PROMOTIONAL OFFICE AND BOOKSTORE

Resolutions Committee Report

1. Whereas, There has been a desire in our State Association for some time now for seminars to be held at various locations in our state for the purpose of educating and informing our pastors and interested lay people on the topics of:

1. The pastor's taxes
2. The FWB Retirement and Insurance program
3. Legal issues facing the church
4. FWB doctrine and theology
5. Sunday School growth and development

Therefore, be it resolved that this State Association requests that the Promotional Office of the South Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist coordinate, schedule, promote, and plan seminars taught by qualified Free Will Baptist representatives on the afore mentioned subjects.

Whereas, this should be an on going program in our state; therefore, be it resolved that at least 2 seminars be held within our state work before our next State Association meeting.

2. Wherefore there are many Free Will Baptist ordained ministers in our state who are no longer pastors, but are in good standing with their conferences,

Be it resolved that the SC State Promotional Office include these ministers on all mailings from our Promotional Office.

3. Whereas, in times past, problems have arisen over credentials of pastors between the conferences. To help end or stop future problems, we recommend that the presbytery/ordaining boards for each conference work together and communicate in the area of pastors credentials to stop any future problems.

Be it resolved that we strongly urge communication between boards.

4. Whereas, the confessed immoral acts of President William Jefferson Clinton has disgraced the respect for that high office, and

Whereas, it sets a bad example for our youth and all citizens of our country, and

Whereas, it violates the teachings and principles of God's Holy Word as found in Exodus 20:14 and Exodus 20:16.

Therefore, be it resolved that we stand against such conduct as sin, and

Be it resolved that we send a copy of this resolution to our US Senators, and US Congressmen and President William Jefferson Clinton. Be it further resolved that we now pray for President and Mrs. Clinton and Chelsea and all our public leaders.

5. Whereas gambling challenges the Biblical command concerning loyalty to God (Ex. 20:3).

Gambling places materialistic gain above loyalty to God. Obedience to God excludes the desire for chance or fate to direct our lives.

And whereas gambling challenges the Biblical teaching about greed and covetousness (Prov. 1:19; Matthew 6:24-30; Luke 12:15). An insatiable appetite to gain is contrary to scripture;

And whereas gambling challenges the Biblical teaching regarding possessions (Ps. 21:1; Matthew 6:21; I Cor. 10:26). The Bible reveals that all property and possessions are provided by God, and we are accountable for their proper use;

And whereas gambling challenges the Christian view of the state (Rom. 13:4-7). Government is to be "God's servant to do you good." A government that promotes and depends upon gambling revenues can hardly be considered a servant of God;

And whereas gambling disregards the Biblical teaching concerning care for weaker brothers (Ps. 10:2; I Cor. 8:1). Exploiting others' weaknesses and compulsions for gain is contrary to Scripture;

And whereas gambling gives people false hope (Matthew 7:9). False hope is a cruel joke that disappoints and destroys;

And whereas there is a growing sentiment in favor of various forms of gambling by our State Legislature;

And whereas the sentiment is growing in our state as evidenced by 31,000 poker machines, equaling one per hundred persons, and one per one square miles;

And whereas, according to Focus on the Family, research shows that gambling addiction often causes bankruptcy, crime, divorce, and even suicide;

Be it therefore resolved that this Association go on record as opposing all forms of gambling, including lotteries, video poker, bingo halls, etc.;

And be it further resolved that we oppose the use of these vices as a source of revenue for our State;

And be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to our Governor and all members of the SC State Legislature,

And be it further resolved that we request each of our churches to gather signed petitions of our Biblical convictions against such gain for state revenue and send them to our now Governor Jim Hodge's.

And be it further resolved that we strongly urge our churches to take a strong moral stand against this issue.

6. Be it resolved that we give the Beaver Creek Association and the New Life FWB Church a rising vote of thanks for their generous hospitality in hosting this SC FWB State Association meeting.
