Visitors and Representatives were recognized. The paritial Credentials Committee report was MSC (Appendix III) [Recess]. The morning service was opened with "It is Well With My Soul" and Prayer. Libby Thornton presented special music, and Robert Rose message was brought from Revelation 1:4-8. [Recess]

Thursday Afternoon - February 27, 1997

After congregational hymn and special music Tommy Snowdon (PC) gave a devotional from John 21:15-21 on "Do you Love Me More Than These". The combined Executive Committee and General Board report was presented (Appendix IV). Items 1,21 and 24 were tabled over night. Item 15 was deleted by substitution as follows: MSC that the State Association pay the \$513 to the Saleeby and Cox Law Firm.

MSC to adopt the South Carolina Foreign Plan of Support(Appendix V)

Item 20 was deleted by substitution as follows: MSC that the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptist request that Allen Gibson vacate the facilities that he now occupies at the State Promotional Office, located at 1705 South Irby Street, Florence, SC as soon as possible. The time period to vacate the facilities is not to exceed the last day of September 1999. [Recess]

Thursday Night

The evening service was opened with congregational singing. A Plaque was presented to Earl Hendrix for his years of service to the State Association as moderator. Another plaque was presented to David Aycock for his years of service as clerk. Ron Moore led in the burning of the note for the Promotional Office property. Then the New Covenant Trio presented special music. A love offering of \$270.00 was taken for the speaker. David Crowe presented a stirring message entitled "How To Keep The Fire Going" from 2 Tm 1:1-6. [Recess]

Friday Morning

The morning session commenced with a congregational song. Brother Keith Bartlett brought a devotional from Ps 112:7. The tabled constitutional change items were brought off the table as follows (These items are part of Appendix IV):

Item 1:

Article IX Section Three 1 b. Duties amended:

- 1. Building: Any structural changes in the building and rental decisions must be approved by the Executive Committee.
- 2. Equipment: Any purchases of equipment in excess of \$500 must be approved by the Executive Committee.
- Hiring: The Promotional Director and Book Store Manager must exercise great care in hiring employees in a Free Will Baptist Church. They must be examples in Christ likeness, church attendance and church involvement.

Item 21:

Article X 1. a. by deletion: for no more than two consecutive meetings per year

Item 24:

Children's Home Constitution: Preamble (Begin a new sentence after the words Free Will Baptist Home for Children, Inc.)

By virtue of the original deed and title, the South Carolina State Association owns the Children's Home. Therefore, the Free Will Baptist Home for Children, Inc. is a subsidiary of the South Carolina State Association.

Children's Home Constitution: Constitution for the Management and Control of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children, Inc., Turbeville, SC (Insert the new paragraph in the very beginning as 1).

MSC that the legal binding opinion presented by Lawrence McIntosh Law Firm be inserted in the minutes (Appendix VI).

APPENDIX IV General Board and Executive Committee Report

MSC to receive the following statement as information:

Since the South Carolina State Association has been established as an incorporation and all records technically belong to the State Association, we offer the following advise to our State ministries and offices:

- 1) maintain accurate and up-to-date records of all business proceedings.
- 2) keep accurate records of every financial transaction with proof of such and maintain all accounts balanced.

April 19, 1996 - Meeting in Florence, SC

- 1. MSC to amend through constitutional change (Article IX Section Three 1 b. Duties) the policies set forth in the 1996 Minutes on page 10, for the Promotional Office and FWB Book Store as follows:
 - a. Building: Any structural changes in the building and rental decisions must be approved by the Executive Committee.
 - b. Equipment: Any purchases of equipment in excess of \$500 must be approved by the Executive Committee.
 - c. Hiring: The Promotional Director and Book Store Manager must exercise great care in hiring employees for the office. They must be active members and in good standing in a Free Will Baptist Church. They must be examples in Christ likeness, church attendance and church involvement.
 - 2. MSC to permit the Promotional Director to place surplus funds in Money Market accounts until the funds are needed.
 - 3. MSC to postpone the Rest Room renovation in the Promotional Office building for the following reasons:
 - a. Insufficient funds in the Promotional Office and the FWB Book Store to carry out this project.
 - b. Uncertainty regarding the legal requirements concerning this project
 - 4. MSC to permit the Promotional Director to replace the present computer with a new 586 system, not to exceed \$2,000.

June 3, 1996 - Florence, SC

- 5. Received copies of the Children's Home deed to the property and the incorporation from the Children's Home Superintendent.
- 6. Requested Laurence McIntosh and Robert Lee to give a legal opinion on the language of the Children's Home deed.

June 8, 1996 - Turbeville., SC

The State moderator, Sherwood Lee and the State clerk, David Aycock, attended the Children's Home board meeting by invitation. This invitation was extended in the spirit of the carried motion at the 1996 State meeting for the Executive Committee and the Children's Home Board to work together to find a resolution to the legal status of the Children's Home. In this meeting, the Children's Home Board went on record stating their desire to comply with the decisions made by the State Association regarding their status: The Children's Home Board went on recorded as stating the following:

The Children's Home Board has received information regarding the incorporation based upon the deed and title of the Children's Home and we are studying and pursuing the request of the State Association and are seeking to comply therewith.

- 9. MSC to receive the Promotional Office report as presented by Ron Moore.
- 10. MSC to give the Promotional Director a \$25/ wk raise to be designated as salary.
- 11. MSC to purchase a filing cabinet for the State Association. This filing cabinet shall be placed at the Promotional Office in order to file and secure documents, records and correspondence for the State Association Executive Committee and State ministries.
- 12. MSC to instruct the State Treasurer to review the financial records of the Promotional Office on a monthly basis in order:

- a. to insure accuracy
- b. to obtain overall familiarity of the financial system
- 13. MSC that after having reviewed the Promotional Office survey results and the overwhelming desire of our leaders across the State to expand the Promotional Office ministries and due to the lack of available space the Executive Committee instructs the moderator and clerk to review with Allen Gibson the status of his rent and space requirements.
- 14. MSC that upon review of the Sidney Prosser Fund agreement, we recommend that the Promotional Office Director track the financial progress of the assets and reports this to the Executive Committee at least semi-annually so that the Executive Committee may execute its responsibility in carrying out the desires of Sidney Prosser.
- 15. MSC that for the sake of our reputation as Free Will Baptists and in order to resolve a long standing debt of \$1,539.00 with the Saleeby and Cox Law Firm and to avoid further problems we, the Executive Committee, recommend that the State Association, the South Carolina Conference and the Central Association each pay one-third (1/3) of this debt.
- 16. MSC to go on record as receiving the legal findings regarding the Children's Home deed and title as information and recognize that the Children's Home desires to meet with the Executive Committee in August or September of 1996 to pursue and resolve the status of the Children's Home.

November 1, 1996 - Florence, SC

- 17. MSC to seek further clarification regarding the language of the Children's Home Title and Deed.
- 18. MSC to receive brother Norwood Gibson's resignation as Book Store Manager to be effective December 31, 1996.
- 19. MSC for the Bookstore to go under the jurisdiction of the Promotional Office December 31, 1996 in compliance with the statement in the 1996 State Association minutes (p.9) which reads as follows:

...When the establishment of the book store is satisfactorily completed Brother Norwood will resign from this position (Book Store Manager) and the book store will be placed under the supervision of the Promotional Office and its Director.

November 19, 1996 - Florence, SC

20. MSC for the State Association Executive Committee to recommend to the State Association that the State Association take full occupancy of it's building to be effective June 1, 1997.

January 23, 1997 - Florence, SC

- 21. MSC to amend the Constitution by deleting the following statement: (Article X 1. a.) for no more than two consecutive meetings per year.
- 22. MSC to recommend the South Carolina Foreign Mission Plan of Support.
- 23. MSC to receive the 1996 Promotional Office report as recorded in the Digest of Reports.
- 24. MSC to recommend amending the Children's Home Constitution by insertion as follows:

Preamble. Begin a new sentence after the words Free Will Baptist Home for Children, Inc.

By virtue of the original deed and title, the Children's Home is a subsidiary of the South Carolina State Association. Therefore, the South Carolina State Association owns the Children's Home.

Constitution for the Management and Control of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children, Inc. Turbeville, SC. Insert the new paragraph in the very beginning as 1.

By virtue of the original deed and title, the Children's Home board members are Trustees (supervisors) of that which the State Association owns. All the assets of the Children's Home are held in trust by the Children's Home board to manage those assets according to the policies and procedures of the State Association.

25. MSC that the State Association Digest of Reports shall only include reports from the State ministries and offices. National ministries reports may be distributed during the State Association.

APPENDIX V

South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support

WHAT IS THE SOUTH CAROLINA FOREIGN MISSIONS PLAN OF SUPPORT?

This is a plan designed to underwrite the support of foreign missionaries from South Carolina by transferring the responsibility of raising support from the missionary to the local church. Through this plan South Carolina churches can accomplish together what no one church could do alone. It is a plan that respects the right of individuals and churches to designate gifts to the missionaries of

their choice. It is a plan that will get missionaries to the field more quickly, more economically, and more refreshed and ready to begin ministry than any method of support Free Will Baptists have ever used. It is a plan that will promote strong personal ties between our missionaries and the churches throughout South Carolina. Most importantly, is a plan that will work!

HOW WILL THIS PLAN HELP OUR SOUTH CAROLINA FOREIGN MISSIONARIES?

- 2. It will change the focus of furlough from fund raising to ministry. Many have been deeply grieved over the excessive travel and exhausting demands that furloughing missionaries must endure. Virtually every aspect of the missionary's life takes a back seat to the urgency of raising funds for the next term. Family life, rest, study, and time spent with family and friends all suffer. South Carolina missionaries will be able to look forward to coming home for furlough, knowing that their support is stable. Deputation services in our churches can emphasize ministry reports, prayer requests and sharing from God's Word rather than raising funds for needy accounts.
- 3. It will minimize the missionary's time away from the field. Imagine the average Free Will Baptist Church in South Carolina having to send their pastor and family overseas every four years to spend up to two years raising money before they can return and resume their ministry. Even though our mission works need the stability of missionary leadership, that is what happens to them. Some missionaries are having to spend longer and longer furloughs erasing larger and larger deficits. Others have been called home mid-term because of plummeting support levels. With the South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support, our missionaries can plan to return to the mission field on schedule, fresh and ready to resume their ministry.
- 4. It will lower the missionary budget. Deputation work is expensive. Most missionaries find that every \$3.00 of support cost \$1.00 to raise. No wonder it takes so long to get back to the field! The South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support will reduce the extensive travel of our missionaries, saving thousands of dollars every furlough. In addition, each missionary is required to raise approximately 10% more support than their actual budget needs because of the track record of Free Will Baptist support. After the first year of a missionary's term, faith promise support begins to fall off dramatically. Out of sight, out of mind, perhaps. This plan will enable missionaries from our State to reduce the amount of their budget because the support will be stable throughout their entire term.
- 5. It will speed newly appointed missionaries to their field of service. It recent years it has taken nearly two years of deputation work by newly appointed missionaries to raise the necessary support before being allowed to depart for language school. With the South Carolina Plan, a missionary couple will be able to move ahead with their plans to leave for the field, knowing that

South Carolina Free Will Baptists are committed to underwriting their support. Their deputation services can focus on the nature of their future ministry, developing prayer partners, and sharing from God's Word.

WHO QUALIFIES FOR SUPPORT UNDER THE SOUTH CAROLINA PLAN?

- 1. The missionary must be appointed by and be in good standing with the Foreign Missions Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 2. The missionary must have strong residency ties to South Carolina Free Will Baptists.

It is understood that the State Association will approve the recommendations for support level on an annual basis while in regular session. It is also understood that should a missionary resign or be dismissed by the Foreign Missions Board, funding will be discontinued effective with the termination date of the missionary's employment.

HOW DOES THE SOUTH CAROLINA FOREIGN MISSIONS PLAN OF SUPPORT WORK?

The plan is based on the share concept. The procedure used to determine the funds necessary to support South Carolina missionaries and the amount of each share is as follows:

- 1. The State Association will name the missionaries to be included in the plan and the extent to which their support will be underwritten.
 - a. A single missionary with strong residency ties to South Carolina and no other significant base of support could be underwritten for up to 100%.
 - b. A missionary couple with strong residency ties to the state and no other significant base of support could be underwritten for up to 100%.
 - c. A missionary couple where one spouse has a strong residency ties to the state could be underwritten for up to 50%.
 - d. A missionary couple where one spouse has residency ties to the state yet receives significant support from a third state could be underwritten up to 25%.
 - e. The State Association may also take special circumstances into consideration and adjust the support level upward or downward.
- 2. Once the level of annual support needed for South Carolina missionaries is determined, the figure will be divided into 2000 shares (Example: a \$264,000 annual budget would equal \$132.00 per share, or just \$11.00 per month).
- Individuals, groups, churches and associations will be challenged to adopt one
 or more annual shares of support. When all 2000 shares have been
 underwritten, South Carolina will have achieved full support for its
 missionaries.

HOW IS DESIGNATED GIVING AN INTEGRAL PART OF THIS PLAN?

The South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support honors the right of individuals and churches to designate their shares by giving them two choices:

- The shares may be designated to individual missionaries adopted by the State Association. Those shares will be applied directly to that missionary's budget needs.
- 2. The shares may be designated to the South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support. Those shares will be distributed according to the percentages allocated by the State Association while in regular session.

Please be assured that your designated gifts will always be honored. No fees will be imposed for the promotion and maintenance of the South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support by the State Office or the South Carolina Foreign Missions Task Force. Every missionary will receive every penny of every share that is designated for his/her account.

WHO ARE OUR SOUTH CAROLINA MISSIONARIES AND HOW MUCH DO WE NEED TO RAISE?

South Carolina career missionaries for 1997 include the Jim Cowarts, Mirial Gainer, the Carlisle Hannas, the Tim Johnsons, and the Bobby Pooles. Their budget needs for 1997 are listed below.

To fully underwrite the \$222,230.00 budget need of South Carolina missionaries for 1997, a total of 1,684 shares will have to be adopted by individuals and churches across the state. To meet their budget needs in 2000, all 2000 shares will have to be adopted. Thus, the goal of the plan is "2000 shares by the year 2000!"

WHAT ABOUT MISSIONARIES THAT ARE NOT ADOPTED BY SOUTH CAROLINA?

Though one may want to re-evaluate their giving to all missionaries, do not abruptly drop any missionary's support. If everyone did this, some missionary accounts would suffer. A few missionaries may need your continued support. Others may have residency ties to States that are adopting similar plans. If you are supporting a missionary from one of those States, you may not need to worry about their account. In any case, before you make a decision to drop a missionary, you are invited to contact the Promotional Office so you can receive up-to-date information about their account needs. To continue your support for non-South Carolina missionaries, all you need to do is designate your gifts to them as in the past.

WILL THE SOUTH CAROLINA FOREIGN MISSIONS PLAN OF SUPPORT WORK?

Yes! The plan will work if South Carolina Free Will Baptists put their minds to it. Below are some ideas that can help your church raise funds to purchase shares in the plan.

- 1. Include several shares in the church budget.
- 2. Get individuals in the church to pledge to underwrite one or more shares.

- 3. Designate the Wednesday night offerings to the plan.
- 4. Have offerings one Sunday each month designated to underwrite the plan.
- 5. Participate in the annual Foreign Missions Offering in April.
- 6. Sunday School classes, the Children's Church, the youth group, the senior saints, etc. could adopt one or more shares.
- Local, district, and state chapters of the WNAC could underwrite a number of shares.

These are only suggestions. It will be up to individual churches to determine what methods work best for them. Please share your ideas with the Promotional Office so we can pass them on to others!

WHAT WILL IT TAKE FOR THIS PLAN TO SUCCEED?

- 1. **Present supporters** of South Carolina foreign missionaries should send their support through the Promotional Office, designated either to specific missionaries or to the Plan of Support as a whole.
- 2. Pastors must lead their churches in the support of our missionaries through this plan.
- 3. Churches must take responsibility for their fair share of the support needed by our missionaries.
- 4. Church members must be willing to give cheerfully and sacrificially to see the lost reached for Christ.
- 5. God will have to bless this endeavor, to give the plan favor in the hearts of our people, and to provide the financial resources required to support our missionaries overseas.

HOW WILL THE PLAN BE ADMINISTERED?

It will be administered through the Promotional Office under the oversight of the Executive Committee. A Foreign Missions Task Force will be established to work with the Promotional Director in evaluating the effectiveness of the plan, promoting the plan across the State, and recommending changes in the plan to the State Association. The Promotional Director will chair the Task Force and serve with one member from each of the associations affiliated with the State. The moderator of the State Association and the president of the State WNAC will serve as members ex-officio.

The South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support is a modified version of the Arkansas A.C.T.S. 1:8 Plan and the Missouri Show-Me Plan.

Re: Free Will Baptist Children's Home

Dear Reverend Lee:

Our firm has been retained to review the Article of Incorporation of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home ("Children's Home"), the Deed to the Children's Home real property ("Property") and to make recommendations with regard to whether the Children's Home should continue to maintain its incorporation.

A corporation is an entity which is created by operation of law when articles of incorporation are filed with the Secretary of State. Just as any individual, a corporation can own property, sell assets, hire employees, conduct business, be sued, sue, and is required to pay taxes. Unless the corporation is organized as a statutory close corporation, it has a board of directors who direct its affairs.

Directors have the authority over the assets and management of the corporation. It is their job to tend to or hire individuals to tend to the day to day operations of the corporation. It should be kept in mind that while directors have authority over the assets of the corporation, they do not own the assets; ownership is vested in the corporation.

Corporations are created for a number of reasons but the chief reason is to insure limited liability. A corporation can be sued. If an individual is sued his or her

personal assets are in jeopardy since any amount recovered will be paid out of his or her personal assets. Corporations serve as a shield to personal assets but all of the corporations assets are at risk. The only way personal assets of the owners of a corporation can be reached is for it to be proven that the corporation is a sham, in legal terms this is called piercing the corporation veil.

One corporation can own and control another corporation. This is seen in cases of big corporations which own subsidiaries. There are some subsidiaries which are better known than their parent corporation. A subsidiary can have its own directors who manage its affairs but be controlled by the parent corporation by virtue of the parent corporation having control over who is on the board of directors. This is the case with regard to the South Carolina Association ("State Association") and the Children's Home. While the Children's Home has its own board of director's those directors are appointed by the State Association and therefore control of the Children's Home rests with the State Association.

This brings us to the deed from Mary I. Turbeville to George C. Vause, Trustee, et. al. This is the deed which conveyed title to the Children's Home. While this deed was signed in 1939, it is still valid and the terms under which Ms. Turbeville made the conveyance and obligations she imposed on the land still exist and are binding.

This property was originally conveyed to George C. Vause, William E. Floyd, R. Clarence Baggett, E. Picket Kirby, Miller H. Mallette, John T. Lee, and Walker Miles as trustees. The term as trustees is very significant. It tells us that there exists a trust and that the title to the land does not belong to these individuals in their individual capacity but is being held by them for the benefit of another.

The deed contains the term "IN TRUST"; this is where the trust was established by Ms. Turbeville which the trustees listed above manage. A trust is established for the benefit of another person. All of a third person who is known as the beneficiary. Also, when a trust is created, the person creating the trust, Ms. Turbeville, will set out its purpose and how it is to be managed. This is all contained in the deed in the section designated "IN TRUST".

The property is being held for the benefit of the Annual Conference of the Free Will Baptist Church of South Carolina ("State Association"). The purpose for which Ms. Turbeville established the trust was to provide land for an orphanage which is the Children's Home. Critical to her stated purpose is that she provided that the land could also be used for any other purpose for which the State Association determined. Therefore, if the Property is to be used for any other purpose other than an orphanage, it must be decided by the State Association.

Ms. Turbeville is also recognized that the trustees were not the owners of the Property and that there would be successor trustees. She provided that the trustees

would hold title to the Property for their "term". This means that they are to hold title for the benefit of the State Association for the duration of their appointment as trustees. Ms. Turbeville provided that the trustees were to be appointed by the State Association and "have such powers" as delegated to them by the State Association. In this sentence, Ms. Turbeville clearly places the authority over the land in the hands of the State Association by virtue of their having the authority to appoint the trustees and to give or take away the trustees authority.

As a corporation, the Children's Home has all of the benefits and liabilities of an individual, one of which is the ability to be sued. If sued, the only assets which can be reached are the assets of the Children's Home. In this case, the Property can not be reached because it does not belong to the Children's Home but is being held in trust for the State Association. Also, the Property must be used for an orphanage, which is the mission of the Children's Home. This mission can only be changed by the State Association not the board of directors of the Children's Home. For this reason I would recommend that the Children's Home retain its incorporation. The Children's Home will continue to enjoy its limited ability while it continues to carry out its mission and as trustees continue to manage the Property on behalf of the State Association.

1996 Annual Report Promotional Office / Bookstore

Long term goal: to develop leadership training ministries that help our churches grow and fulfill Christ's command to make disciples of all nations. These ministries will follow two lines of development: (1) Providing resources through the bookstore / resource center, and (2) Providing training through workshops and seminars. Target ministries include: Evangelism, Children's Ministries, Discipleship, Youth, Missions Outreach, Adult Ministries, Sunday School, and Music

Role of Bookstore: Rather than establishing a traditional bookstore (of which there are already three in Florence), our bookstore would become more of a bookstore / resource center designed to meet specific needs of Free Will Baptist Churches, their pastors, leaders, workers and laity. We will, therefore...

- 1. Emphasize traditional sales of Bibles, commentaries, literature, devotional and inspiration books, etc.;
- 2. Place special emphasis on "how to" materials for those engaged in ministry;
- 3. Establish an extensive cassette and video library; and
- 4. Develop an exhaustive resource filing system on all subjects related to church life and ministry.

Bookstore manager job description:

- 1. Have general oversight of the bookstore operations;
- 2. Develop and maintain the Resource Center;
- 3. Represent the bookstore at various meetings, activities and functions around the state;
- 4. Assist in the development, organization and implementation of workshops and seminars;
- 5. Perform other duties as delegated by the director.

Policies Relative to Hiring a New Bookstore Manager—1996 Minutes of the South Carolina State Association

Page 9: "Brother Norwood Gibson will remain in full control of the Free Will Baptist Bookstore while the establishment of the ministry continues. He will be accountable to the State Executive Committee. When the establishment of the bookstore is satisfactorily completed, Brother Norwood will resign from this position and the bookstore will be placed under the supervision of the Promotional Office and its director."

Page 10: "Hiring of Employees: The Promotional Director must exercise great care in hiring employees for the office. They must be active members and in good standing in a Free Will Baptist Church. They must be examples in Christlikeness, church attendance and church involvement."

Accountability: In accordance with the above policies, the bookstore manager will report directly to and serve at the discretion of the Promotional Office director. Out of respect for the South Carolina State Association and in recognition that the bookstore's purpose is to serve you, we are happy to present to you Eddie Hobbs as our choice for your new bookstore manager, being confident that you will receive him with open arms and support him with your prayers.

Salary: It must be understood by all that the Promotional Office and the bookstore are faith ministries. As with the director, the salary of the bookstore manager is provided through the faithfulness of God's people and profits gained through the bookstore. And, as with the director, the Executive Committee will

approve the bookstore manager's salary and benefit package in accordance with the annual budget adopted by the South Carolina State Association. We propose an initial weekly salary of \$365 (\$18,980 annually) plus health insurance, five percent retirement and a \$250 Christmas bonus.

In such cases, the discounts would be appropriately adjusted. For example, if an item has a 20% profit margin, it could only be discounted a maximum of 10%.
