Covenant in their service of missions, as well as churches.

2. Whereas, we recognize the need of Foreign missionaries to translate Free Will Baptist materials into other languages,

Be it resolved that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists go on record that any translation from English to another language that does not retain the accuracy, intent, and position of the Free Will Baptist Treatise and Church Covenant is unacceptable and must not be approved or tolerated.

3. Whereas, our Church Covenant states that "...we...to abstain...from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages...,"

Be it resolved that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists request the Foreign Missions Board to require all Free Will Baptist missionaries to refrain from endorsing, approving, or attending any function or activity of a Free Will Baptist mission church, or an organized and autonomous church, where alcoholic beverages are served in conjunction with the activities or function. This applies to Church functions and activities on Church premises, or other locations.

- 4.Be it resolved that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists send a copy of these resolutions to each Foreign Missions Board member.
- 5.Be it resolved that these resolutions be read by the Resolutions Committee during the business session of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, meeting in Louisville, Kentucky, July 18-22, 1993.
- 6.Be it further resolved that if the Resolutions Committee of the National Association does not handle this, that we instruct our State Moderator to read these resolutions from the floor.

Resolution 2:

Whereas, Bill Clinton and Al Gore were the most pro gay and pro lesbian ticket ever to represent the Democratic Party, and,

Whereas, during their administration there is increasing recognition and legitimacy given to the homosexual lifestyle, and,

Whereas, the Scriptures teach that homosexuality is a serous moral crime, described as uncleanness, vile affections, and being given over to a reprobate mind (Rom. 1:24,26,29),

Be it resolved that the South Carolina State Association reconfirm its stand on the Scriptural teaching regarding homosexuality.
