## **74<sup>th</sup> Annual SCFWB State Meeting**



On February 25<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> the Seventy Fourth annual session of the SCFWB State Meeting took place at the Gilead FWB Church in Lake City. The Convention saw good crowds every day and the Thursday evening crowd (*featured here*) was very well attended also. This year at the State Meeting, the theme was “*The Whole Church, Taking The Whole*

*Gospel, To The Whole World*”. The featured speakers this year were Rev. Don Hanna who shared about the difficulties and hardships associated with following Christ, especially on the mission field. He related personal stories of what it was like for Bro. Carlisle and family in India.



The Thursday evening speaker was Rev. Carlisle Hanna. He spoke about the work in India, tracing Free Will Baptist roots all the back to the 1800's Friday morning our speak was Rev. Stanley Rajkumar, and brought a powerful message out of Romans on being not ashamed of the Gospel. Bro Stanley spent the month of February in South Carolina and spoke in many churches during that time. He is the pastor of the

Hanna Free will Baptist Church in South India, and the director of the Volena Wilson Bible Institute.



This year marked 65 years since the SCFWB State Association endorsed Bro. Carlisle Hanna to be their missionary in India. This anniversary prompted the Executive Board to announce “Project 65” Free Will Baptist families across the State were asked to send 65 dollars in effort build a church for a congregation in Bhuttabari, Nepal. Our goal was \$50,000.00. People from all across South Carolina responded with generous gifts. We received funds from Nashville, Pennsylvania and even California! After the Thursday evening offering was taken up our total was \$48,522.28, but the offerings haven't stopped coming in since, and as of last count we are at \$53,000.00! Glory!

Bro Carlisle Hanna wanted to include this note to the people and churches who gave.

*Dear Ones,*

*Greetings in Jesus' wonderful name.*

*We, the Hanna family, are deeply grateful to all the families and churches who gave to Project 65 to make it such a success. When the check was revealed, we were too overwhelmed to know what to say. We are thankful for the love shown to us and to our churches in dear India through your response to this project. We will look forward to being able to show you a picture of the building once it is completed. All of us will have the joy of knowing our people at Bhuttabari will have a good place in which to worship. Thank you, too, for your prayers for our family here and our large family in India.*

## Historic South Carolina Flood provides opportunity for Free Will Baptists to shine.



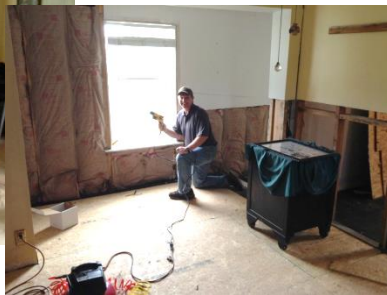
On October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2015 in what was termed by SC Governor Nikki Haley, as a 1000 year flood, South Carolinians braced for the onslaught of over 20" inches of rain in a 24 hour period, brought on by a fire hose of tropical moisture concentrated on the midlands and coastal areas, the effects were felt immediately as flash flooding ravaged local areas, and then as waters began to

recede into rivers and estuaries, communities downstream braced for record flood levels in the coming days. Free Will Baptists across the area fared well as a whole, with one church being affected directly, and others a near miss.

Featured right is the sanctuary of the Unity Free Will Baptist Church in Johnsonville. With approximately 6" of water in the sanctuary and 18" in the fellowship hall, both church folks and other Free Will Baptists quickly got to work with clean up to help begin the process of drying out. Along with the Unity Church, Free Will Baptists and their families were also affected by the flooding. News of the damage stirred the hearts of Free Will Baptists across America, and funds began to come in to aid in the relief efforts. Free Will Baptists in South Carolina rallied together nationally, some by conference, some by church, and others individually in order to provide relief to flood victims.
