Motion is that the SC State Association survey off approximately 12 acres located directly behind the SCFWB

State Office to be retained as land for further use of SCFWB Ministries. Motion continues that the SCFWB State Association endeavor to sell the remaining 40+ acres at a rate of \$10,000 per usable acre, with the provision that lots with multiple interested parties be required to submit a sealed bid to the SCFWB State Association. Motion further states that the proceeds from the sale of land be used to fund the SCFWB State Office renovation and expansion and that the remaining funds be deposited into the SCFWB Investment Accounts. Motion is to initially use \$139000 from fund to remodel the state office and as land sales replace funds.

SC State Association Meeting, February 24, 2022, Minutes of meeting

Bro. Chris Todd gave the State Office report – motion to receive the state office budget. MSC

At 10 am there was a Facebook live stream set up for our churches in India so they could watch as our state honored Bro. Carlisle Hanna for his many years of missionary work in India. Bro. Don Hanna greeted our brothers and sisters in India. Bro. Clint Morgan gave the presentation to honor Bro. Carlisle. A motion was made to rename our State Scholarship Fund to the Missionary Carlisle Hanna Scholarship Fund. MSC

Break – Meeting restarted with a song by the Lore Family

State Office Report continues. Bro. Chris presented a motion to sale some of the land owned by the SCFWB State Association. All four motions were taken together. A requirement of 2/3's vote must be met.

- 1. Motion to expand and renovate the South Carolina State Office
- 2. Motion to set aside approximately 12 acres of land for future use and development of Free Will Baptist Ministries
- 3. Motion that the State Association endeavor to sell the remaining 40 acres at a minimum rate of \$10,000 per usable acre with the provision that lots with multiple interested parties be required to submit a sealed bid to the SCFWB State Association.
- 4. Motion to withdraw \$139,000.00 from SCFWB investment accounts in order to fund the expansion and renovation project and that the funds be replaced in the investment accounts as the sale of land provides.

Motion given to take all 4 motions together. MSC. This vote will require a 2/3rds majority of present members to pass. Motion to receive report. The requirement of 2/3's vote achieved. MSC

Bro. Eddie Moody gave our National report. We are currently at the lowest number of members we've ever had (pastors, preachers, deacons). 201 FWB Churches are without pastors, every 3 weeks a pastor dies. Pray for the health of our pastors. We need pastors. What are some steps we can take to help with our dearth of ministers? Several programs and incentives were presented for our churches.

<u>We Are Better Together</u> – "Our churches need to grow." "We need to disciple our children." "I want to give my all to the Lord." To achieve these crucial goals, we must focus upon specific actions. With this in mind, Free Will Baptists have adopted the <u>3 for 30 Plan</u>, which involves reaching and training our people and giving our resources back to the Lord. When we do these things together, our churches and ministries are more likely to grow.

We also have to consider where we'll have youth camp. Camp Pee Dee is no longer renting out their camp. We are looking at Look Up Lodge in Traverlers Rest, SC. SC Free Will Baptist Disaster Relief

The South Carolina Free Will Baptist Disaster Relief teams have had had a very active year. Despite hindrances pertaining to the global pandemic, we were able to minister to victims of two natural disasters in 2021.

Waverly, Tennessee- Due to heavy rainfall residents of Waverly Tennessee were devastated by violent flooding which tore houses loose from their foundations. The 1st Free Will Baptist Church and parsonage in that town were greatly affected with flooding. The DRT volunteers from upstate South Carolina were able to go and provide assistance to the church and parsonage.

Bowling Green, Kentucky- A rare winter tornado struck residents of Bowling Green, Kentucky in the early morning hours of December 17. A DRT crew from across the state went to Bowling Green to provide assistance. A special thanks to Lake View FWB Church in Bowling Green for providing their family Life Center as housing for volunteers. DRT Crews were able to help and pray with 9 families during their time.

Hutchinson Roof Project- As a project this year the SCFWB DRT has endeavored to provide a pitched roof for badly leaking mobile homes for Sis Mildred Hutchinson. The Project is almost complete and will likely be finished early spring. Thank you to all those who have volunteered this past year.

St. Stephen's Mission Plant- The Church adopted by The DRT Teams for 2021 was the St. Stephens Church Plant. DRT Crews were able to go and install new entry door on the building. Because of pandemic delays, the windows for the sanctuary have not come in yet and will be installed in 2022.

Due to global pandemic there was no need for an annual in person meeting. Please continue to pray for and support the ministry of DRT, as we endeavor to be the hands and feet of Jesus to this world.

Welch College report given by Bro. Todd Parish. Your college is committed to sending out graduates to send forth the light of the gospel. In the fall we conducted Welcome Days and had a great turn out. The college currently had 73 admits (potential students). We have over a dozen students training to go to the mission field. We have a need for preachers. To help with this need we have established a scholarship for young men who have been called by God to preach the gospel. We now have an MDiv. program. We have other new programs that we offer. We encourage you to review our website to see if we can help you in furthering your education.

David Brown gave the report for the FWB Foundation. We have a theme, "We Make the Whole Team Better." The Foundation is the offensive line that helps all the other ministries become better through the funds we are able to raise. The Foundation helps families set up their estate planning. Please allow our representatives to come and give a seminar in your churches. Please consider tithing on your estates.

North American Ministries report by Ken Ackers. We're much more than just home missions. We also head up Master's Men. Master's Men does a lot of work with Disaster Relief. North American Ministries also works with our Chaplains. We currently have 9 active chaplains and 4 in the candidacy. Retired Col Terry Austin heads up our program. The Hispanic ministry is seeing great growth. Church planting is our number one mission. We currently have 41 English speaking church planters, planting 32 churches in 22 states. Bro. Brandon Smith is one of our church planters and he shared his desire to begin a church plant in Hickory, NC

- 3. Randomly selected ten (10) items from each of the three weekly batches selected above (item 2) and traced them to the intended designations or beneficiaries.
- 4. Randomly selected twenty-five (25) disbursements from the population of the organization's checking accounts and perform the following procedures:
 - Compared supporting documentation, such as invoices, purchase orders, requisitions, etc. for existence, approval and cancellation in support of disbursements.
 - b. Inspect cancelled checks for proper payee, date and amount as recorded in the general ledger and supported by the underlying documentation.
 - c. Inspect canceled checks for authorized signatures and compare to bank statement.

d. Traced the transactions into the general ledger, noting the appropriateness of the account distribution. However, if certain accounts were subdivided, such as office items, we may not know the particulars that would place the item in one account or another and such distribution criteria were not tested.

We have performed the above tests. During the tests we noted no exceptions.

5. For all bank checking accounts we compared the December 31, 2021, balances in the general ledger and the balances on the December 31, 2021, report sent to the state office to the reconciled bank statements to verify completeness of monies.
