APPENDIX II

YOUTH CAMP BOARD REPORT

Another year has passed and a new one is upon us. That means we must rededicate ourselves to taking advantage of every opportunity afforded us to impact our most valuable resource. Your camp board does desire to make a difference in the lives of our young people through this ministry. Junior camp was held July 5-9. This was nearly a month earlier than usual, and unfortunately, did cause some confusion. Added to that

was the fact that it came on the heels of a major holiday when many took vacations. But, as we reported last year, we knew that going in. It was a one-time change of date to help WOW with a problem in their scheduling. And we were down some in attendance. We only had 119 campers that week, but that didn't seem to discourage the Lord any! {Nor us, for that matter!} We had a dedicated staff and wonderful boys and girls! One of our board members, Bro. B.L. Efird taught our afternoon classes. Rev. Todd Smith preached our morning and evening services. We believe the Lord used them both to speak to hearts. *24 Juniors made decisions: 10 salvation; 13 rededication; 1 service {young boy feels God may be calling him to preach}

Teen camp was held August 2-6. Though our junior camp attendance was down 15-20%, teen camp attendance was up over 20% {74 campers}. Pastor Buddy Seay was our evangelist and Shiloh Hackett taught our afternoon classes. We only recorded three salvation decisions during that week {as far as the actual cards turned in}, but on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights we had 50 or more teens at the altar dedicating their lives to the Lord! Thursday evening was the highlight of teen camp as we had a worship service of well over two hours. For over an hour our teens gave testimonies and sang praises to Jesus!

We made one major financial purchase -- at least it seemed that way to us! After several years of struggling with faulty sound equipment, we decided to purchase our own PA system. We bought components that were small and portable and put the system together ourselves. We invested around \$400.00 in a 100 watt amplifier, speakers, microphone and the necessary cables. It should serve us well for years.

Our location has not changed - we're still at WOW in Patrick. Our costs are the same as last year. Please note the following breakdown. It applies to both weeks.

Payment postmarked after June 4 -- \$91.00

As of the due date of this report, we do not have confirmation on a Junior

Camp evangelist. Our speaker for Teen Week will be Rev. David Crowe with the National Home Missions Department.

I want to say again how well this board functions. You have elected wonderful men to serve in this ministry. Each one gives of himself and his time to make camp possible. Most are "full-time" Christian workers, and we are grateful for the unselfish way their churches allow them to come and serve our state in this way. These men are: Mike Bishop, Richard Conyers, Marty Cox, B.L. Efird and Brian Tolliver.

We appreciate the support and encouragement we receive. Our hearts are in this ministry. We would love to see more pastors and churches participate by sending us campers. Your camp board members are willing to assist you in any way we can. Thank you for the privilege of serving and giving me the opportunity of having a part in the lives of South Carolina young people! Donors and recipients were randomly selected and contacted to verify the accuracy of those records.

The audit was conducted according to accepted auditing standards. Bro. Moore furnished me with complete financial records for the period of January through October of 1999. Donors and recipients were randomly selected and contacted to verify the accuracy of those records.

The results of the audit indicate that all funds channeled through the Plan

of Support have been received, funds designated for a specific account or a recipient have been received, . It is my opinion that the Plan of Support has been administered in a professional and responsible manner.

1999 Promotional Office Report
Ron Moore

I would like to begin this report by expressing my thanks for the opportunity to serve you and the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists during the past four years. It has been a joy and privilege to meet and work with so many of you. With your support and prayers, we have seen the Promotional Office ministry grow from annual deficits and a cramped, one-room operation to a fully-funded, multi-room facility. We have also witnessed the bookstore erase its deficits and grow into a self-supporting, full-service ministry.

Last year was a good year for the Promotional Office and bookstore, capping four years of growth in several different areas. The renovation project has all but been completed. The bookstore now has twice as much floor space and the Promotional Office has more than quadrupled in size. The facilities now include separate offices for both the director and bookstore manager, a conference room, a work/break room, and two restrooms. Sales for the bookstore topped \$225,000 and churches gave \$769,588.52 to outside ministries through the Promotional Office (a 66.72% increase from 1996!). When other sources of income are considered, over \$1,000,000 passed through these ministries in 1999! Gifts to the South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support have grow from \$137,701.98 in 1996 to \$238,900.12 in 1999 – that's a 73.5% increase in just three years. For the third consecutive year, we gather for the annual State Association rejoicing that no South Carolina Missionary (home or foreign) has a deficit account! Thank you for helping to make

all this possible.

A few additional remarks are necessary concerning the South Carolina Foreign Missions Plan of Support. As you recall, the David Aycocks were budgeted to share in the State's mission plan this year (2000). When we add the \$10,417.38 that came through the office designated for their account in 1999 (which was not counted as part of the plan), the total raised for South Carolina foreign missionaries in 1999 was \$249,317.38, just \$14,682.62 short of meeting our target goal for the year 2000 ("2000 in 2000" – that is, 2,000 shares @ \$132 a share = \$264,000). Though giving to the SC Foreign Missions Plan has increased by 73.5% over the past three years, most of it came during the first two years of the plan. The increase from 1998 to 1999 was 12.1%, which is still good. Another 12.1% increase in 2000 (using the adjusted \$249,317 figure) would generate an additional \$30,167.40, which would exceed the goal and go a long way in underwriting another missionary family.

A question that is asked from time to time is, "How has the SC mission plan impacted other foreign missions giving?" We are happy to report that though giving to non-South Carolina missionaries has fluctuated some, there has been an overall increase during the past three years. In 1999, for example, over \$88,000 went to foreign missionaries and ministries not covered in the plan.

The tremendous success of South Carolina's giving to ministries at home and abroad is a reflection of your commitment and faithfulness. I will always rejoice because of having had the privilege of serving you and facilitating your giving worldwide. Speaking of which, the following plaques will be given during the Thursday evening service for excellence in giving through the Promotional Office:

- #1 in overall giving
- #1 in giving to the Promotional Office
- #1 in giving to the Children's Home
- #1 in giving to Home Missions
- #1 in giving to Foreign Missions
- #1 Auxiliary in giving

**Landmark Report - 2/2000
To SC State Home Mission Board**

It is hard to believe that another year has gone and we are now beginning a new millennium! The future looks good as we roll into the year 2000. Our attendance and offerings held up good through the end of the year. We worked hard on our building trying to get as much done as possible before the end of the year. We started construction on our building last February and soon we will see it to completion. The task has not been easy but we are committed to establishing and building a Free Will Baptist Church in Anderson that will be a testimony of what God can do.

We have had to make physical, financial, and spiritual sacrifices. God appointed us to be the leaders and we have set the example for our people to follow. We have tried to rush things along with the building because we didn't want our people to get discouraged. God decreed that the building would be built in His time and in His way, so we have had to wait on Him. We have encountered nearly every snag possible in trying to advance things along. For example, it took us two months to get someone to hang and finish the sheet rock in the sanctuary. We hung the classrooms and because we did the "easy work", two crews who came to hang it walked off and wouldn't do the job. The building industry in the upstate of SC is booming and contractors can name their price and select their jobs.

Finally, the sheet rock is done, the painting is done. The interior doors are hung. They had to be special ordered because the corridor was designed with 6" walls. Things cost so much it is mind staggering. The interior doors which have to be solid core, fire rated with 6 3/4 inch jambs are costing us \$320.00 each. We are going to need to raise about \$40,000.00 more to complete the building. We are committed to raising at least \$15,000.00 of this within our own church. God has assured us that He will provide. Please pray with us because the only thing holding us up now is the finances.

We have put in some long and hard hours--doing a lot of the work during the day and working with the men at night. God has given us strength and blessed the church to grow and become stronger. Recently, we started a Young Adult Sunday School Class and the attendance is already averaging 12-14. We have seen souls saved and new members added to the church. Our attendance averaged 92 during December and our offerings averaged \$1,428.27.

We hope to complete the building by Easter. When we are finished we will have about \$250,000.00 in a building that most contractors say could not have been built for less than \$400,000.00. The next step will be trim work, carpet then hardware and plumbing fixtures. Again, please pray for us. We

The Historical Commission has been given the responsibility of researching, documenting and preserving information relating to the origin, growth and structure of this State Association.

The primary focus of this past year has been to locate sources of information that would provide an accurate understanding of the events and personalities that have built our heritage. We have obtained copies of

all known official Minutes of the South Carolina Conference from the 1800's. We have also contacted a number of historians and writers who have studied Free Will Baptist movements in South Carolina and other states. In addition, we have visited sites where Free Will Baptist churches once stood. Because the early years of the Free Will Baptist movement were confined to a few counties in the Pee Dee region of the state, most of the research has been conducted there.

The goals for 2000 are to expand the scope of research to other parts of the state. One primary objective is to encourage each local conference/association to compile a written history. Another objective is to fill the gaps in our collection of official records.

APPENDIX XVII

Resolutions Submitted by the Resolutions Committee South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists at White Savannah Free Will Baptist Church February 25, 2000

1. Whereas promiscuity and violence continue to be propagated by liberal society through numerous channels of entertainment, literature, and "post modernistic" education, be it resolved that we affirm our stand for moral purity, the sanctity of human life, and the worth of the human soul as supported by Scripture (Genesis 1:26; Leviticus 11:44,45; Romans 12:1,2; I Corinthians 1:2; Ephesians 4:30; 5:25-27; Colossians 1:21,22; I Thessalonians 4:3-8; II Timothy 1:9). Be it further resolved that we refrain from all intities that would promote such unbridled behavior and jeopardize a holy standard of Christian living.
2. Whereas homosexuality is an abomination contrary to the principles of morality as stated in Leviticus 20:13 and Romans 1:26-27, and whereas "same-sex marriage" is an abomination contrary to God's clearly defined order of the family (Genesis 1:27-28; 2:23-25), and whereas there is a consensus among groups in our nation to promote acceptance, tolerance, and legalization of the same, be it resolved that we stand in opposition

to this consensus, be it the government, the military, the schools, the work force, or private residences of our American society.

3. Whereas gambling contradicts the Biblical teaching regarding the stewardship of possessions (Psalm 21:1; Proverbs 13:11; Matthew 6:21; I Corinthians 10:26), and whereas the Bible reveals that all property and possessions are provided by God and that we are accountable for their proper use; Therefore be it resolved that we reaffirm our stand against any and all forms of gambling, be it video poker, a state lottery, gambling boats, and other games of chance which cause one to put at risk their possessions provided by God. Be it further resolved that we commend the efforts of Free Will Baptist groups in our state who have cooperated with other groups to defeat the legality of video poker and encourage future cooperation toward the defeat of a potential state lottery or any other form of gambling.

4. Whereas abortion on demand, partial birth abortion, or any formality of "pro-choice" is in distinct contradiction to Biblical teaching (Exodus 20:13; Genesis 9:6; Leviticus 24: 17, 21b), and whereas we are in an election year to decide the office of Presidency of our United States, be it resolved that our support for candidates of said office and any other of our government be reserved for those who hold nothing less than a solid "pro-life" agenda.

5. Whereas the members of the White Savannah Free Will Baptist Church have so graciously opened their facilities and have been so gracious a host in assisting the needs of this State Association meeting, be it resolved that we the State Association give a rising vote of thanks for their labors of love.

6. Whereas the efforts of relocating and building a new campus for Free Will Baptist Bible College has been graciously assisted by Bob Schill and his group of architects for the proper design and tremendous savings financially to our denomination, be it resolved that we the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptist send a word of appreciation to him and his group.
